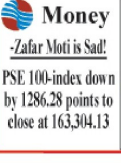

Hangu Tragedy: SP Asad Zubair and Two Policemen Martyred In Devastating Blast

HANGU: At least three Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) policemen, including the Superintendent of Police (SP) Operations, were martyred after twin blasts rocked KP's Hangu district on Friday, police said. Police identified the martyred police officer as SP Operations Asad Zubair. They said at least three cops were also injured in a blast that targeted the vehicle of SP Operations. The wounded were shifted to DHQ Hospital Hangu following the two blasts. District Police Officer Khanzeb Mohmand said. A bomb disposal squad and police commandos have since launched a search operation in the area. President Asif Ali Zardari condemned the attack on the police personnel, which he said was carried out by India-backed Khawarij terrorists. He paid rich tribute to the martyred policemen, while lambasting the attackers as "enemies of Pakistan's peace and stability."



Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi expressed heartfelt condolences and sympathy to the bereaved families of the martyred policemen. The minister vowed that SP Zubair and the two policemen's sacrifice would not go in vain, saying that the personnel had attained the highest rank of martyrdom. Pakistan has witnessed a surge in cross-border terror incidents, particularly in the bordering provinces of KP and Balochistan, since the Afghan Taliban returned to power in Afghanistan in 2021.—RT/Agency

PM Shehbaz Pitches Pakistan As The Region's Next Strategic Trade & Transit Hub

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif underlined Pakistan's growing significance in regional transport and economic connectivity while addressing the closing session of the Regional Transport Ministers' Conference. He described the event as a vital platform for dialogue and strengthening bilateral and regional relations. "On behalf of the government and the people, I welcome all participating delegates," the PM Shehbaz said, emphasizing the importance of collaboration and mutual prosperity. He pointed out that global transport and connectivity systems are undergoing rapid changes, adding that Pakistan



has long remained a key hub in the region, particularly under the Belt and Road Initiative. Highlighting the strategic importance of the country's infrastructure, the premier mentioned Gwadar's long coastal belt and Karachi Port as integral parts of the Maritime Silk Road. PM Shehbaz noted that Pakistan is entering the second phase of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor, which aims to enhance trade, investment, and economic integration. Pak-Afghan Border To Stay Shut: FO Says Citizens' Security Outweighs Trade

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has announced the temporary closure of Afghan border crossings, citing heightened security concerns along the frontier. During his weekly media briefing in Islamabad on Friday, Foreign Office Spokesperson Tahir Hussain Andrabi said the decision was taken "in view of last week's security situation," emphasizing that "saving the lives of ordinary Pakistanis is more important than the movement of goods and trade." He noted that while the closures may affect cross-border trade, protecting citizens remains the government's top priority. The spokesperson confirmed that the second round of Pakistan-Afghanistan talks will take place tomorrow (Saturday) in Istanbul, Turkey, as a follow-up to the Doha peace discussions. Andrabi said the meeting aims to build on the ceasefire agreement signed in Doha on October 19, which marked a "positive development" in bilateral relations.—RT/Agency

Sanctions Bite: China's State Oil Giants Halt Russian Crude Purchases

SINGAPORE: Chinese state oil majors have suspended purchases of seaborne Russian oil after the United States imposed sanctions on Rosneft and Lukoil, Moscow's two biggest oil companies, multiple trade sources said on Thursday. The move comes as refiners in India, the largest buyer of seaborne Russian oil, are set to sharply cut their crude imports from Moscow to comply with the US sanctions imposed over the Kremlin's invasion of Ukraine. A sharp drop in oil demand from Russia's two largest customers will put a strain on Moscow's oil revenues and force the world's top exporters to seek alternative supplies and push up global prices. Chinese national oil companies PetroChina, Sinopec, CNOOC and Zhenhua Oil will refrain from dealing in seaborne Russian oil at least in the short-term due to concern over sanctions, the sources said. The four companies did not immediately respond to requests for comment. While China imports roughly 1.4 million barrels of Russian oil per day by sea, most of that is bought by independent refiners, including small operators known as teapots, although estimates of purchases by state refiners vary widely.—RT/Agency

