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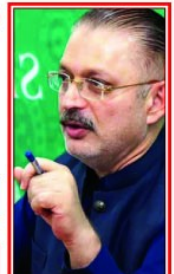

Pakistan Navy Chief Vows to Guard Maritime Borders 'Inch by Inch'

ISLAMABAD: Chief of the Naval Staff Admiral Naveed Ashraf has affirmed that the Pakistan Navy stood ready to defend the country's maritime frontiers, the Inter-Services Public Relations said on Saturday.

He made these comments during his visit to forward posts in the Creeks Area to review operational preparedness and combat readiness, it added.

"We know how to defend our sovereignty and every inch of our Maritime frontiers from Sir Creek to Jiwani", Admiral Ashraf said.

The naval chief emphasised the importance of Sea Lines of Communication (SLOCs) and maritime security, saying that they were not only a military ne-



cessity but also a cornerstone of Pakistan's sovereignty and a key pillar of economic prosperity and stability.

Admiral Ashraf described Pakistan Navy as the "vanguard of peace and stability in the Indian Ocean Region" and a significant stakeholder in regional maritime security. He affirmed that the navy's defence capabilities stood strong "from the shores to the sea". During his visit, three 2400 TD hovercrafts were also inducted into the Pak Marines, marking another significant stride in modernising the Pakistan Navy's operational capabilities. The state-of-the-art hovercrafts are capable of simultaneously operating over a variety of surfaces, including shallow waters, sand dunes, marshy and boggy littoral zones.—RT/Agency

PM Shehbaz Seeks 'Tough Answers' on Resurgence of Terrorism Post-2018 Peace Gains

ISLAMABAD: Terrorism is re-emerging in Balochistan and other regions, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif said on Saturday, urging a hard look at "the reasons that led to unrest."

Addressing participants of 'Balochistan Workshop', he said that while terrorism had been completely eradicated in 2018, it was once again raising its head. "Security forces are sacrificing their lives every day for peace," he said.

He said that the people of Balochistan are "our brothers" and must be equal partners in the country's develop-



ment. The prime minister said that Balochistan had its own history, culture and was blessed with immense natural resources worth trillions of dollars. These huge national resources of wealth were still buried under heavy mountains, and unfortunately, what

happened in the last few years was a matter of self-inspection, he added. During the creation of Pakistan, the leaders and tribal leaders of Balochistan had gathered in Quetta and decided to join Pakistan, he said, adding Balochistan always took pride in its values

and culture, the Baloch people had always been very generous and promoting those segments of societies who had either migrated to the province or living there for ages, including Punjabi migrants and other tribes.

The prime minister said that they had been living in Balochistan with complete harmony and peace for a long time.

He further observed that nature had uniquely designed the province; small and sporadic populations, where road infrastructure was a big challenge, and without a proper road network, commuting

was a difficult task.

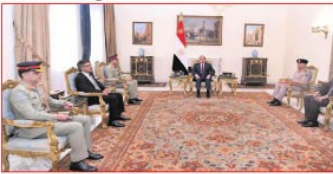
The prime minister informed that a road that ran from Karachi to Chaman was locally called a 'bloody road' by the residents of the province due to frequent traffic collisions and casualties.

"To convert this bloody road into a peaceful avenue", he said, Rs350 billion was estimated, adding the petrol prices were announced every fortnightly, and on one occasion, when the prices were declined, they had decided to divert this amount of up to Rs180 billion annually, for the construction of this road.—RT/Agency

Egyptian President Praises Pakistan's Role in Strengthening Muslim Unity During Meeting with COAS

ISLAMABAD: Egyptian President Abdel Fattah el-Sisi met Chief of Army Staff (COAS) Field Marshal Syed Asim Munir and praised Pakistan's "positive and proactive contributions" to the Muslim world, the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said on Saturday.

During the meeting, held at Ithadiah Presidential Palace in Cairo, both leaders reaffirmed the longstanding friendship between Pakistan and Egypt, expressing their commitment to strengthen bilateral relations across various fields, including socio-economic cooperation, technology, and security, as per the military's media wing.



It said Field Marshal Munir lauded Egypt's leadership for its role in maintaining peace and stability in the region, while President el-Sisi underlined the importance of enhanced coordination on matters of mutual strategic interest and fostering stronger people-to-people ties.

The meeting concluded on a warm note, with both sides expressing confidence that sustained engagement and cooperation would contribute significantly to regional peace and prosperity.

