Zardari Pushes Qatari Emir To Expand Defence And Investment Collaboration

DOHA: In a meeting with the Qatari emir on Wednesday, President Asif Ali Zardari offered to expand collaboration with Qatar in defence and defence production, a statement issued by the President's Secretariat said.

According to the statement, Qatari Emir Sheikh Hamad bin Khalifa al-Thani assured President Zardari that he would instruct the relevant authorities to begin discussions with Pakistan immediately.

During the meeting, the two leaders also reviewed ways to strengthen cooperation in political, economic and cultural sectors. President Zardari also proposed enhancing cooperation in agriculture and food security.

The Qatari emir said Qatar was proud of Pakistan and its achievements, and



deeply valued the contribution of the Pakistani community to Qatar's development. He expressed the desire to see their number increase significantly in the coming years.

The president conveyed warm greetings and best wishes from the government and people of Pakistan, expressing deep admiration for Qatar's remarkable progress and visionary leadership under the emir of Qatar.

The two leaders reaf-

firmed the historic and brotherly relations between Pakistan and Qatar, rooted in faith, mutual trust and shared aspirations for peace, prosperity and the advancement of the Muslim ummah.

The president lauded Qatar's growing global role as a centre of dialogue and humanitarian diplomacy, and paid tribute to its leadership in advocating a ceasefire and humanitarian relief for the people of Gaza.—RT/Agency

Consultations Heating Up On Armed Forces Law, Says Khawaja Asif

ISLAMABAD: Defence Minister Khawaja Asif has said that consultations were underway for amendments to the law that governs armed forces, as the government considers changes to the Constitution.

"Consultations on amending Article 243 are ongoing [...], defence requirements have changed," the minister told media exclusively on Wednesday in Islamabad.

The Constitution's Article 243 states that "The Federal Government shall have control and command of the Armed Forces" and "the Supreme Command of the



Armed Forces shall vest in the President", among other things.

"This entire process will be carried out through mutual consultation," said the defence minister, whose party,

the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N), attempts to amend the Constitution for the second time during its ongoing tenure.

Asif noted that consultations were ongoing with all political parties on the proposed amendment.

However, he declined to further comment on the potential tweet, saying that he "would not say anything until the amendment to Article 243 was finalised".

The minister expected clarity on the consensus within the next two or three days, with the 27th Amendment likely to be presented to parliament next week.

His comments came after Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif reportedly directed National Assembly Speaker Ayaz Sadiq to build consensus among po-

litical parties for the proposed amendment.

PML-N's efforts to amend the law came to light on November 3, when Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) Chairman Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari confirmed that the ruling party had sought their support in introducing the amendment.

Bilawal said that the proposed amendment, in addition to amending Article 243, included the establishment of a Constitutional Court and certain changes to the National Finance Commission Award.—RT/Agency

Dar Confronts Kabul On Militancy After Flurry Of Calls From Afghan FM

ISLAMABAD: Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar said on Tuesday he received six calls from Afghanistan's acting foreign minister, Amir Khan Muttaqi, and told him one thing: do not allow your soil to be used against us.

"I told the Afghan minister: we only want one thing—that Afghan territory not be used against Pakistan—and added that the situation has put him in a difficult position," DPM Dar said, while speaking on the floor of the Senate.

Recalling the fallout after the Taliban took power in 2021, the DPM said that Pakistani envoys told the new Afghan rulers they had come for "a cup of tea," but



that small missteps had costly consequences, and such mistakes must not be repeated. He said formal ties between the two countries were quiet for four years after the Taliban takeover, but he travelled to Afghanistan to hold talks and sign agreements. His single demand, he said, was that

Afghan soil not be used for attacks on Pakistan. "Violent incidents in Afghanistan have risen since the current government came in," Dar said and added, "Islamabad is committed to fighting to the last breath and expressed hope that talks scheduled for November 6 will move forward."—RT/Agency

Mamdani Declares Political Monarchy Dead After Historic Election Win



New York: Zohran Mamdani, the newly elected and first Muslim mayor of New York City, delivered a powerful victory speech on Tuesday night, declaring that his campaign had "overthrown a political monarchy."