KP Operation Success: Security Forces 'Neutralise' Eight Fitna Al-Khawarij Militants

KP: Pakistan security forces neutralised eight Fitna al-Khawarij militants during an operation in Lakki Marwat, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. The operation, carried out on October 24 in Wanda Sheikh Allah area of Lakki Marwat, resulted in killing of eight Fitna al-Khawarij and left five others seriously injured, security officials confirmed. According to the sources, the operation was executed with high military precision, leaving the militants no chance to escape. A search operation is currently underway in the area due to concerns over the possible presence of additional Fitna al-Khawarij. Security sources further stated that under the National Action Plan, operations will continue until the elimination of the last militant and the complete restoration of peace and order. Earlier, security sources reported growing internal divisions within Fitna al-Khawarij, following heavy lapses in recent months. Several major confrontations of the group were excluded during border crossings in the once three months, leaving the leadership unsettled and decreasingly shattered. ATC Gets Tough: Orders Confiscation Of Aleema Khan's CNIC & Passport Over Repeated Absences

An anti-terrorism court (ATC) in Rawalpindi on Friday ordered the confiscation of the computerised national identity card (CNIC) and passport of Aleema Khan, sister of PFI founder Imran Khan, after she failed to appear before the court in the November 26 PFI protest case despite repeated summons. ATC Judge Amjad Ali Shah issued orders while hearing a case related to the FIRs registered against Aleema, others in connection with the PFI's protest on November 26 last year. The development comes two days after the same court non-bailable arrest warrant for Imran Khan's sister for the fourth time over her continued absence from the proceedings. On November 26 last year, PFI supporters entered Islamabad in defiance of a ban on public gatherings and clashed with law enforcement agencies near D-Chowk. Police used teargas to disperse the crowd. The former ruling party's three-day protests were abruptly ended after fierce clashes erupted between the law enforcers and the protesters. Diplomatic Firestorm: Israeli Finance Minister Rejects Ties With Saudi Arabia, Makes Insulting Remarks

TEL AVIV: Israeli Finance Minister Bezalel Smotrich has openly dismissed the possibility of normalizing relations with Saudi Arabia, making controversial remarks about the kingdom. Speaking at a conference, Smotrich said Israel has no interest in establishing diplomatic ties with Saudi Arabia. According to reports, the minister stated, "If Saudi Arabia says we should normalize relations in exchange for a state, then no, thank you. Let them continue riding camels in their desert, while we continue developing our economy, society, and state." His comments have sparked widespread criticism for being disrespectful and undermining regional diplomatic efforts. The statement comes amid ongoing discussions and international speculation about potential normalization talks between Israel and Saudi Arabia, which have been a key focus of recent Middle East diplomacy.—RT/Agency

Mercurial Trump Hits The Brakes: Declares All Trade Talks With Canada 'Terminated'

WASHINGTON: U.S. President Donald Trump said on Thursday that all trade talks with Canada were terminated following what he called a fraudulent advertisement in which former President Ronald Reagan spoke negatively about tariffs. "Based on their egregious behavior, ALL TRADE NEGOTIATIONS WITH CANADA ARE HEREBY TERMINATED," Trump wrote on Truth Social. Ontario Premier Doug Ford said earlier this week that the ad with anti-tariff messaging had caught Trump's attention. He showed Reagan, a Republican, criticizing tariffs on foreign goods while saying they caused job losses and trade wars. "I heard that the president heard our ad. I'm sure he wasn't too happy," Ford said on Tuesday. Trump has used tariffs as leverage on many countries around the world. His trade war has increased U.S. tariffs to their highest levels since the 1930s and he has regularly threatened more duties, sparking concerns among businesses and economists. Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney told reporters on Thursday that Canada will not allow unfair U.S. access to its markets if talks on various trade deals with Washington fail. Trump imposed tariffs on Canadian steel, aluminum and autos earlier this year, prompting Ottawa to respond in kind. The two sides have been in talks for weeks on a potential deal for the steel and aluminum sectors. 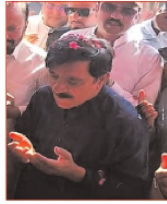

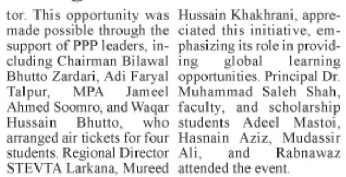

Rare Sight as Bryde's Whales Spotted Near Gwadar Coast

GWADAR: A group of Bryde's whales has been sighted in the coastal waters of Gwadar, Balochistan, marking a rare and significant marine observation. Local fishermen captured videos of the whales and shared them with WWF-Pakistan for documentation.

