Top TTP Commander Among Four Terrorists Killed In Bajaur

BAJAUR: In a major breakthrough, security forces killed four terrorists, including top Fima al-Khawarij, Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP), commander in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Bajaur district, the military's media wing said on Thursday.



In a statement, the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said on the night of October 29 and 30, the movement of a group of terrorists, who were trying to infiltrate through the Pakistan-Afghanistan border, was picked up by the security forces in Bajaur district.

"Own troops effectively engaged and thwarted Khawarij's attempt to infiltrate," it said, adding that as a result of precise and skilful engagement, four militants, including Kharij leader and a high-value target Amjad alias Mazahim, were sent to hell.

The ISPR said that killed TTP commander "Amjad, second to Kharij Noor Wali and head of Rehbari Shura of Indian proxy Fima al-Khawarij, was highly wanted by the law enforcement agencies (LEAs) and govt had fixed head money of Rs5 million on him, as he remained actively involved in perpetrating numerous terrorist activities inside Pakistan while residing in Afghanistan." "Sanitisation operation is being conducted to eliminate any other Indian-sponsored Kharij found in the area as a relentless counterterrorism campaign under vision 'Azam-e-Istehkam' by security forces and LEAs will continue at full pace to wipe out the menace of foreign-sponsored and supported terrorism from the country," the ISPR statement read.—RT/Agency

Pakistan Seeks Peace But Won't Tolerate Cross-Border Terrorism: COAS Munir

Chief of the Army Staff (COAS) Field Marshal Syed Asim Munir said on Thursday that Pakistan sought peace with all neighbours, including Afghanistan, but reiterated that the country will not allow cross-border terrorism to be perpetrated from Afghan soil.



According to a statement from the military's media wing, the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR), Field Marshal Munir made the comments during a trip to Peshawar, where he held an interactive session with a jirga of tribal elders. Later on, he was given a comprehensive briefing at Headquarters 11 Corps on the prevailing security environment, operational preparedness and ongoing

counter terrorism efforts to maintain peace and stability along the Pak-Afghan border. Pakistan-Afghanistan relations have worsened sharply in recent weeks, marked by border clashes and mutual accusations. Islamabad has repeatedly warned Kabul against permit-

ing the banned Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) to use Afghan territory for attacks — an allegation the Taliban reject. After a ceasefire, both sides initiated talks in Turkey to develop a mechanism for monitoring Taliban measures to curb cross-border assaults, but discussions

have so far reached a stalemate. While addressing the jirga, Field Marshal Munir highlighted that "despite the continuation of cross-border terrorism from Afghanistan, Pakistan, over the last few years has exercised patience and extended multiple diplomatic and economic overtures to Afghanistan, aimed at improving Pak-Afghan bilateral relations."

"However, instead of acting decisively against Indian-sponsored terror proxies Fima al Khawarij and Fima al Hindustan, [the] Afghan Taliban regime has been providing all possible assistance to these groups," the statement said. Fima al-Khawarij is a

term the state uses for terrorists belonging to the banned Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP), while Balochistan-based groups have been designated Fima al-Hindustan to highlight India's alleged role in terrorism and destabilisation across Pakistan.

It added that during the interaction, the COAS assured the tribal elders that Pakistan, particularly Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, will be "cleansed of the terrorists and their abettors."

The army chief also appreciated the "steadfast and unconditional support" rendered by the tribal people to the security forces during the recent standoff between Pakistan and the Afghan Taliban.—RT/Agency

Pakistan To Resume Talks With Afghan Taliban At Turkiye's Request

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has agreed to resume talks with the Afghan Taliban regime in Istanbul at the request of mediator Turkiye, after earlier rounds between Islamabad and Kabul failed to "bring about any workable solution," sources said on Thursday.



Sources familiar with the development told Geo News that Pakistan decided to resume the dialogue process to give peace another chance. The Pakistani delegation, which had been preparing to return home following the breakdown of earlier talks, will now extend its stay in Istanbul to continue discussions.

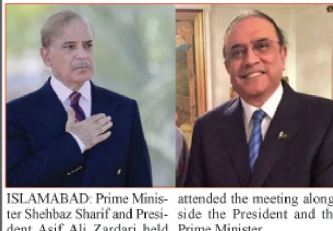
The negotiations will reportedly focus on Pakistan's core demand that

Afghanistan take "clear, verifiable and effective action" against terrorist groups operating from its soil, sources added. Despite mediation efforts by friendly nations, talks between Pakistan and Afghanistan in Istanbul had collapsed after the Taliban regime refused to provide verifiable guarantees that

their territory would not be used by groups such as the TTP to launch attacks against Pakistan.