The 34-year-old Democratic socialist thanked supporters and vowed to make New York a city for everyone—free from inequality and Islamophobia.

Standing before a cheering crowd, Mamdani said the people of New York had

voted for change and a "mandate for a politics that is for everyone." He emphasized that the future of the city now lies in the hands of its residents, marking the end of what he called "traditional politics that benefited the few."

He thanked his opponent Andrew Cuomo, wishing him well in private life, but asserted, "Tonight, I am taking his name for the last time, because we are saying goodbye to a politics that benefits only a few."—RT/Agency

Google Eyeing Pakistan As Next Big Global Export Powerhouse: FinMin Aurangzeb

KARACHI: Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb on Wednesday hailed the launch of Google Chromebook assembly line in Pakistan and said that the tech giant intends to make Pakistan an export hub, highlighting the country's growing potential in the technology and maritime sectors.

Speaking at the Future Summit in Karachi, the finance minister emphasised the need to equip youth with digital and technical skills to help them capture higher-value opportunities in coding, blockchain, and AI-driven sectors.

Pakistan's first Google Chromebook assembly line was launched on Tuesday in a ceremony attended by Deputy Prime Minister Senator Ishaq Khan, who termed it "a defining moment" in the country's digital transformation.

"Google's plan to establish Pakistan as an export hub



aligns with our vision for AI-driven growth. There are vast opportunities to expand the blue economy," Aurangzeb said.

Aurangzeb said that Pakistan's economy is moving in the right direction and emphasised that sustainable growth can only be achieved through production-driven development. "The private sector plays a vital role in economic progress. Our focus will remain on the IT and maritime sectors to transform Pakistan into an export-oriented economy," he remarked.—RT/Agency

Saudi Arabia's F-35 Dream Clears Crucial Pentagon Hurdle

US: The Trump administration is considering a Saudi Arabian request to buy as many as 48 F-35 fighter jets, a potential multi-billion-dollar deal that has cleared a key Pentagon hurdle ahead of a visit by Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, two sources familiar with the matter said.

A sale would mark a significant policy shift, potentially altering the military balance in the Middle East and testing Washington's definition of maintaining Israel's "qualitative military edge."

Saudi Arabia made a direct appeal earlier this year to US President Donald Trump and has long been interested in Lockheed Martin's fighter,

Trump And Modi Keep Hotline Buzzing As Trade Talks Gain Momentum

US: US President Donald Trump often speaks with Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi and trade teams from both countries continue to hold talks, the White House said on Tuesday.

"The president and his trade team continue to be in very serious discussions with India," White House spokeswoman Karoline Leavitt told reporters. "I know the president has great respect for Prime Minister Modi, and they speak pretty frequently."

Trump said last week in South Korea that he wanted to reach a trade deal with India—signalling a thaw in



relations that soured to their lowest point in decades after the US president doubled tariffs on Indian imports to 50% as punishment for India's purchases of Russian oil.

Indian refiners cut Russian oil imports after Washington imposed sanctions last week on Moscow's top two crude exporters, Rosneft and Lukoil.—RT/Agency

Speaker Gears Up To Rally Parliamentary Leaders For 27th Amendment Backing

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has given task to the Speaker National Assembly Ayaz Sadiq to create consensus for the smooth passage of the 27th constitutional amendment from the parliament.

Speaker has summoned a session of all parliamentary leaders today at 4:00 PM.

The 27th constitutional amendment's bill will be tabled in the Senate on Friday and will be sent to the Senate Committee for review on the same day.

The PTI and the JUI-F have also been invited for the session.

The allied parties' chief whips and parliamentary leaders have been invited in the meeting.

The session will discuss



and devise the strategy for the passage of the constitutional amendment's bill.