According to WWF-Pakistan Director Muhammad Moazzam Khan, the Bryde's whale is one of three whale species found in Pakistani waters. He explained that these whales are typically seen in groups of three to

four and are known to inhabit warm and temperate seas. Khan added that the whales' movement toward coastal areas is likely related to feeding behavior, as they often follow schools of fish near the surface. Marine experts consider this sighting an encouraging sign of biodiversity in Pakistan's Exclusive Economic Zone, emphasizing the need to protect marine habitats and ensure safe migration routes for large sea mammals.—RT/Agency

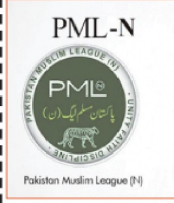

Majestic Giants in Our Waters — A Wake-Up Call for Marine Stewardship

The recent sighting of four rare Bryde's whales off the coast of Gwadar is more than just a breathtaking natural moment — it is a reminder of the extraordinary marine heritage that Pakistan is blessed with. These gentle giants, observed by local fishermen participating in WWF-Pakistan's citizen science initiative, represent a living treasure in our waters. Yet, their presence also carries a warning: we must learn to respect, protect and celebrate this fragile ecosystem before it slips beyond recovery.

Pakistan's coastline is home to three majestic baleen whale species — the blue whale, the Arabian humpback whale, and the Bryde's whale, the very species spotted near Demi Zur. But these creatures are listed as "data deficient," meaning their global numbers and threats re-

main insufficiently studied. Past tragic incidents of



stranded and deceased whales highlight the risks they face from human negligence, destructive fishing practices, marine traffic, and pollution.

This is where we, as a nation, must decide whether we remain passive spectators or become responsible custodians of our seas.

The efforts of coastal communities and WWF-Pakistan demonstrate that collaboration works. Fishermen reporting sightings, researchers documenting patterns,

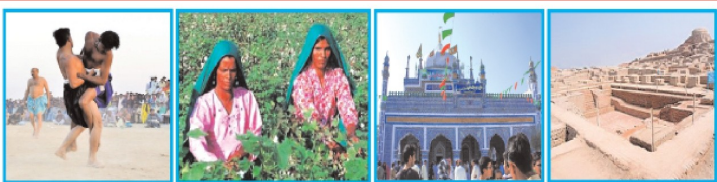
and authorities enforcing protective laws form the foundation of effective conservation. But awareness must extend far beyond marine experts — it must reach classrooms, policy halls, coastal villages, and the national mindset.

We cannot continue being our own worst enemies, poisoning our waters with waste, overfishing without foresight, and ignoring the delicate rhythms of marine life. Instead, let us foster eco-tourism, support sustainable fishing, and strengthen marine sanctuaries to not only preserve these magnificent beings but allow them to flourish.

The appearance of Bryde's whales is not just a beautiful sight — it is nature asking us to do better. Let us answer with commitment, pride, and care.

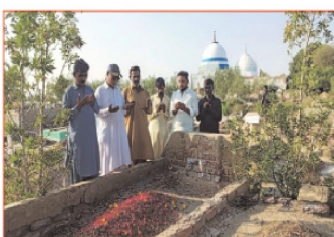

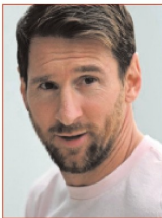

Pakistan's final ICC Women's World Cup clash against Sri Lanka ended in heartbreak — not from defeat, but from the skies above. Torrential rain washed out the much-anticipated match at Colombo's R. Premadasa Stadium on Friday, bringing a damp and disappointing close to Pakistan's campaign.



Persistent showers delayed the toss for hours, forcing officials to reduce the contest to just 34 overs per side. Once play finally began, Pakistan — led by Fatima Sana — cautiously reached 18 for no loss in 4.2 overs. But as dark clouds gathered once again, the heavens opened, forcing players off the field and eventually sealing the match's fate as a washout.