Both leaders reaffirm commitment to deepen Pakistan-Egypt cooperation in security, economic and strategic domains, the military's media wing added.—RT/Agency

Zardari Reportedly Clears PPP to Launch No-Confidence Move Against AJK PM

ISLAMABAD: The Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) has announced forming its own government in Azad Jammu and Kashmir after President Asif Ali Zardari greenlighted a no-confidence motion against Prime Minister Chaudhry Anwarul Haq. Sources told Geo News that President Zardari made the decision while chairing a key meeting of the PPP AJK parliamentary party in Islamabad, which was also attended by party chairman Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari, Faryal Talpur, Raja Pervaiz Ashraf, and Qamar Zaman Kaira. The president will nominate for the AJK premiership after consultations, sources added. They confirmed that Bilawal, who had also



served as the country's foreign minister, would formally announce government formation on Monday. The decision to bring a no-confidence motion came during the PPP's AJK parliamentary committee meeting on government formation in AJK. A separate session chaired by Bilawal Bhutto, earlier in the day, had endorsed an in-house change, with party leaders agreeing to move a no-confidence motion against the incumbent AJK premier. Earlier, PPP leader Kaira — while speaking to journalists outside Zardari House — said that while the situation in AJK was "worrying for all parties," the final decision would be made after consultation with President Zardari.—RT/Agency

Islamabad-Kabul Dialogue Resumes in Istanbul Amid Regional Tensions

ISTANBUL: The second round of talks between Pakistan and Afghanistan began in Istanbul on Saturday, as Islamabad seeks a mechanism to address terrorism emanating from Afghan soil, sources said.

The Istanbul dialogues follow the first round of Pakistan-Afghanistan talks — mediated by Qatar and Turkey — held in Doha on October 19, in which a ceasefire was agreed, but the border trade remains suspended.

The Afghan delegation is being led by Deputy Interior Minister Rahmatullah Mujib.

During his weekly press briefing, Foreign Office spokesperson Tahir Hussain



Andrabi said that Pakistan looks forward to the establishment of a concrete and verifiable monitoring mechanism in the Istanbul talks to address the menace of terrorism emanating from Afghan soil towards Islamabad. "As a responsible state committed to regional peace and stability, Pakistan does not seek escalation but urges the Afghan Taliban authorities to honour their commitment to the international community and address Pakistan's legitimate security concerns by taking verifiable action against terrorist entities, including the FAK/TTP and FAH/BLA," he added.—RT/Agency

Dostarm-V: Pakistan, Kazakhstan Wrap Up High-Intensity Counter-Terror Drills in Cherat



RAWALPINDI: The closing ceremony of the Pakistan-Kazakhstan Joint Military Exercise Dostarm-V took place in Cherat on Saturday, marking the end of a two-week counter-terrorism training between the armies of the two nations. The exercise, which began on 14 October, was designed to enhance cooperation and refine operational tactics in the fight against terrorism.

Combat teams from the Pakistan Army's Special Services Group (SSG) and the Kazakhstan Special Forces participated in the joint exercise, focusing on modern counter-terrorism drills, operational planning, and tactical response in simulated environments.—RT/Agency

Balochistan's Power-Sharing Deal: PML-N to Take Over After 2.5 Years

BALUCHISTAN: Balochistan Minister Abdul Rehman Khetran confirmed that under an agreement between PPP and PML-N, the PML-N will assume the chief minister's position after two and a half years. The coalition deal, made post-elections, also includes the tenure of Senate and assembly speakers. Khetran clarified, however, that this arrangement does not guarantee the PPP chairman's ascension to prime minister in return.—RT/Agency

at providing affordable and reliable intercity air travel. The meeting also

reviewed the Murree Glass Train Project, with instructions for timely execution. Separately, the Punjab government introduced Pakistan's first airlift drone for flood rescue operations. Successfully tested in Lahore, the drone can carry up to 200 kg, with 10 more units planned for procurement.—RT/Agency

Punjab Extends Section 144 Till Nov 1 Citing Heightened Security Alerts

LAHORE: The Punjab government has extended the enforcement of Section 144 across the province until November 1 to maintain public order. A Home Department notification stated the decision followed recommendations from the Cabinet's Standing Committee on Law and Order after reviewing fresh threat assessments by security agencies.