Islamabad has repeatedly conveyed its concerns to Taliban rulers over cross-border attacks and urged that Afghan territory not be used for terrorism against Pakistan.—RT/Agency

Trump Cuts China Tariffs To 47% After 'Amazing' Xi Meeting

US President Donald Trump said on Thursday he had agreed to reduce tariffs on China to 47% in exchange for Beijing resuming US soybean purchases, keeping rare earths exports flowing and cracking down on the illicit trade of fentanyl.



His remarks after face-to-face talks with Chinese President Xi Jinping in the South Korean city of Busan, their first since 2019, marked the finale of Trump's whirlwind Asia trip on which he also touted trade breakthroughs with South Korea, Japan and Southeast Asian nations.

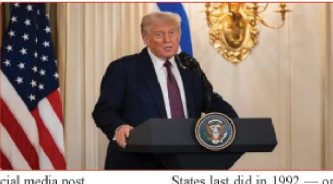
"I thought it was an amazing meeting," Trump told reporters aboard Air Force One shortly after he departed Busan, adding that tariffs imposed on Chinese imports

would be cut to 47% from 57%. Trading in global stocks was choppy as Trump revealed details of the deal, with major Asian indexes and European futures swinging between gains and losses. China's Shanghai Composite Index slipped from a 10-year high, while US soybean fu-

tures were weaker. World stock markets from Wall Street to Tokyo had hit record highs leading up to the meeting on hopes of a breakthrough in a trade war between the world's two largest economies that has upended supply chains and rocked global business confidence.—RT/Agency

Trump Orders Resumption Of US Nuclear Weapons Testing

WASHINGTON: US President Donald Trump said Thursday that he has ordered the Pentagon to start nuclear weapons testing to equal China and Russia — just minutes before opening a high-stakes summit with Chinese leader Xi Jinping.



The move comes after Russian President Vladimir Putin said Wednesday that Moscow had successfully tested a nuclear-capable, nuclear-powered underwater drone, in defiance of Washington's warnings.

"Because of other countries testing programs, I have instructed the Department of War to start testing our Nuclear Weapons on an equal basis," Trump wrote in a so-

cial media post. Since 1996 the United States has been a signatory to the Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty, which bans all atomic test blasts, whether for military or civilian purposes.

It was not immediately clear if Trump was referring to testing nuclear warheads — something the United States last did in 1992 — or testing weapons systems capable of carrying atomic warheads.

Trump also claimed the US has more nuclear weapons than any other country, praising his own efforts to do "a complete update and renovation of existing weapons."—RT/Agency

Asif, US Envoy Call For Peaceful, Stable Afghanistan

ISLAMABAD: Defence Minister Khawaja Asif and United States Charge d'Affaires Natalie Baker underlined the importance of a peaceful, stable and secure Afghanistan, and expressed determination to address the challenges arising from it effectively.



According to details surfaced on Thursday, Asif and the US envoy met to discuss bilateral defence cooperation and regional peace. During the meeting, both sides expressed satisfaction over the positive progress in Pakistan-US relations.

The defence minister said

that ties between the two countries were based on mutual respect, stability and shared goals of prosperity.

The discussion also covered the situation in Afghanistan.

They agreed to strengthen cooperation in defence and other areas of mutual interest.—RT/Agency

Hamas Hands Over Bodies Of Two Israeli Hostages

CAIRO/GAZA/JERUSALEM: Palestinian fighter group Hamas handed over two bodies it said were of deceased Israeli hostages on Thursday, a day after the tenuous Gaza ceasefire was shaken by a series of deadly Israeli strikes across the enclave. The office of Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said that the two bodies had been received by Israeli forces via the Red Cross in Gaza and will be transported into Israel for identification. Under the ceasefire accord, Hamas released all living hostages in return for nearly 2,000 Palestinian prisoners and wartime detainees, while Israel pulled back its troops, halted its offensive and increased aid into the enclave. Hamas also agreed to hand over the re-



main of all 28 dead hostages in exchange for 360 Palestinian fighters killed in the war. Up to Thursday it had handed over 15 bodies Israel says Hamas has been too slow to hand over the remaining bodies of hostages still in Gaza. Hamas says it will take time to locate and retrieve all of the remains. Families of some of the hostages are desperate to provide a proper burial for their loved ones and fear their remains will be lost forever beneath the ruins of Gaza.—RT/Agency

Pakistani Astronaut To Join China's Space Mission

BEIJING: In a landmark development for Pakistan's space ambitions, the China Manned Space Agency (CMSA) announced that two Pakistani astronauts will train alongside Chinese astronauts, and one of them will participate in a short-duration spaceflight mission as a payload specialist.