With this no-result, the Green Shirts finished second from the bottom on the World Cup points table, managing only three points and a negative net run rate of 2.65. The team struggled throughout the tournament to find consistency, with flashes of promise often dimmed by batting collapses and missed opportunities.

For Pakistan, the rain-soaked finale symbolizes a campaign of unfulfilled potential. Young talents like Fatima Sana and Sidra Ameen showed sparks of brilliance, but the side lacked the finishing touch needed to challenge the top teams. As Sri Lanka's drrenched fans left the stands, disappointment hung in the humid Colombo air — not just for a lost match, but for Pakistan's World Cup journey that never quite took off. The Green Shirts now look ahead, determined to regroup and rebuild for a stronger comeback in the next global showdown.—Agency

Mercurial NFL Quarterback Aaron Rodgers Reveals He Plans to Retire as a Packer



GREEN BAY: Aaron Rodgers has made it clear that he wants to end his career with the Green Bay Packers. He shared his wish ahead of Sunday's matchup between the Pittsburgh Steelers and the Packers.

This weekend, Rodgers will face his former team for the first time, and the Packers hope he can set sentiment aside and focus on helping them improve to 5-2.

Reflecting on his long tenure with the Packers, Rodgers said that he has given 18 years of his career to the team, and he will retire as a Packer.

"I was there for 18 years, regardless of when I hang it up, that's the bulk of my career. I'll retire a Packer and see what happens after that. I've got a lot of love for the organization [and] my time there," Rodgers said.

The Packers are expected to eventually welcome Rodgers back the same way they did with Brett Favre. Favre returned to Green Bay in 2015, one year before his induction into the Pro Football Hall of Fame, and his No. 4 was retired.

Rodgers last played for the Packers in 2022, before being traded to the New York Jets in 2023.

After two seasons in New York, he signed with the Steelers this past offseason, while Sunday's game marks his first matchup against his former team.

Speaking with Packers reporters on a Zoom call Thursday, Rodgers reflected warmly on his year in Green Bay and showed no hard feelings about not finishing his career there.—Agency

Tareen Posts Barbed Apology After Receiving PCB Legal Notice

Ali Tareen, owner of the Pakistan Super League (PSL) franchise Multan Sultans, has issued a sharply sarcastic "apology" after receiving a legal notice from the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB).



Framed as contrition but delivered with barbed asides, his response took aim at the league's stewardship while acknowledging the board's grievances over alleged breaches of the 10-year franchise contract.

According to the notice, the PCB accused Tareen of violating multiple clauses of the PSL franchise agreement and demanded both a public apology and a retraction of his critical remarks.

It warned that failure to comply could trigger termination of Multan Sultans' contract and see Tareen blacklisted from the league—an ultimatum that significantly raised the stakes of the dispute.

Posting a video on his X account, Tareen appeared to comply in form while contesting the substance, using sarcastic language to question the PSL's management and decision-making.

Tareen began by outlining the PCB's ultimatum before questioning the board's approach to conflict. He expressed frustration over the lack of direct communication, stating that he never received "a single call, message, email, or invitation asking to meet and resolve these issues together."

"Instead, I was served a legal notice," he said. "If you were more competent, you would know these matters aren't handled this way." He accused the management of being "surrounded by 'yes-men' and unable to accept criticism, asserting that the league 'belongs to the fans and to all of Pakistan, not to the handful of people currently running it.'"

He apologized for expressing frustration when he noticed issues and for his critical remarks about what he perceived as a lack of professionalism.

He apologized for "criticizing the opening ceremony," sarcastically praising the "amazing" act of having "national stars... lip-sync." He conceded that wanting the ceremony to "start on time, finish on time, and that the mic should work properly" was going too far.—Agency

Darren Sammy Criticizes West Indies Spinners After Costly ODI Defeat to Bangladesh

DHAKA: West Indies head coach Darren Sammy did not hold back his criticism of his bowlers following the team's 2-1 series loss to Bangladesh in the three-match ODI series.