The ban continues on public gatherings, sit-ins, rallies, use of loudspeakers, carrying of weapons, and distribution of provocative material. Initially imposed on October 8, the order has been extended twice.—RT/Agency

tions, and electronic money platforms—must adopt biometric verification as the primary method

of identity for all individual and entity accounts, including Roshan Digital Accounts.—RT

Historic Water Initiative: Punjab Launches Clean Drinking Project for 29 Million Residents

LAHORE: The Punjab government has launched a major clean water initiative to protect citizens from unsafe drinking water. Chaired by Secretary Housing Noorul Amin Mengal, a meeting reviewed implementation plans for the project's first phase, covering 16 districts. Filtration plants will be installed in areas with arsenic-contaminated groundwater, while

surface water treatment plants will be set up at Dharabi, Mirawal, and Phaleena dams. Four bottling plants will operate in Khushab, Bahawalpur, DG Khan, and Rahim Yar Khan. Scheduled for completion by June 2026, the project will benefit 29 million people and serve water in 19-liter bottles.—RT/Agency

IMF Pushes Major Overhaul: FBR Stripped of Tax Policy Role, New Authority to Take Charge



ISLAMABAD: In a major restructuring move, the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) will now be limited to tax collection duties, with the power to formulate tax policy shifting to a new office under the Ministry of Finance. This shift is part of

Pakistan's commitment to the International Monetary Fund (IMF) conditions. The newly activated Tax Policy Office will take over the responsibility for drafting tax policies, leaving the FBR to focus solely on revenue collection.—RT

SP Adeel Akbar's Death Believed Accidental, Say Police Sources Amid Ongoing Inquiry

Superintendent of Police (SP) Adeel Akbar is believed to have accidentally shot himself, police sources claimed on Saturday, with his medical report and a leave request submitted before his death came to light.

The federal government formed a high-level investigation team to probe SP Akbar's mysterious death, who sustained gunshot wounds to his head in his vehicle in Islamabad on October 23.

Sources said that officers of the Police Service of Pakistan (PSP) are generally not trained in handling submachine guns (SMGs).

They added that experts determined the SMG used in the incident was fired at a 65-degree angle.—RT/Agency

Another Coffin from a Police Station: Pakistan's Shame Cannot Continue

The death of Muhammad Irfan, a teenage boy who breathed his last inside the custody of Karachi's Special Investigation Unit, is not a "controversial incident." It is a tragedy soaked in blood, pain, and a rot that has long poisoned our policing system. The very institution mandated to protect and serve has, once again, proven capable of brutality that belongs to dark regimes, not a nation claiming to uphold law and justice.

Irfan's family alleges he was tortured. The preliminary post-mortem confirms signs of torture. Yet, the police hurriedly registered the FIR themselves — not on behalf of the grieving family — but as the complainants. This brazen

manipulation alone exposes everything. It



shows a force determined not to seek truth, but to shield its own. The victim's relatives and community, forced to stage a protest with his coffin at Sohrab Goth, were not seeking revenge. They were begging — begging — for something so basic it should never have been in question: justice.

This is not an isolated event. It is part of a horrifying pattern. Young men dying in "custody,"

suspects "falling ill," bodies returning to families marked with bruises while inquiries drag into silence. The message this sends is chilling: police uniforms, instead of symbolizing public safety, now strike fear.

If this state is to survive with any moral core, this case must become the line that cannot be crossed again. Those responsible must be charged under murder — not negligence — and prosecuted publicly. The FIR must be re-registered on the family's complaint. And every officer involved, directly or indirectly, must face accountability.

Justice delayed now would not just fail Irfan — it would betray the very idea of Pakistan.

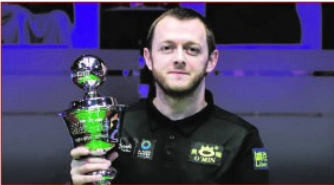

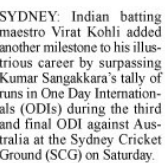

Virat Kohli Surpasses Sangakkara to Rewrite ODI Record Books



SYDNEY: Indian batting maestro Virat Kohli added another milestone to his illustrious career by surpassing Kumar Sangakkara's tally of runs in One Day International (ODI) during the third and final ODI against Australia at the Sydney Cricket Ground (SCG) on Saturday.

Kohli, who played a match-winning knock of 74 off 81 balls with eight boundaries, is now the second-highest run-scorer in ODI history, amassing 14,255 runs in 305 matches at an impressive average of 57.71 and a strike rate of 93.26, including 75 fifties and 51 centuries.