The features of the proposed amendment bill will be shared with the participants, and the speaker will request all political parties to support the amendment, sources said.

Speaker Ayaz Sadiq will also hold separate meetings with parliamentary leaders. "If the consensus not reached, the

government would rely over its parliamentary strength," according to sources.

Ruling PML-N has asked its coalition partners' members to reach Islamabad immediately.

Sources said that the ruling coalition enjoying 224 members support needed for the passage of the constitutional amendment bill.—RT/Agency

Trump Blames GOP Election Losses On 'Record-Breaking' Government Shutdown

US: US President Donald Trump on Tuesday acknowledged that Democrats' sweeping electoral gains signalled mounting trouble for Republicans, calling the results "not good" and linking the setbacks to the record-long federal government shutdown, now stretching into its sixth week.

His remarks came hours after Democratic candidates Abigail Spanberger and Mikie Sherrill scored commanding gubernatorial wins in Virginia and New Jersey, while Zohran Mamdani easily defeated Trump-backed



the outcome, saying it had not been a positive night for anyone.

The US president said: "We had an interesting evening, and we learned a lot, and we're going to talk about that," CNBC reported.

He attributed the Republican setbacks partly to the prolonged government shutdown, citing pollsters who found it "a big factor, negative for the Republicans". Trump added that some analysts viewed his absence from the ballot as the biggest factor.—RT/Agency

Islamabad Court Issues Non-Bailable Arrest Warrants For Imaan Mazari And Husband

ISLAMABAD: An Islamabad court has issued non-bailable arrest warrants for human rights activist and lawyer Imaan Zainab Mazari-Hazir and her husband, Advocate Hadi Ali Chattha, in a case concerning controversial social media posts.

The National Cybercrime Investigation Agency registered the case, alleging the couple attempted to incite linguistic divisions and create the impression that the armed forces were engaged

in terrorism within the country.

The hearing was presided over by Additional District and Sessions Judge (ADSJ) Muhammad Afzal Majoka, who had indicted both Mazari and Chattha last week.—RT/Agency

The results of the 2025 off-year elections have signaled nothing short of a seismic shift in American politics — one that promises to move the nation beyond the chaos, division, and personality-driven politics of the Trump era. From New York to California, and across Virginia and New Jersey, voters resoundingly chose pragmatism, progress, and renewal over polarization and fatigue.

Pakistan's newly appointed one-day international (ODI) captain Shaheen Afridi and star batter Babar Azam have fallen in the latest ICC rankings of the 50-over format, while several other national players have made notable advancements.

In the batting rankings, Babar Azam dropped one position to fifth, holding 728 rating points. Meanwhile, wicketkeeper-batter Mohammad Rizwan and opener Fakhar Zaman each gained a spot, now positioned at 23rd and 26th, respectively.

Middle-order batsman Salman Ali Agha jumped nine places to 30th with 569 points after his pivotal performance against South Africa in the series opener.

In the bowling charts, Pakistan's Shaheen Afridi slipped one place to 15th with 587 points, while fellow pacer Naseem Shah surged 10 positions to 33rd with 524 points.—Agency

Mohammad Ashraful Returns to Spotlight with Key Role in Bangladesh Cricket Setup

DHAKA: Former Bangladesh captain Mohammad Ashraful has been appointed as the national team's new assistant coach, replacing Mohammad Salahuddin.

Ashraful, who remains one of Bangladesh's most iconic cricketers, etched his name into history when he led the Tigers to a stunning upset victory over Australia in 2005 at just 20 years of age.

That memorable century was among the highlights of a career that spanned 177 ODIs, where he scored 3,468 runs, the fifth-highest tally for Bangladesh.

He also featured in 61 Tests, becoming the youngest player to score a Test century, and played 23 T20Is. Ashraful continued to compete in domestic cricket until as recently as two years ago.

Salahuddin, who took up the assistant coach role in



November 2024 to support head coach Phil Simmons, had been in charge of the batting unit.