Sammy expressed disappointment over his spinners' failure to exploit conditions that heavily favoured them, describing the pitches as "dark, cracked, and offering variable bounce."

Bangladesh's spinners completely outclassed their West Indian counterparts, taking 27 wickets at an average of 14.66 and an economy rate of 3.80. In contrast, West Indies spinners managed only 18 wickets at an average of 30.05 and an economy rate of 4.39.

Left-arm spinner Gurdash Motie and all-rounder Roston Chase struggled throughout the series, while even part-timer Alick Athanaze produced better figures than them in the second ODI.

Returning spinners Khary Pierre and Akeal Hosein, however, showed improvement — with Hosein's four-wicket haul in the third ODI standing out as the lone bowing highlight for the visitors.

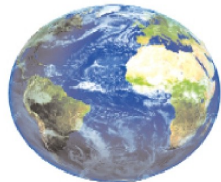

Smog Chokes Punjab: Schools on the Brink of Closure as Air Turns Hazardous

LAHORE: A severe smog alert has sparked speculation over early winter vacations in Punjab as air quality worsens, especially in Lahore — now ranked the world's most polluted city with an alarming AQI of 362. The Meteorological Department warns conditions may deteriorate further due to dry weather. While



the government and Education Department monitor the crisis closely, no decision on school closures has been announced yet, echoing last year's emergency measures.—RT/Agency

Punjab's Green Cover Under Siege: Timber Mafia Ravages Jand Bare Forests

PUNJAB: Before dawn breaks over Jand in Punjab's Attock district, the whir of chainsaws fills the misty air. By sunrise, truckloads of timber vanish toward distant markets, leaving behind desolate patches where forests once stood. "These trees took decades to grow but only hours to fell," laments Muhammad Kamran, a farmer from Kanni village. Across



Jand and nearby areas, an organized web of illegal loggers, transporters, and middlemen — infamously known as the 'timber mafia' — is ravaging the land. The unchecked deforestation is stripping hillsides bare, threatening local livelihoods and pushing Punjab's fragile environment toward collapse.—RT/Agency

NA Committee Cracks Down: Orders Countrywide Gender Audit of Land Ownership

ISLAMABAD: The National Assembly's Gender Mainstreaming Committee has directed provincial governments and federal agencies to conduct a comprehensive

gender mapping of all land and property records across Pakistan. Citing that only 2.5% of women solely own homes and 7.5% have joint ownership, Chairperson Dr. Nafisa Shah emphasized removing legal, social, and cultural barriers to women's asset ownership. The committee also proposed a dedicated national institution for gender equality and called for transparency in reporting Pakistan's commitments at international forums.

Punjab Govt Announces Early Salaries Ahead of Festival Rush Weekend

LAHORE: In a surprise move, the Punjab government has announced that October salaries and pensions for its employees will be released ahead of schedule, on Friday, 31 October 2025, instead of the usual date. The decision, made in light of the



upcoming long weekend (1st-2nd November), aims to ensure government workers receive their dues before the holidays. A notification has been sent to all concerned departments to complete the payments by the revised deadline.—RT

Lucky Strike in Arkansas: Man Unearths 2.71-Carat Diamond at Public Park Mine



INDIA: An Indiana man visiting Crater of Diamonds State Park in Arkansas spotted something shiny on his shovel and confirmed it was a 2.71-carat white diamond. Paoli resident Dewey White said he and his wife spent two days at Crater of Diamonds State Park at the start of their long road trip, and they enjoyed their time so much they decided to stop again on their way home. White said he came armed with some screens he bought from a store in Murfreesboro prior to his second visit and he and his wife ended up in the Canary Hill area by the south wash pavilion. "A very nice gentleman I met on my first day out here suggested that area," White told Arkansas State Parks officials. "He seemed like he knew what he was doing, and it looked like a nice, shaded spot. White said he knew the object he unearthed was something different from the quartz he had been encountering before it even hit his screen. "It looked like a metal piece of glass," he said. "The minute I saw it in my shovel, I knew!" —RT/Agency

The partnership aims to enhance productivity, diversify aquaculture species, and strengthen Pakistan-Uzbekistan bilateral relations in the agri-aquaculture sector, fostering innovation and sustainable growth across Central Asia.