The former Sri Lankan captain Sangakkara has now slipped to third place, with 14,234 runs in 404 matches, featuring 93 fifties and 25 centuries.



The record for the most runs in ODIs still belongs to Indian legend Sachin Tendulkar, who leads the list with 18,426 runs in 463 matches at an average of 44.83, including 96 fifties and 49 hundreds.

Kohli's landmark innings came in a game where India avoided a whitewash, defeating Australia by nine wickets to end the series 2-1.

Chasing a target of 237, India cruised to 238-1 with 69 balls to spare, thanks to a dominant 121 not out from Rohit Sharma and Kohli's composed half-century.

Earlier, opener Rohit Sharma and Shubman Gill provided a solid platform with a 69-run stand before Josh Hazlewood dismissed Gill for 24. Thereafter, Kohli and Kohli took charge, dismantling the Australian bowling with ease.

Rohit reached his 33rd ODI century, striking 13

four and three sixes, while Kohli's elegant strokeplay ensured India's smooth chase.

For Australia, their innings fell apart after a steady start. From 183/3, they collapsed to 236 all out, losing their last seven wickets for just 53 runs.

Harshit Rana led the bowling attack with an impressive 4-39, while Matt Renshaw top-scored with 56. Spinners Axar Patel and Washington Sundar chipped in with two wickets each as India's bowlers maintained relentless pressure.

Despite the defeat, Australia clinched the series 2-1, having won the first two matches in Perth and Adelaide.—Agency

Rohit & Kohli Lead India to Consolation Victory Over Australia at SCG



SYDNEY: Indian stalwarts Rohit Sharma and Virat Kohli delivered a historic batting masterclass at the Sydney Cricket Ground (SCG) on Saturday (October 25), steering India to a commanding nine-wicket win and denying Australia a series sweep.

Rohit marked the occasion with his 50th international century, while Kohli surpassed Kumar Sangakkara to become the second-highest run-scorer in ODI history.

The duo stitched together their first century stand across formats since January 2020, helping India chase down a modest target and avoid a 3-0 series defeat.

Their partnership came on the back of a disciplined bowling performance led by young pacer Harshit Rana,



whose four-wicket haul restricted Australia to a below-par 237.

Matthew Renshaw registered his maiden ODI fifty, but Australia's batting lineup struggled to build partnerships as India's bowlers applied consistent pressure.

Opting to bat first for only the second time in 27 ODIs as captain, Mitchell Marsh hoped for a repeat of Australia's 431/2 against South Africa last year.

However, after a promising start, Siraj removed Travis Head for 33, shortly after he reached 3,000 ODI runs. Marsh looked solid until Axar Patel trapped him for 41 with a delivery that angled in from around the wicket.

Renshaw and Matthew Short attempted to rebuild, but tight spells from Washington Sundar and Axar Patel stalled their momentum. Short perished while trying

to sweep, offering a sharp catch to Kohli.

Later, Alex Carey's struggle ended with a spectacular catch from Shreyas Iyer, who injured his rib in the process and was taken for medical assessment.

Renshaw reached his maiden fifty but was trapped leg-before by Sundar on review, sparking a late collapse. Harshit Rana and Kuldeep Yadav cleaned up the lower order as Australia were bowled out in the 47th over. In response, Kohli and Shubman Gill provided a solid start, racing to 68 without loss in the PowerPlay. Gill's dismissal for 35 brought Kohli to the crease, who was greeted warmly by the crowd after avoiding a third consecutive duck.—Agency

Tony Bellew Predicts New Heavyweight King in Post-Usyk Era



Former English boxer Tony Bellew has predicted the next undisputed champion in the heavyweight division after Oleksandr Usyk hangs up his gloves, saying, "He'll Clean Up."

After Usyk defeated Tyson Fury in 2024 on points, it was the first time in 25 years that the heavyweight division had one undisputed ruler.

The Ukrainian cleared up all the belts by defeating Anthony Joshua twice and stopping Daniel Dubois once.

Later in 2024, he did it again by getting rid of Fury in a rematch and then regained the IBF belt from Dubois, that he had vacated he had vacated, making history by becoming the first-ever two-time undisputed champion in the four-belt era.

Speaking to Football Blog, Bellew predicted Moses Itauma as the next big thing in the division after Usyk retires.