The announcement was made by Zhang Jingbo, spokesperson for the CMSA, during a press conference on Thursday. The move follows a bilateral cooperation agreement between China and Pakistan signed in February 2025, aimed at strengthening collaboration in human spaceflight and scientific research.

Astronaut selection process officially underway. According to Zhang, the selection process for Pakistani astronauts has officially begun. Similar to the

system used for Chinese astronauts, the process consists of three stages — preliminary selection, second-round evaluation, and final selection.

The preliminary selection phase is currently being conducted in Pakistan, while the second round and final selections will take place in China. Preparations for the next stages are already underway, including developing training programs, preparing teaching materials and equipment, and

arranging logistical support for the astronauts during their training period. Training alongside Chinese astronauts Once the final selection is complete, two Pakistani astronauts will undergo joint training with Chinese counterparts under the supervision of the CMSA. One of them will then be chosen to participate in a short-duration spaceflight mission aboard a Chinese spacecraft, serving as a payload specialist.—RT/Agency

Turkiye Stood By Pakistan Like A Rock During War With India: PM Shehbaz

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has said that Turkey has always stood firmly with Pakistan in every difficult time, including during the war with India. He praised the Turkish leadership for its unwavering support, stating that during the conflict, Turkey stood by Pakistan "like a rock."



The Prime Minister highlighted that Pakistan and Turkey continue to strengthen their economic, strategic, and defense cooperation, reflecting a deep bond of friendship and mutual trust. Recalling the recent con-

flict with India, Shehbaz said the war lasted for four days, during which the Pakistan Armed Forces, under the leadership of Field Marshal Asim Munir, taught the enemy a strong lesson. He added that Pak-

istan remains grateful to Turkey for its consistent solidarity and support, emphasizing that both nations will continue to work together for regional peace, prosperity, and mutual development.—RT/Agency

Pakistan Condemns RSF Siege Of Al-Fashir At UN Security Council

NEW YORK: The United Nations Security Council convened an emergency meeting following the Rapid Support Forces (RSF)'s capture of Al-Fashir in Sudan.



Speaking at the session, Pakistan's Permanent Representative to the UN, Asim Iftikhar, strongly condemned the RSF's takeover, describing it as "a glimpse of war crimes."

He emphasised that the humanitarian violations in Darfur were unacceptable, adding that escalating tensions had left women, children, and the elderly unsafe. "Sudan's sovereignty and regional stability are at risk," he warned Asim Iftikhar urged the international community to ensure accountability for the RSF, calling for an end to the civil war, a political solution, and transparent judicial proceedings. He also demanded immediate global action on the Darfur crisis and urged all parties to uphold international humanitarian law. Pakistan further called for an investigation into obstructions in aid delivery to Sudan and reaffirmed its commitment to supporting peace and humanitarian efforts in the region. Separately, in a statement, the United Nations Security Council on Thursday condemned an assault by the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces on al-Fashir in Sudan's North Darfur, expressing grave concern "at the heightened risk of large-scale atrocities, including ethnically motivated atrocities."—RT/Agency

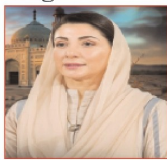

According to reports, the removal was due to failure to meet the eligibility score of 32 and non-verification of data during the recent reassessment process. Authorities added that surveys for the remaining 11 districts are still underway, and once completed, the number of

excluded beneficiaries may rise to over 1.1 million. Currently, Sindh has around 2.7 million registered BISP beneficiaries. Following the expected exclusions, the total number of eligible recipients is projected to drop to around 1.6 million.—RT/Agency

UBG Calls on State Bank to Slash Interest Rate by 1% Following U.S. Fed Cut

Karachi: Zubair Tufail, President of the United Business Group (UBG), has called on the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) to immediately lower its policy rate by 100 basis points, following the U.S. Federal Reserve's recent 25-basis-point rate cut.