Border Chaos Erupts: Over 1,000 Escape Myanmar Military Raid on Giant Scam Syndicate

MYANMAR: More than 1,000 people — most of them Chinese nationals — have fled from Myanmar into Thailand this week after the Myanmar military launched a dramatic raid on one of the country's biggest cyber-scam centres, Thai authorities revealed on Friday. The exodus began after troops stormed the notorious KK Park compound, a sprawling complex long suspected of hosting large-scale online fraud operations. These scam hubs, hidden along Myanmar's conflict-ridden border regions, have flourished amid



years of civil unrest and weak governance. They are known for running sophisticated online cons that swindle victims across Asia and beyond. According to Thailand's Tak provincial office, 1,049 people crossed into Mae Sot district between Wednesday and Friday morning — a sharp increase from 677 who had fled just a day earlier. Many of the escapees were taken into custody for questioning as authorities scrambled to manage the sudden influx.—RT/Agency

Goats on the Loose: Escaped Herd Causes Stir in Arizona Suburban Neighborhood

ARIZONA: Police in Arizona are trying to find the owner of some "friendly suspects" rounded up in a residential subdivision: a small group of goats. The Marana Police Department shared photos and videos on social media showing the "furry fugitives" rounded up in the Colma de Anaza subdivision off Hartman Lane in Marana. "Our officers helped bring these friendly suspects into custody last night," the department. Police said they are now trying to identify the owner of the goats so the animals can be returned home.—RT/Agency



Delhi Takes to the Skies: India Launches Cloud Seeding to Fight Toxic Smog Crisis

DELHI: In a bold experiment to combat deadly air pollution, India conducted its first-ever cloud seeding trial over smog-choked New Delhi on Thursday. Using a Cessna light aircraft, scientists from the Indian Institute of Technology Kanpur partnered with city authorities to spray chemicals over the northern Burari area, hoping to trigger artificial rain and wash pollutants from the air. Delhi Minister Manjinder Singh



Sirsa confirmed that "cloud seeding flares were fired" during the trial. The move comes as the capital grapples with hazardous air quality, raising hopes that weather modification could offer short-term relief from the city's annual pollution crisis.—RT/Agency

Lottery Miracle: Months-Old Quick Pick Numbers Score \$140,000 Win

CAROLINA: A South Carolina woman said she recycled the same set of quick pick lottery numbers for several months, and was rewarded with a \$140,000 Palmetto Cash 5 jackpot. The Pee Dee woman told South Carolina Education Lottery officials she is a frequent Palmetto Cash 5 player and a few months ago she got a set of numbers from a



quick pick ticket and decided to stick with them. "I played it over and over again," she said.—RT

Germany on Alert: Deadly Bird Flu Outbreak Kills Thousands, Authorities Race to Contain Spread

BERLIN: Germany is gripped by a massive bird flu outbreak, with the H5N1 strain now detected in nearly all 16 federal states, sparing only Bremen, officials confirmed Friday. The Friedrich Löffler Institute warned of a "very dynamic infection pattern" spreading rapidly among cranes and wild birds. Over 1,000 dead cranes were found near Berlin this week, and more than 200,000 poultry, including chickens, ducks, and turkeys — have been culled nationwide.—RT



Louvre Heist Scandal: Museum Chief Points to CCTV Blind Spots in \$102 Million Jewelry Theft

PARIS: The Louvre's cameras failed to detect burglars in time to prevent their audacious daylight heist of some of France's crown jewels, the museum's director said, amid growing anger directed at officials over major security lapses. The thieves broke into the world-famous Paris museum on Sunday using a crane to smash an upstairs window, then stole jewels worth an estimated 88 million euros (\$102 million) before escaping on motorbikes.