"Oleksandr Usyk's just going to walk away into the sunset, and he's going to go 'I've had enough.' When he does, you will find them all scavenged towards the belts, and then you will find lesser champions and then somebody else will come along," Bellew said.

"Hence, Moses Itauma, and he will clean up again. And then you will have a reigning, undisputed unified champion again."

Itauma has emerged as the brightest star of the heavyweight division, holding an unbeaten record of 13-0, with 11 of his victories coming by knockout.

The 20-year-old possesses a sensational skill set and has been compared to greats like Mike Tyson from a very early age.

Last time out, Itauma added the biggest name to his KO list when he rose to the occasion and claimed victory in the first round against Dillian Whyte in a non-title fight on August 16 in Saudi Arabia.—Agency

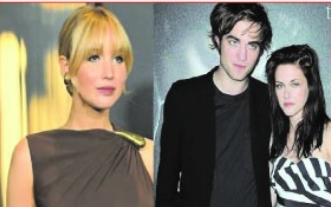

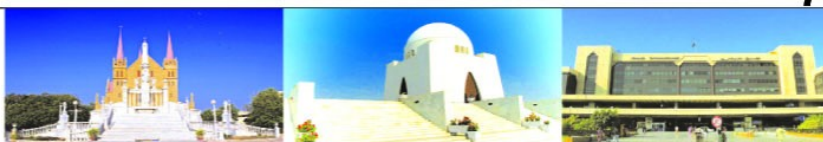

KARACHI: Police arrested a domestic worker in Defence accused of stealing millions from his elderly employers, later discovering he owned four bank accounts, luxury properties in Karachi, Harijpur, and Islamabad, and a passenger van service. The 45,000-rupee-per-month employee had secretly accessed the couple's accounts and lockers over eight years. Authorities recovered gold worth over Rs12 million and found evidence of Rs18.6 million in bank transactions. Met Office Releases Moon-Sighting Calendar for Islamic Year 1447 AH

KARACHI: The Pakistan Meteorological Department's Climate Data Processing Centre has released the moon sighting calendar predicting the appearance of crescents for all Islamic months of 1447 AH. The calendar provides details on moon birth, sunset, and expected sighting times. As per predictions, the Sha'aban moon will likely be sighted on January 21, 2026, and Ramadan on February 18. Eidul Fitr's crescent (Shawwal) is expected on March 19, followed by Zil Hajj on May 17 and Muharram 1448 AH on June 15, 2026. The schedule extends through December 2026, covering all lunar months.—RT/Agency

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Karachi Sizzles Again: Heatwave Alerts Issued as Temperatures Soar

KARACHI: The city is expected to endure another scorching day as temperatures soar to 38°C amid abundant sunshine, extending the ongoing heat emergency. Meteorological data indicates a high of 38°C and a low of 23°C, with the RealFeel temperature at 37°C and only slight relief in shaded areas at 36°C. Easterly winds blowing at 11 km/h will provide minimal cooling, while the UV Index has moderately improved to 5. Authorities have renewed health advisories, warning residents of dehydration and heatstroke risks, urging them to stay indoors, stay hydrated, and avoid prolonged sun exposure.—RT/Agency

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Custodial Horror: SIU Officers Booked Over Death of 15-Year-Old Irfan Baloch

KARACHI: A murder case has been registered against several officials of the Special Investigation Unit (SIU) over the custodial death of 15-year-old Irfan Baloch. The FIR, filed at SIU Police Station Saddar, names ASI Ubaid Shah, ASI Sarfraz, and constables Fayyaz Shah, Waqar, and Asif Ali, among others. Postmortem reports revealed multiple torture marks, contradicting police claims of a heart attack. Irfan was arrested from Aysha Manzil while filming a TikTok video and died hours later. Despite the suspension of three SIU sub-inspectors, no arrests have been made as investigations continue.—RT/Agency

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Karachi Now World's 3rd Most Polluted City as Smog Crisis Deepens

KARACHI: The air quality in Pakistan's largest city, Karachi, has reached a highly hazardous level. According to the Air Quality Index (AQI), Karachi currently ranks third among the most polluted cities in the world. The AQI recorded the city's air pollution level at 229, particularly matter (PM). It is worth noting that on the Air Quality Index, pollution levels between 150 and 200 PM are considered unhealthy, 200 to 300 PM indicate severe pollution, and levels above 300 PM represent extremely hazardous air conditions.—RT/Agency