In a statement issued by UBG spokesperson Gulzar Firoz, Tufail criticized the SBP's decision to maintain its policy rate at 11%, saying it has dampened investor sentiment and stalled new industrial investments. He emphasized that persistent high interest rates are discouraging entrepreneurs from expanding operations, ultimately slowing economic growth.



Tufail stressed that reducing the policy rate to single digits would enable industries to borrow more affordably, purchase new machinery, and create jobs. Citing the U.S. Fed's latest move to lower rates to 3.75-4.00%, he urged Pakistan to adopt a similar approach to stimulate growth.—RT

The 319 run total was South Africa's highest ever in World Cup matches. Moreover, it was also the second-highest total in a knockout match.

The skipper struck 20 fours and four maximums in her monumental knock, which made her the first women's player to score an ODI hundred in the knockout of the World Cup.

She has now scored the most half-centuries (12) in the marquee event, surpassing India's Mithali Raj's record of 11. Her 169 is also the second-best score by a captain in the women's ODI WC.

Cricket Australia Posts \$7 Million Loss Despite Blockbuster India Tour

Cricket Australia (CA) announced a net deficit of \$511.3 million (\$7.34 million) for the 2024-25 financial year on Thursday, with a steep increase in costs offsetting a jump in revenue from hosting the Border-Gavaskar series against powerhouse India.

CA said at its annual general meeting (AGM) total revenue increased by \$549.2 million from the previous year to \$545.7 million, predominantly driven by a new domestic media deal and match revenue from the five-test series against India.

Expenses increased by \$524.1 million, which included marketing costs for the India series and funding 70 extra days of touring for national teams.

However, distributions to CA's member states and territories barely moved, rising



by \$880,000 from the previous year to \$120.9 million. Member state Cricket Victoria (CV) condemned CA for the annual loss, saying the governing body had delivered little financial improvement despite significant and costly reviews.

"For another year, CA is presenting a financial loss with a balance sheet showing member funds in deficit," CV Chairman Ross Hepburn said at the AGM.

"It is especially disap-

million in the coming year.

"The Ashes and India white-ball content in FY26 is expected to deliver significant profit to CA and this will enable CA to rebuild its net assets and cash reserves for the next cycle," CA CFO Sarah Pragnell said. CA is exploring allowing private investment in teams in the Big Bash League, the nation's domestic T20 tournament, to unlock value and boost its competitiveness against international rivals like the Indian Premier League. Securing the backing of member states will be among CA's biggest challenges.

We believe that all other options need to be diligently canvassed before resorting to selling off member assets," said CV's Hepburn.—Agency

CA CEO Todd Greenberg said the outlook for 2025-26 was positive, with Australia to host England in the five-test Ashes series starting in Perth on November 21.

He said CA was forecasting a sharp lift in commercial and sponsorship revenue from \$569 million to \$586

Kane Strikes Twice as Bayern Smash European Wins Record in German Cup

Harry Kane grabbed a double as Bayern Munich set a European record of 14 successive victories to start a season with their 4-1 win at Cologne in the German Cup second round on Wednesday.

Kane's first, an incredible curling strike on the turn, and a second-half header brought his tally to 22 goals in 14 games this season.

Wingers Luis Diaz and Michael Olise also got on the scoresheet for the 20-time German Cup winners.

Cologne's Ragnar Ache scored the opener, which put Bayern behind for the first time in a match this season.

Bayern's victory bettered the record of 13 wins to start a season in all com-



petitions set by Fabio Capello's AC Milan in 1992-93 — the previous best mark in Europe's top-five leagues.

The in-form England captain Kane has scored two hat-tricks and six braces in Bayern's record-breaking run, only failing to score in two of the 14 matches.

Bayern coach Vincent Kompany was careful to

praise Kane's all-round contribution, as the striker continued to drop deep and create.

"It's funny sometimes — at the end of the game I asked someone if Harry scored today, and he said, 'yes, two goals'," Kompany told Germany's ARD.

"Sometimes you don't even notice it, because of all the other stuff he does for the team."

Earlier, Bayer Leverkusen scored two goals after the 120-minute mark to win 4-2 at a 10-man Paderborn.

A frustrating night for the 2024 German domestic double winners looked destined to go to spot-kicks until 19-year-old Ibrahim Maza netted to spare Leverkusen's blushes against their second-division opponents, who had not lost since August. Alex Garcia then added gloss to the rout with Paderborn pushing for an equaliser. In regulation time, Alejandro Grimaldo's 60th-minute free-kick for Leverkusen — his fourth dead-ball goal this season — was cancelled out when Paderborn's Stefano Marino scored in the 90th minute.—Agency

Slot Stands Firm on League Cup Choices Despite Falling Short of Liverpool Class



Liverpool boss Arne Slot defended his decision to name a much-changed side after a 3-0 League Cup exit to Crystal Palace on Wednesday, extended the Reds' miserable run.