With nearly three decades of coaching experience across various levels in Bangladesh, he was credited with nurturing many of the country's current stars.

However, a difficult 2025 campaign, marked by T20I series losses to the UAE, Pakistan, and West Indies, ODI defeats to Afghanistan and Sri Lanka, and Test losses against Sri Lanka and Zimbabwe, intensified scrutiny on the team's performance and management.

In July, Salahuddin publicly addressed speculation about player dissatisfaction, saying, "After coaching for 27-28 years,

I am hearing there are lots of complaints in the team against me. I would really like to know about those complaints, best if it was given to me in writing."

Ashraful's own journey has seen both triumphs and challenges. In 2013, he was handed a lengthy ban from all Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) related activities for match-fixing in the Bangladesh Premier League.

After serving his suspension, he was reinstated in 2016 and has since transitioned into coaching.

Just last month, Ashraful criticised the lack of consistency among Bangladesh's top-order batters, a concern he will now have the opportunity to address directly in his new role.—Agency

Top Pakistan Test Star Hints at Shocking Retirement After High-Level PCB Talks

Veteran Pakistan leg-spinner Yasir Shah has hinted that his illustrious cricket career may be nearing its end, revealing that he is contemplating retirement following discussions with the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB).

In a recent interview with a local news outlet, the 39-year-old confirmed that he has opted out of domestic cricket this season, suggesting that a formal announcement regarding his future could be imminent.

"I am not playing domestic cricket this year. God willing, I will finalise my decision after meeting with the PCB," Yasir said.

One of Pakistan's most successful Test bowlers of the modern era, Yasir represented the country in 48 Tests, claiming 244 wickets at an average of 31.38.

His dominance in UAE



conditions, where Pakistan played their home Tests for nearly a decade, was particularly noteworthy as he claimed 116 wickets at an impressive average of 24.56.

The veteran last represented Pakistan in a Test match in 2022 against Sri Lanka in Galle and made his final ODI appearance in 2019 against England in Southampton.

Yasir also holds the prestigious record of being the fastest bowler to reach 200 Test wickets, achieving the feat in just 33 matches.

Reflecting on the current national team, the seasoned spinner expressed satisfaction with Pakistan's recent performances. "The Pakistan team is doing well. They have won their last two T20 matches. Our prayers are always with them," he stated.

When asked about Mohammad Rizwan's recent removal from the ODI captaincy and earlier exclusion from the T20 squad, Yasir responded with empathy, relating it to his own experiences of being sidelined despite strong performances.

"Our effort as players is always to perform for Pakistan. Rizwan is doing that as well. Whichever player the selectors choose as captain, the entire team supports him," he remarked.

The veteran further addressed his absence from the national setup, suggesting that his exclusion was not due to poor performance. "Sometimes these things happen. My performances were good. Earlier, I had a knee injury, and they assumed it had returned. I told them that if fitness was the issue, they should conduct a fitness test. But no such reason was officially given," Yasir explained.—Agency

Shane Bieber Reportedly Staying with Toronto Blue Jays for 2026 Season

TORONTO: Right-handed pitcher Shane Bieber has decided to remain with the Toronto Blue Jays, exercising his \$16 million player option for the 2026 season instead of testing free agency, international media reported.

Although Bieber could likely have secured a bigger contract on the open market, he chose to return to Toronto to build on the team's recent success after narrowly missing out on a World Series championship.

The American originally signed a two-year, \$26 million deal with the Cleveland Guardians last winter.

While recovering from elbow surgery, he was nearing a return to Cleveland



after four Minor League rehab starts when the Guardians traded him to Toronto at the deadline in exchange for pitching prospect Khal Stephen.

The 30-year-old made seven regular-season starts for the Blue Jays in 2025, posting a 3.57 ERA, and added five postseason appearances, including a victory in Game 4 of the World Series against the Los Angeles Dodgers.