News of the robbery reverberated around the world, and prompted soul-searching in France over what some viewed as a national humiliation. Laurence des Cars, the Louvre director, told senators that she had offered her resignation, but it had been rescinded by Culture Minister Rachida Dati, who has also come under fire as recriminations flew after the robbery.—RT/Agency

Heroic Ascent: Firefighters Break World Record Climbing Burj Khalifa

DUBAI: Dubai Civil Defence has achieved a remarkable global milestone by securing a place in the Guinness World Records. A team of firefighters successfully set a new world record for the fastest ascent of Burj Khalifa, the tallest building in the world. The team completed the challenging climb — a total of 159 floors via the stairs — in just 52 minutes and 30 seconds, marking

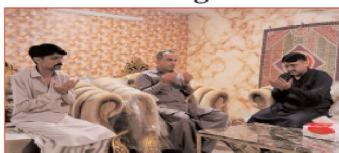

With a population of over 100 million, the crabs are unique to the island — much of which is designated as a national park — and protected by Australian law. The migration, which usually lasts for days, sees the crabs journey from the island off the coast of Western Australia to the ocean, where they mate. The females then stay behind in burrows near the ocean to hatch their eggs and the males return inland. Each female crab can produce up to 100,000 eggs, which she will deposit into the ocean.—RT/Agency

Domestic Worker Arrested in Major Karachi Heist of Gold and Cash Worth Millions

KARACHI: The Saahil Police in Defence, Karachi, have arrested a domestic worker for allegedly stealing cash and gold worth millions from his employer's residence. According to SSP South, the police acted promptly on a complaint and recovered Rs227,000 in cash along with 21 tolas of gold bars from the accused,

Wajid Ali, son of Mohammad Siddique, who was employed at the house. During initial investigations, the suspect reportedly confessed to committing the thefts over a long period, stealing cash, gold, dollars, and other valuables from the house. He also admitted to transferring significant sums through ATM transactions and cheques, with the total value of stolen property running into millions of rupees. The case has been handed over to the investigating branch for further inquiry. Authorities are now examining the suspect's bank accounts and assets to trace the full extent of the thefts. —RT/Agency

Sindh and UNICEF Roll Out Landmark Child Labour Survey Showing Major 50% Reduction

KARACHI: The Sindh Government and UNICEF launched the Sindh Child Labour Survey 2023-24 in Karachi, revealing that 10.3% of children aged 5-17 are engaged in child labour — a 50% drop since 1996. The landmark study, the first in nearly three decades, highlights child labour trends across 29 districts, with



highest rates in Sujawal and Tharparkar. Officials pledged stronger enforcement of child protection

laws, stressing education, poverty reduction, and social support to eradicate child labour in Sindh. —RT

SSGC Launches Major Operation, Cuts 662 Illegal Gas Connections in Balochistan

Trans-Afghan Rail & Trilateral Corridor Advancing, PM Confirms

ernment, cites TLP's involvement in terrorism, violent protests, and inciting unrest since its formation in 2016. TLP is accused of causing fatalities, promoting sectarianism, and engaging in destruc-

tive acts. The decision comes after repeated incidents of chaos and attacks on security personnel, with the organization now listed in the First Schedule of the Anti-Terrorism Act.—RT/Agency

Pakistan Exposes Joint Propaganda Campaign By Afghan Taliban & Indian Networks

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's Ministry of Information and Broadcasting has uncovered a coordinated online propaganda campaign being run by the Afghan Taliban regime, with alleged support from Indian-linked social media accounts.

The ministry revealed that these accounts were actively spreading fabricated content aimed at misleading the public and maligning Pakistan's image.

According to official sources, several social media handles connected to Afghan and Indian networks were found circulating misleading videos and images. Among these, footage from the Chaman gathering held in December 2022 has been widely shared, falsely pre-

China Now Leads Global Nuclear Power Expansion, Surpassing The US



BEIJING: China has overtaken the United States in the global race for nuclear energy advancement, according to a report by The New York Times. The report highlights that over the past decade, China has made remarkable progress in the nuclear power sector, emerging as the fastest-growing nuclear nation in the world. Currently, China is constructing 33 new nuclear reactors — the highest number under development by any country. In contrast, American nuclear

projects have faced significant setbacks, including delays of up to seven years and cost overruns amounting to \$17 billion. China's approach has been notably faster and more cost-effective, positioning it as a potential global leader in nuclear energy. By 2030, experts predict China will reach parity with the United States in nuclear capacity, as Beijing aims to become the world's leading exporter of nuclear technology and clean energy solutions.—RT/Agency

Supreme Court Forms Bench To Hear Shibli Faraz & Omar Ayub's Disqualification Appeals

ISLAMABAD: The Supreme Court has scheduled the hearing of appeals filed by Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) leaders Omar Ayub and Shibli Faraz against their disqualification.