The Premier League champions have now lost six of their last seven matches in all competitions, including their last four in the league.

Slot made his priorities clear before kick-off by making 10 changes, with the likes of Virgil van Dijk and Mohamed Salah left out of the squad completely.

A youthful selection were easily picked off by Palace, who have now beaten Liverpool three times this season. Ismaila Sarr struck twice

in the first half before Yerry Pino added a third late on after Liverpool substitute Amara Nallo was sent off.

"It's not Liverpool standards to lose six out of seven," said Slot, who used a big week ahead as justification for his team selection.

Liverpool will aim to snap their Premier League losing streak against inform Aston Villa on Saturday.

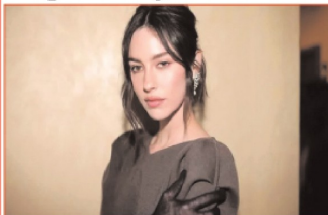
Real Madrid then visit Anfield in the Champions League on Tuesday before a trip to Manchester City on November 9.

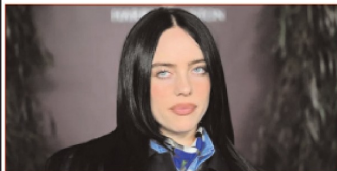
In her conversation with Lowe, Abrams reflected on the "life-changing" nature of the tour, admitting how the experience has refined her skills for the studio.

Sindh Reports 1,558 New Dengue Cases in 24 Hours; Health Department Steps Up Preventive Measures

Karachi: The Sindh Health Department has reported 1,558 new dengue cases across the province during the past 24 hours, following 5,742 tests conducted. According to the department's latest report, Karachi Division recorded 758 cases from 4,010 tests, while Hyderabad Division reported 800 cases from 1,732 tests. During the same period, 81 dengue patients were admitted to government hospitals and 68 to private facilities. Meanwhile, 83 patients recovered and were discharged, while two fatalities were reported from government hospitals. Currently, 381 patients remain under treatment across Sindh. To address the rising cases, 895 beds have been allocated in government hospitals and 329 in private facilities province-wide. Secretary Health Rehman Baloch said 36 laboratories in Karachi and 18 in Hyderabad are conducting dengue testing. Health Minister Dr. Azra Pechuho assured strict monitoring and urged the public not to believe misinformation, emphasizing enhanced fumigation, drainage, and mosquito control efforts across Sindh.—RT

Protest in North Karachi Over Prolonged Water Shortage

KARACHI: Residents of North Karachi held a protest at Power House Chowranghi against an extended disruption in water supply that has left many homes without water for several days. The demonstrators staged a sit-in on the main roads, blocking traffic and causing long queues of vehicles on both routes connecting Nagan Chowranghi and Sarjani. The protest reflects the growing frustration of local residents, who say that repeated complaints to the authorities have gone unanswered. Local citizens demanded immediate action from the relevant water and municipal departments, emphasizing that such prolonged water shortages are causing severe inconvenience to daily life, affecting households, businesses, and public health. KARACHI: Deputy Inspector General (DIG) Traffic Pir Muhammad Shah has announced that the speed limit for all types of vehicles — both small and large — across Karachi is fixed at 60 kilometers per hour.

He stated that any vehicle exceeding this limit will be issued an overspeeding ticket under the e-challan system. The DIG emphasized that no one will be exempted from traffic laws and that strict enforcement is now in

place. Pir Muhammad Shah further clarified that the objective of the e-challan system is not to generate fines but to ensure public compliance with traffic regulations and promote safer driving habits in the city.—RT/Agency

Over 16,000 E-Challans Issued in Karachi Since Launch of Automated Traffic System

Court Issues Notice to Sindh IG Over Mysterious Disappearance of Karachi Student Leader

KARACHI: The Sindh High Court (SHC) has issued notices to the Inspector General of Sindh Police and other officials in connection with the recovery of missing student leader Ghani Aman Chandio.