Bieber's performance resembled his previous seven seasons with Cleveland, showing a slight increase in fastball velocity, averaging 92.7 mph, nearly back to his 2021 level of 92.9 mph.

Over his career, the two-time All-Star holds a 66-34 record in 141 starts, along with a 3.24 ERA and 995 strikeouts.

He also captured the Cy Young Award during the shortened 2020 season, finishing 8-1 with a 1.63 ERA and an AL-leading 122 strikeouts.

With Max Scherzer and Chris Bassitt both entering free agency after the 2025 campaign, Bieber's return provides much-needed stability for Toronto's rotation.—Agency

Swiatek and Anisimova Set for High-Stakes WTA Finals Clash of Champions



RIYADH: Iga Swiatek and Amanda Anisimova are set for a must-win clash at the WTA Finals on Wednesday, with a semi-final berth at stake following early defeats to Elena Rybakina in the Serena Williams group.

The winner of this high-stakes encounter will join Rybakina in the final four.

Both players enter the match under pressure, as Rybakina's victories over each have left no margin for error in the round-robin stage.

Earlier in the tournament, Rybakina defeated Anisimova 4-6, 6-3, 6-2 in the opening round, before dismantling Swiatek 6-3, 1-6, 6-0.

The upcoming contest is expected to be tense, with the opening set likely to play a decisive role in shaping momentum.

Statistically, Swiatek holds a significant edge in such situations — a 54-2 record this season when winning the first set.

Conversely, Anisimova has found it difficult to mount comebacks, managing just a 3-20 record after losing the opener.

Meanwhile, in the Stefanie Graf group, the semi-final picture remains unclear, though Aryna Sabalenka leads her pool after back-to-back victories.

Rybakina currently tops the Serena Williams group and awaits the winner of Swiatek versus Anisimova in the semi-finals. The victor will then face the second-placed player from the Graf group for a place in the final.—Agency

Sharjeel Rolls Out 14,000-Acre Farmer Aid Plan — Promises Prosperity and Rule of Law



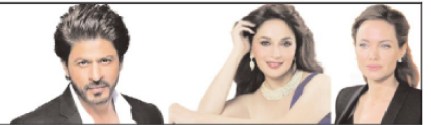

Pakistan Navy Closely Watching Regional Developments, Says Vice Admiral Raja Rab Nawaz

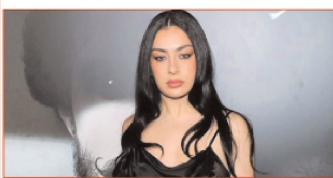

In Christy, Sydney Sweeney has given herself entirely to the role. As she now reveals, she was so committed that the fights in the scene she had were real.

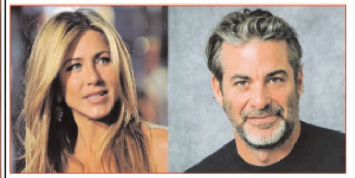

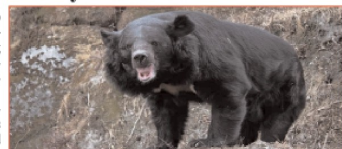

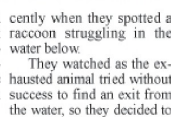
sett. The book had been checked out from the Camden Public Library and had a due date of Aug. 10, 1979.

Official figures indicate that seven patients have died from dengue in November alone, with five deaths in Hyderabad, one in Tando Allahyar, and one in Karachi's Kemari district.

Sindh Health Secretary Rehan Baloch stated that

many of the deceased patients had pre-existing serious medical conditions, which contributed to their health. Authorities continue to urge the public to take preventive measures against dengue to curb further spread. —RT/Agency

Sindh Rangers Nab Three Suspects During Karachi Raids

KARACHI: Sindh Rangers, as Abid Sajjad, Shaukat, and Ahmed Shah alias Battery, carried out operations in various areas of Karachi and arrested three suspects allegedly involved in drug trafficking and multiple robbery cases.