A five-member constitutional bench headed by Justice Aminuddin Khan will hear the case on October 27. The bench also includes Justice Jamal Khan Mandokhail, Justice Muhammad Ali Mazhar, Justice Hasan Azhar Rizvi, and Justice Shakeel Ahmed.

Both PTI leaders had challenged their disqualification following convictions in the May 9 cases. Earlier, the Peshawar High Court had dismissed their appeals as inadmissible, citing that the petitioners had not surrendered before the authorities.

Punjab Minister Warns: Top TLP Leadership To Face Imminent Arrests

LAHORE: Punjab Information Minister Azma Bukhari has said that the top leadership of Tehreek-e-Labbaik Pakistan (TLP) has gone into hiding outside the province following the violent protests, assuring that they will be apprehended soon.

Speaking on Geo Pakistan, Azma said that according to available information, the group's senior leaders are currently outside Punjab and are adept at going underground to evade arrest.

"Law enforcement agencies are actively working on it, and you will soon receive good news," the information minister added.

"I would request that we not refer to this extremist group as a political party. They are not a party, but rather a mindset that we must collectively confront as a society."

She added, "It is neither a political nor a religious party; it has been operating like a project to collect watches and billions of rupees." Azma said that it has been revealed that those conducting transactions in the name of religion have been earning interest on those payments. The provincial information minister said that whenever the TLP takes to the streets, it engages in "violence and attempts to disrupt law and order."

"They have a track record unlike any other group in this country, acting as a pressure group to dictate terms to the state," she said, adding, "Our leadership is convinced that now is the best time to correct past mistakes."

Azma said that during dialogue with the TLP aimed at easing tensions, there was no discussion of Gaza or Palestine.—RT/Agency

Dar Holds High-Level Talks With UAE Counterpart On Regional & Global Affairs

ISLAMABAD: Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Senator Mohammad Ishaq Dar spoke on the phone with his UAE counterpart Sheikh Abdullah bin Zayed Al Nahyan.

The Foreign Office, in a statement, said the two leaders discussed bilateral and multilateral issues of mutual interest as well as recent regional and global developments.

Both sides have agreed to stay closely engaged, it said. A day earlier, Pakistan and Poland reaffirmed their commitment to strengthening bilateral cooperation in diverse areas, including trade, energy, defence, education, technology, and fintech.

The commitment was expressed by the Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar and Polish Min-

"We have over a billion dollars in bilateral trade, and both sides agreed that there remains immense untapped potential to further expand trade and economic cooperation. we have just signed today a memorandum of understanding which envisions regular bilateral consultations," the deputy PM said.

He said Poland's oil and gas expertise could greatly benefit Pakistan and a leading Polish energy company had already invested nearly half a billion dollars in Pakistan.—RT/Agency

Punjab Begins De-Weaponisation Drive: Citizens Get 15 Days To Surrender Illegal Arms

LAHORE: Punjab Minister Maryam Nawaz Sharif has directed the Crime Control Department (CCD) to launch a province-wide campaign to de-weaponise Punjab within four months.

Addressing a joint press conference alongside IG Punjab Dr. Usman Anwar, Additional IG CCD Sohail Zafar Chatha announced that the CCD has been given a clear mandate to curb the proliferation of illegal firearms across the province.

He vowed to reduce gun-related crimes in Punjab by 75% within the stipulated four-month period. As part of the campaign, citizens have been given a 15-day deadline to voluntarily surrender all illicit and illegal weapons at

CCD police stations or designated surrender centres. Chatha assured the public that no legal action would be taken against those who voluntarily hand over illegal arms during this grace period, adding that such individuals would be granted health indemnity. However, he warned that once the deadline expires, strict action will be taken against anyone found in possession of illegal weapons, with enforcement operations to be led by the CCD. Earlier, Punjab Information Minister Azma Bukhari announced that shops of unlicensed arms dealers across the province had been sealed as part of a strict crackdown on illegal weapons.—RT/Agency