The case was heard on a petition filed by Chandio's sister, who stated that on the evening of October 18, her brother was allegedly taken away from a private hospital on Shahrah-e-Quaid-e-Azam where he was attending to his newborn twins under treatment. According to the

petitioner, personnel from a law enforcement agency and several plainclothes individuals entered the hospital room and took him away. The petition requested the court to ensure Chandio's immediate recovery.—RT/Agency

According to the petition, Shah was kidnapped on the evening of October 24 from

Orangi Town by SIU personnel along with several private individuals and was detained at a private torture cell within the SIU Centre. His counsel informed the court that the abductors threatened to kill him and demanded Rs2 million as ransom.

The petitioner's lawyer further stated that a few

days earlier, a youth named Irfan Baloch had also died in SIU custody. The petition requested the court to order an inquiry by the Sindh Inspector General of Police and seek a report from the Home Department regarding the legality of SIU's operations.—RT/Agency

Two Arrested After Five-Year-Old Shot During Robbery in Machhar Colony

KARACHI: Police have arrested two suspects involved in shooting and injuring a five-year-old boy during a robbery attempt in Karachi's Machhar Colony area.

According to SSP Kea-

mari Captain (R) Faizan Ali, last month armed robbers tried to loot a rickshaw driver named Asif in Machhar Colony. During resistance, the suspects opened fire, injuring Asif's five-year-old son, Sufiyan. The case had been registered at Docks Police Station. India Using Afghan Soil For Proxy War Against Pakistan: Asif

ISLAMABAD: Defence Minister Khawaja Asif has said that Pakistan made sincere efforts to maintain peace and friendly relations with Afghanistan, but the Kabul administration has chosen the path of confrontation instead.

"We tried wholeheartedly to ensure that Pakistan and Afghanistan live together in peace and harmony, but if Kabul prefers conflict, then so be it," he stated in an interview with Arab media.

The Defence Minister accused India of waging a low-intensity proxy war against Pakistan from Afghan territory. He claimed that Afghanistan has effectively become a tool of Indian influence in the region, adding that Islamabad possesses credible evidence of close



coordination between New Delhi and Kabul against Pakistan.

Asif emphasized that Pakistan's patience should not be mistaken for weakness, asserting that the country has the capability and determination to defend its sovereignty. He said the recent incidents along the Pak-Afghan border were met with a strong and proportionate response by Pakistani forces, who acted firmly to safeguard national security.

"Afghanistan's continued alignment with India's anti-Pakistan agenda will only destabilize the region," he warned, urging Kabul to act responsibly and avoid becoming a base for hostile activities.—RT/Agency

India Reaffirms Commitment To Afghanistan's Sovereignty, Integrity

DELHI: Indian Ministry of External Affairs spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal on Thursday said that India remains committed to the sovereignty, territorial integrity and independence of Afghanistan, amid Kabul's heightened tensions with Pakistan.

Pakistan-Afghanistan ties have deteriorated sharply in recent weeks amid border clashes and mutual accusations.

Islamabad has long been warning Kabul against allowing the banned Tehreek-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) to operate from Afghan soil — a claim the Taliban deny. Following a ceasefire, talks in Turkey began to establish a mechanism to monitor Taliban efforts to curb cross-border attacks, but have so far resulted in an impasse.

At a press briefing, the spokesperson received questions asking why Pakistan was blaming Indian proxy Fitna al Khawarij for terror-



ist attacks on its soil and Defence Minister Khawaja Asif's remarks about Kabul fighting a proxy war on behalf of Delhi.

"In my last briefing, I had elaborated our point of view: our thoughts on this particular matter, Pakistan is infuriated with Afghanistan exercising sovereignty over its territories," Jaiswal replied. "Pakistan seems to think it has the right to practice cross-border terrorism with impunity. Its neighbours find it unacceptable."

"India remains committed to the sovereignty, territorial integrity and independence of Afghanistan," Jaiswal said.

In response to a question about Indian projects in Afghanistan, Jaiswal referred to Afghan Foreign Minister Amir Khan Muttaqi's recent visit to India and the joint statement issued afterwards.

"As part of the visit, we had issued a joint statement between both countries," the spokesperson said.—RT/Agency

China Responds To Trump's Nuclear Testing Order

China has urged the United States to uphold its international obligations under the Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty (CTBT) after U.S. President Donald Trump ordered the Pentagon to resume nuclear weapons testing "on an equal basis" with Russia and China.

The statement marks a sharp response from Beijing amid growing regional tensions over nuclear expansion.

Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Gao Jikun said Beijing "hopes the U.S. will abide by the CTBT and maintain its commitment to suspend nuclear tests." The comments, reported by China's state-run Global Times, came shortly after Trump's directive reignited concerns about a potential new arms race among nuclear powers.

Guo emphasized that re-



suming nuclear tests would undermine global stability and reverse decades of progress toward disarmament. "We urge the United States to take responsible actions that contribute to world peace and security," he added.

China warns US and South Korea

In a separate statement on Thursday, China's foreign ministry criticized both Washington and Seoul after Trump approved South Korea's request to build nuclear-powered submarines at a U.S. shipyard.—RT/Agency

Russia Tests Nuclear-Capable Poseidon Super Torpedo

President Vladimir Putin said on Wednesday that Russia had successfully tested a Poseidon nuclear-powered super torpedo that military analysts say is capable of devastating coastal regions by triggering vast radioactive ocean swells.

As U.S. President Donald Trump has toughened both his rhetoric and his stance on Russia, Putin has publicly flexed his nuclear muscles.

On the test of a new Burevestnik cruise missile on October 21 and nuclear launch drills on October 22.

There are few confirmed details about the Poseidon, named after the ancient Greek god of the sea, but it is essentially a nuclear-capable cross between a torpedo and a drone.

Putin, over tea and cakes at a hospital in Moscow with Russian soldiers wounded in the Ukraine war, said the test had taken place on Tuesday.

For the first time, we managed not only to launch it



with a launch engine from a carrier submarine, but also to launch the nuclear power unit on which this device passed a certain amount of time," Putin said.

"There is nothing like this," he said, adding there was no way to intercept the Poseidon, which analysts believe has a range of 10,000 km (6,200 miles) and can travel at about 185 km per hour.

The Burevestnik and Poseidon tests are intended to send a clear message that Russia, in Putin's words, will never bow to Western pressure over the war in Ukraine.

For Trump, who has called Russia a "paper tiger" for failing to swiftly subdue Ukraine, the message is that Russia remains a global military competitor, especially on nuclear weapons, and that Moscow's overtures on nuclear arms control should be acted on.

POSEIDON AND THE NEW NUCLEAR ARMS RACE

The Poseidon is a new weapon that has appeared amid what Putin has cast as a global arms race — primarily between the United States, Russia and China — to modernise and develop their nuclear arsenals.—RT/Agency

KP CM Ready To Work With Centre If Decisions Not Imposed

RAWALPINDI: Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Sohail Afridi has said that his government is ready to cooperate with the federal government if decisions are not imposed behind closed doors.

The provincial chief executive was once again denied permission to meet jailed Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan.

It was the fourth time since his October 13 election as Khyber Pakhtunkhwa chief minister that Afridi had been denied a meeting with the jailed PTI founder.

Speaking to Geo News on Thursday, Afridi — who replaced Ali Amin Gandapur as the chief minister earlier this month — said he has started reviewing provincial affairs and has received several briefings, with more scheduled in the coming days.

The chief minister, who is a young PTI leader, added that consultation for a short



provincial cabinet has been completed, and it will be formed soon.

Commenting on governance, Afridi said that resolving issues requires sincere intent rather than mere experience. "To run provincial matters, one needs the will to serve the public, not just experience," he remarked.

He questioned what the experienced rulers in Punjab and the Centre had delivered to the people, noting the decline in economic growth.

"What was our GDP growth in 2022, and what is it now?" he asked.

Despite political rivalry, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif congratulated Afridi for being elected as the chief minister and emphasised the centre-province coordination to achieve the national goals.

It was the first telephonic conversation between PM Shehbaz and CM Afridi following the latter's election to the top post.—RT/Agency

PTI's Salman Akram Raja Says 'Elements Within Party' Trying To Undermine Him

ISLAMABAD: PTI Secretary General Salman Akram Raja on Thursday alleged that some "narrow-minded" elements in the party were trying to undermine and sabotage him in the wake of party founder Imran Khan resuming his trust in him.

Earlier this week, Imran's sister Uzma Khanum had clarified that only Raja was empowered to relay messages to the party on the ex-premier's behalf to avoid confusion.

In a series of posts on X today, Raja referred to the development and said: "A few days ago, Khan sahib instructed that his messages will now be conveyed only through me. The narrow-minded said I had added my own name to some list. The worshippers of ego and posi-



tions neither know Khan sahib nor his loyalists."

He added that those who "conspire against me are humiliated every time" before the party founder, adding that Imran knew he had never sought any position.