According to a Rangers spokesperson, the arrested

suspects have been identified as Abid Sajjad, Shaukat, and Ahmed Shah alias Battery. The officials recovered a pistol, 500 grams of hashish, 105 bags of betel nut, 60 bags of mawa, 55 kilograms of copper, and Rs382,140 in cash from their possession.

The spokesperson said that Abid Sajjad was involved in several motorcycle

theft incidents and is a close associate of street criminal Asad alias Torture. Ahmed Shah alias Battery, along with an accomplice named Sakhi Rehman in Wahid Colony, Nazimabad, was reportedly involved in drug dealing, stolen mobile trade, and multiple robberies. —RT/Agency

Deadly Gas Cylinder Blast in Korangi Leaves One Dead, One Injured

KARACHI: One person was killed and another injured after an explosion occurred at a gas cylinder shop near Coast Guard Chowrangi in Korangi on Tuesday.

According to rescue officials, the deceased and in-

jured were immediately shifted to a nearby hospital for medical treatment. Police said that upon receiving information, a team reached the site and cordoned off the area.

Initial investigations suggest that the explosion was caused by a gas leak or a cylinder blast. Further inquiries are underway to determine the exact cause of the incident. —RT/Agency

FIA Refutes Reports of Travel Ban at Karachi Airport

KARACHI: The Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) Immigration on Wednesday denied reports of a travel ban at Karachi airport, clarifying that passengers from all provinces were travelling without hindrance.

The agency "rejects such claims as no such ban is in

place," said a spokesperson in Karachi, rejecting claims of discrimination against passengers from Punjab and other provinces.

The spokesperson explained that immigration checks and profiling had been made more effective than in specific cases. "This

step has been taken purely to protect innocent citizens from the agent mafia," the official stated.

The officials detailed that agent mafia used to misguide people to travel to a foreign country and then board them on ships. —RT/Agency

PPP Raises Red Flags Over 27th Amendment's NFC And Autonomy Clauses

KARACHI: The Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) has raised serious objections to several clauses of the proposed 27th Constitutional Amendment, particularly those concerning the National Finance Commission (NFC) Award and provincial autonomy, sources said on Wednesday.

According to party insiders, the PPP has begun internal consultations, with its constitutional experts reviewing the proposed amendment in detail.

The party has expressed strong reservations over provisions related to the NFC Award, education, and population planning—subjects it considers core provincial do-



main protected under the 18th Amendment.

Sources said the PPP has decided to take a firm stance on any move perceived as an attempt to roll back or dilute the 18th Amendment, which devolved major administrative and financial powers to the provinces.

Constitutional experts

have advised the party leadership to adopt a clear and principled position against clauses that could undermine provincial rights. The leadership is also seeking input from parliamentarians on proposed changes affecting provincial authority and fiscal independence.

Sources confirm that PPP

has categorically decided not to compromise on any clause that could weaken or reverse the 18th Amendment. However, the party may support other clauses of the 27th Amendment deemed to be in the national interest.

Sources added that the federal government aims to revise frameworks related to financial distribution, education, and population planning, which directly overlap with areas devolved to the provinces under the 18th Amendment.

The PPP plans to oppose any attempt to reclaim these subjects, especially in the domains of health, education, and resource allocation.

Final approval of the

PPP's stance will be taken from the Central Executive Committee (CEC) after the constitutional committee finalizes its draft response. The party leadership will then present its formal position in Parliament and discuss it with coalition partners.

Earlier discussions on the 27th Amendment reportedly included proposals for establishing a Constitutional Court, reinstating executive magistrates, and granting new judicial transfer authorities.

The PPP has already cautioned that any reduction in provincial autonomy or alteration of the NFC Award formula would be unacceptable.—RT/Agency

Defence Minister Confirms Delegation's Departure For Istanbul Talks With Afghan Taliban

ISLAMABAD: Defence Minister Khawaja Asif on Wednesday confirmed that Pakistan's delegation had departed for tomorrow's talks with the Afghan Taliban in Istanbul to find a solution to the current tensions between the two neighbours.