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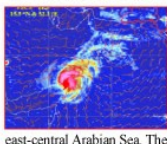
Armed Robbery Foiled: Stolen Trailer Recovered in Malir After Chase

The disturbance is gradually moving closer to Karachi and currently lies around 340 kilometers east of Lakshadweep, India. 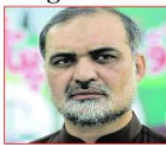
Sharjeel says PPP's Taj Haider Bridge Will 'Transform Karachi's Transport Future'

North Waziristan: Security Forces Kill Three Militants, Foil Major Terror Plot — ISPR

KP: Security forces foiled a major terrorist plot by killing three terrorists who were preparing a vehicle-borne suicide bomber in the Jhalla area of North Waziristan district in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said on Saturday.

Security forces destroyed the vehicle being prepared for the suicide attack during the intelligence-based operation (IBO) carried out on Friday in the KP's district, the military's media wing said.

"During the conduct of operation, own troops effectively engaged kharaj (terrorists) location and through



precise and skillful engagement, destroyed the vehicle being prepared for the suicide attack and also eliminated three Indian-sponsored kharaj," the ISPR security read.

Following the IBO, security forces launched a sanitation operation to eliminate any other terrorists found in the area.

The "precise engagement" comes as security forces have intensified efforts to eradicate terrorism under the Azm-e-Istehkam operation.

Pakistan has faced increased cross-border terrorist incidents since the Taliban regime returned to power in Afghanistan in 2021.

KP and Balochistan, the two bordering provinces, have borne the brunt of these attacks.

KP alone recorded over 600 terrorist incidents, in which at least 79 police personnel were martyred alongside 138 civilians, during the first eight months of 2025, according to a police report.

Pakistan has consistently urged the Afghan Taliban to abide by the Doha agreement in 2020, in which they committed to not allowing their

soil to be used against any country.

Defence Minister Khawaja Muhammad Asif recently termed the cross-border terrorism issue the key reason behind the tensions between the two neighbouring countries.

In an interview with Al-Jazeera Arabic, Asif said that ongoing negotiations with the Afghan Taliban regime were mainly focused on eliminating terrorism. Admitting the effects of terrorism on the border areas of both Pakistan and Afghanistan, he said that the immediate elimination of terrorism was essential. —RT/Agency

Defence Minister Vows Revival of PIA as Airline Restores UK Flight Operations After 5 Years

UK: In a positive development, Defence Minister Khawaja Asif has reaffirmed the government's commitment to making Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) a profitable and competitive organisation as the national flag carrier resumed weekly flights to the United Kingdom (UK) today (Saturday) after a hiatus of five years.

The defence czar made the remarks while speaking during an inauguration ceremony at the Islamabad International Airport to mark the resumption of PIA's flight operations to the United Kingdom.

PIA's flight PK-701 of Boeing 777 departed from Islamabad airport to Manchester. The flight will land at 5pm PST after a non-stop flight of around five hours.

A special ceremony will



also be held at Manchester Airport to welcome the inaugural flight, said a PIA spokesperson.

Britain lifted the five-year ban in July this year, allowing Pakistani airlines to apply to restart UK flights. The flight resumption became possible after PIA received Third Country Operator (TCO) approval from British authorities last month.

Addressing the ceremony today, Asif said the

suspension of PIA's UK operations had caused significant financial losses to the government, but added that the airline's standards had now been restored. "We have successfully reinstated the quality and credibility of our national airline," he added. The federal defence minister commended the efforts of Pakistan's diplomatic staff, saying their tireless work had played a crucial role in lifting the ban. —RT/Agency

President, PM Praise Security Forces for Successful Anti-Terror Operation in Tank

ISLAMABAD: President Asif Ali Zardari and Prime Minister Muhammad Shehbaz Sharif jointly praised Pakistan's security forces for a successful counter-terrorism operation in Tank, hailing the action as a major blow to militants they say were operating with Indian support and pledging to continue efforts to eradicate the menace of terrorism from the country. President Zardari, in a separate statement issued by the Presidency, commended the professionalism and bravery of security personnel involved in the Tank operation



and reaffirmed his full support for the government's counter-terrorism campaign, naming it "Operation Azm-e-Istehkam." The president described terrorism as a

scourge whose elimination requires the nation's full backing of the security forces and vowed that the sacrifices made for Pakistan's peace and stability "will not go in vain." —RT/Agency