"The problem that some friends and self-proclaimed enemies face is only this — Imran Khan sahib trusts me. In 2013, when Khan sahib

PTI-Backed Khurram Zeeshan Wins Senate By-Poll

PTI-backed candidate Khurram Zeeshan emerged victorious with 91 votes in the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Senate by-election, according to unofficial and unconfirmed results announced on Thursday.

His rival, Taj Afridi, who was backed by the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N), secured 45 votes. The seat was vacated after PTI leader Shibli Faraz, who was also the opposition leader in the Senate, was disqualified.

A total of five candidates contested the by-election, while one vote was declared invalid during the counting process.

The voting took place at the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Assembly, where lawmakers cast their ballots to fill the



vacant Senate seat. The election remained peaceful.

After winning the election, the Senator-elect told reporters that he would now take his "battle" from the field to the Parliament. "Our first target is Imran Khan's release. There can be no stability in Pakistan until Imran Khan is freed."

Newly-elected KP Chief Minister Sohail Afridi had also cast his vote. In a post on X, he had said that PTI founder Imran Khan's candidature would win with a huge majority.—RT/Agency

Aleema Khan's CNIC, Passport Blocked; Arrest Warrants Reissued

RAWALPINDI: The National Database and Registration Authority (NADRA) has informed an anti-terrorism court (ATC) that Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan's sister, Aleema Khan, has had her computerised national identity card (CNIC) and passport blocked in compliance with a court order.

The case pertains to the November 26 protest, for which Aleema and 10 others have been nominated.

During the hearing presided over by Judge Amjad Ali Shah on Thursday, other suspects and prosecution witnesses appeared before the court, while Aleema and her lawyers remained absent once again.

Special Prosecutor Zaher Shah was also present along with his team.



Owing to her repeated non-appearances, the court reissued non-bailable arrest warrants for the PTI founder's sister for the sixth time.

NADRA submitted its report to the court, confirming that Aleema's CNIC and passport had been blocked in line with the judicial directive.

Meanwhile, the court also heard the case of Arif Khan — a suspect who had taken custody of a vehicle used during the November 26 protest.—RT/Agency

PIA Privatisation To Be Completed By December, Senate Panel Told

ISLAMABAD: The Senate Standing Committee on Privatisation, chaired by Senator Afanullah, was briefed on the ongoing privatisation process of the national flag carrier during its meeting in Islamabad.

Officials from the Privatisation Commission informed the committee that the process for Pakistan International Airlines' (PIA) privatisation is in progress and expected to be completed by December this year.

The commission's representatives said that the site due diligence process is nearing completion. They added that the privatisation will be finalised within the set timeline as per the government's plan.

According to the briefing, four consortia are currently participating in the process, reviewing PIA's accounts,



aircraft, and flight routes.

The committee was assured that all necessary steps are being taken to ensure transparency and the timely completion of the privatisation process.

The remarks come as Islamabad presses ahead with a fresh attempt to privatise the national flag carrier, a key condition under Pakistan's \$7bn International Monetary Fund (IMF) bailout. The government's earlier bid to pri-

vatise the entity failed as a \$36 million bid from real estate firm fell short of the \$305m floor price, with concerns over debt, staffing, and limited control.

This time, the government is offering full divestment, has scrapped the sales tax on leased aircraft, and is providing limited protection from legal and tax claims. Around 80% of the airline's debt has been transferred to the state.—RT/Agency

Israel Resumes Gaza Strikes, Kills Two Despite Ceasefire

GAZA: Israel has carried out fresh airstrikes in northern Gaza, killing at least two people despite announcing the resumption of a fragile ceasefire. The renewed assault follows a deadly wave of bombardments that killed more than 100 Palestinians earlier this week.

Israel's latest airstrike hit Beit Lahia in northern Gaza on Wednesday evening, according to al-Shifa Hospital. Officials said two people were killed when the Israeli military targeted what it claimed was a "weapons storage site" posing an "immediate threat" to its troops.

The renewed attacks came just a day after Prime Minister Benjamin Ne-



tanyahu ordered "powerful" retaliatory strikes in southern Gaza's Rafah area following the reported killing of an Israeli soldier.

The retaliatory assault left at least 104 Palestinians dead—mostly women and children—according to Gaza's Health Ministry. Israel later claimed the operation had killed senior Hamas fighters and declared that it would "resume" the ceasefire from mid-Wednesday.—RT/Agency