Customs Quetta Seizes Rs18.6 Billion Worth of Crystal Ice in Massive Smuggling Bust



ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) announced that the Customs Enforcement team in Quetta has successfully foiled an attempt to smuggle crystal ice worth billions of rupees. According to the FBR, 300 kilograms of crystal methamphetamine (ice)

were concealed inside a modified fuel tank of a truck traveling from Taftan to Quetta. Acting on a tip-off from the Collector of Customs (Enforcement) Quetta, the Field Enforcement Unit in Noshki conducted the operation that led to the major drug bust. —RT/Agency

Pakistan Calls Out Indian Media for Spreading 'Dangerous Regional Disinformation'

ISLAMABAD: The Ministry of Information and Broadcasting of Pakistan has once again exposed the nefarious tactics of Indian media in spreading misinformation and fostering instability in the region. In a detailed statement, the ministry condemned the false and misleading reports propagated by Indian news outlets, particularly NDTV and Republic News India, accusing them of promoting hatred and discord in the region. The statement specifically highlighted a recent claim made



by NDTV, which falsely stated that on October 8, militants from the Khorasani faction had ambushed and martyred 22 Pakistani soldiers in Kurram. The Inter-

Services Public Relations (ISPR) swiftly rejected this claim, clarifying that the operation was carried out in Orakzai, not Kurram, on October 7 and 8. —RT/Agency

At UN, Pakistan Condemns India's Persecution of Muslims, Christians and Sikhs

NEW YORK: Pakistan strongly condemned India's treatment of its religious minorities, emphasizing that Muslims, Christians, and Sikhs are facing increasing persecution within the country.

The remarks were made by Gul Qaiser Sarwani, Counsellor and Political Coordinator of the Permanent Mission of Pakistan to the UN, in response to the assertions made by India's representative.

During his address, Sarwani highlighted the continued violence and discrimina-



tion faced by minority groups in India, with specific references to Muslims being lynched in public, Christians attacked in their places of worship, and Sikhs facing demonization for

their faith. He pointed to past violent episodes such as the 2002 Gujarat riots, the 1984 anti-Sikh violence, and ongoing religious violence in Delhi and Manipur. —RT/Agency

Dar Meets UN Envoy; Pakistan Pledges Stronger National Road Safety Reforms

ISLAMABAD: Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister (DPM/FM), Senator Mohammad Ishaq Dar reaffirmed Pakistan's commitment to advancing road safety and reducing traffic-related fatalities across the country during his meeting

with the United Nations Secretary-General's Special Envoy for Road Safety, Jean Todt. During the meeting, Deputy Prime Minister Dar commended UN Special Envoy Todt for his distinguished career in motorsport, philanthropy, and his significant contributions to promoting global road safety, a DPM's office news release said. He noted that Pakistan attaches great importance to the UN's efforts to make roads safer worldwide and expressed appreciation for the Envoy's initiatives. —RT/Agency

PPP's Shazia Marri Denies Any Agreement to Install PML-N Government in Balochistan

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Peoples Party Parliamentarians (PPP) leader Shazia Marri said on Saturday that no understanding had been reached regarding the formation of a Pakistan Muslim League (N) (PML-N) government in Balochistan in her statement, the PPP's central spokesperson said that when decisions on official development programmes are made behind closed doors, it is wrong. She



remarked that if PPP members do not attend the Assembly, then their quorum cannot be met and sessions have to be postponed. She noted that when Shehbaz Sharif came to the PPP seeking to become

prime minister, some matters had been settled. In the session of the party's Executive Council, members voiced their reservations about the government, following which President Asif Ali Zardari took responsibility that whatever agreements had been made would be honoured, however, no agreement had been made about the PML-N forming a government in Balochistan. —RT/Agency

IHC to Hear Petition Seeking to Block Imran's X Account on November 4



ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad High Court has scheduled a hearing for the petition seeking to block the X (formerly Twitter) account of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan.

The petition, filed by a concerned citizen, will be

heard on November 4, 2025 by IHC's Justice Arbab Muhammad Tahir. The court has issued notices to Imran Khan, the National Cyber Crime Agency, the superintendent of Jail, and other parties involved, asking for their responses. —RT/Agency

Violence, Racism & Neo-Nazi Ideology Take Over Toxic US Political Group Chats



US: Three separate controversies involving leaked text messages from private online group chats have rocked US political circles this month, revealing racist, antisemitic, and violent statements from figures across the ideological spectrum. The messages — sent privately but now public — include racial slurs, praise for Nazis, and threats of political violence, raising questions about why those involved felt comfortable expressing such views despite the risk of exposure and censure. —RT/Agency

Trump to meet Qatar leaders on way to Asia

WASHINGTON: US President Donald Trump will meet Saturday with the emir and prime minister of Qatar — a key ally in preserving the fragile Gaza peace deal — during a refueling stop on his way to Asia, officials said.

The Qatari leaders will board Air Force One late in the day when it lands at Al Udeid Air Base, which hosts the regional headquarters for the US military and thousands of American troops, a White House official said. Trump is traveling to Asia for the first time since retaking office in January, with two regional summits and a face-to-face meeting with China's Xi Jinping and other leaders on the



agenda in Qatar, the previously unannounced meeting will also be attended by US Secretary of State Marco Rubio, fresh off a trip to Israel as part of an all-out diplomatic push by Washington to keep the Gaza truce on track. Qatar has played a key mediating role in indirect talks between Israel and Hamas since the outbreak of the war, and is among the

ISPR DG Holds Direct Dialogue with Students and Scholars in Mardan

RAWALPINDI: Director General of Inter-Services Public Relations (DG ISPR), Lieutenant General Ahmed Sharif Chaudhry, held an interactive session with teachers and students from various universities and seminaries in Mardan on Saturday. Participants included representatives from Abdul Wali Khan University, Women University, University of Engineering and Technology, and several madaris (religious seminaries). During the session, Lt Gen Chaudhry discussed several key topics, including Operation Marg Bar Kharij, recent Pakistan-Afghanistan tensions, and the overall security situation in the region.

He emphasised that Pakistan has taken effective measures against terrorism and extremist



elements, adding that in the face of any aggression from the enemy, the Pakistan Army and the nation will stand together as an unbreakable wall. On this occasion, students and teachers paid rich tribute to the country's martyrs and heroes. The teachers remarked that the ISPR DG's address had cleared many misconceptions about the Pakistan Armed Forces, saying the nation

deeply values the army's role in peacebuilding and national development. The students stated that the youth of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa stand shoulder to shoulder with the Pakistan Army for the nation's security and stability. They said they now better understand how hostile elements use social media to spread propaganda against Pakistan and its forces. —RT/Agency

Putin Envoy Says US, Ukraine and Russia 'Near Diplomatic Breakthrough'

US: Kirill Dmitriev, Russian President Vladimir Putin's special envoy for investment and economic cooperation, said he believes his country, the United States and Ukraine are close to a diplomatic solution to end Russia's war in Ukraine.

Speaking to CNN after arriving in Washington for talks with US officials, Dmitriev said that a meeting between Donald Trump and Putin had not been cancelled, as the US president described it, and that the two leaders will likely meet at a later date.

The planned summit was put on hold on Tuesday, as Russia's rejection of an immediate ceasefire cast a cloud over attempts at negotiations. Trump said he can-



celled the planned meeting with Putin in Budapest because of a lack of progress in diplomatic efforts toward ending the war and a sense that the timing was off. However, Dmitriev said, "I believe Russia and the US and Ukraine are actually quite close to a diplomatic solution." Dmitriev, in his comments, did not offer details of what this would entail. European nations are working with Ukraine on a new proposal for a ceasefire in the war along current battle lines, European diplomats told Reuters this week, mainly incorporating ideas already under discussion while pressing to keep the United States in a central role. —RT/Agency

Trump Eyes Major Deal with China's Xi During Upcoming Asia Visit

US: US President Donald Trump will test his deal-making capabilities on a trip to Asia, a region battered by his hardball trade policies, while doubts hang over his highly anticipated meeting with China's Xi Jinping. Trump, who left Washington on night, is set for a five-

day trip to Malaysia, Japan and South Korea, his first to the region and longest journey abroad since taking office in January. The Republican leader hopes to pile up trade, critical mineral and ceasefire deals before turning to the toughest challenge, a face-to-face with Xi on Thursday in South Korea. Trump is also looking to maintain the signature foreign policy achievement of his second term: a fragile ceasefire he helped to strike in the Israel-Gaza conflict, while the Russian war in Ukraine rages and a trade war with China shows little sign of ending. —RT/Agency