A second round of discussions between Pakistani and Afghan Taliban delegations had begun in Istanbul on October 25, following days of border hostilities, but Islamabad's long-standing concern over terror attacks emanating from Kabul remained a major point of contention, resulting in a stalemate. A breakthrough came after Turkey and Qatar salvaged the dialogue process for the second time in less than a week, following Pakistan's announcement on Oct 29 that the talks had "failed" and that its negotiators were preparing to return home.

The talks produced a



three-point understanding — the continuation of the ceasefire, the establishment of a monitoring and verification mechanism to ensure peace, and penalties for violations.

The operational details of that mechanism are expected to be finalised when the "principals", senior representatives from both sides, meet again in Istanbul on November 6.

Talking to the media outside Parliament today, Asif said: "The delegation has gone today and the negotiations will begin tomorrow morning. Let's hope Afghanistan makes use of wisdom and peace is restored in the region."

He said Pakistan had a single-point agenda, Afghanistan clampdowns on attacks on the former from the latter's soil.

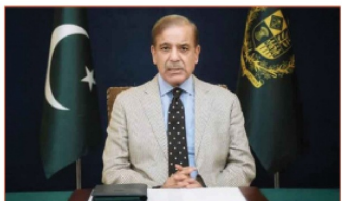
Questioned on whether there was hope of a positive development, Asif said talks were only engaged in if there was a possibility of progress; otherwise, it was a waste of time.—RT/Agency

PM Shehbaz Halts Ministers' Foreign Trips To Build Consensus On 27th Amendment

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has cancelled all official visits of ministers and members of parliament in light of the proposed 27th Constitutional Amendment.

According to sources, the prime minister has directed all ministers and lawmakers to remain in Islamabad. He has also assigned National Assembly speaker, Sardar Ayaz Sadiq, a key task of building consensus among all political parties on the amendment.

Sources further revealed that the Speaker has convened a meeting of all parliamentary leaders today (Wednesday) at 4 p.m. in the Speaker's Lounge. Parliamentary leaders from major parties, including Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) and Jamiat Ulama-e-Islam (F),



along with chief whips of allied parties, have been invited to attend.

During the meeting, a briefing on the features of the constitutional amendment will be given, and the government's strategy for its approval will be finalized. Speaker Ayaz Sadiq is expected to urge all political parties to support the amendment and will also hold separate meetings with parliamentary leaders in his chamber.

Sources added that if consensus is not achieved, the government will rely on its own numerical strength in the National Assembly. The Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) has instructed all its members and those of allied parties to reach Islamabad immediately.—RT/Agency

Finance Minister Unveils Bold Plan To Privatize 24 State-Owned Enterprises

KARACHI: Federal Minister for Finance Muhammad Aurangzeb has announced that the government has decided to privatize 24 state-owned enterprises, with the privatization of Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) expected to be completed before the end of this year.

Addressing the Future Summit in Karachi, the finance minister emphasized the crucial role of the private sector in driving economic growth, stating that Pakistan's economy is moving in the right direction. He noted that corporate profits in the country have increased by 9 percent, reflecting growing economic stability.

Aurangzeb added that the government will continue to create a strong ecosystem to capitalize on global diplomatic successes. He further revealed that Google plans to develop Pakistan into an export hub, while the government's focus will remain on the IT and maritime sectors to boost sustainable economic growth.—RT/Agency

Pakistan Unveils Drone-Jamming Gun To Counter Cross-Border Terror Threats

KARACHI: Pakistan has developed a countermeasure to cross-border suicide drones: the Sufru drone jamming gun, which officials say can disable kamikaze drones and their controllers at 1.5 kilometres.

"The gun can be installed along national borders and deployed at major public events in cities," Hamza Khalid said at the Maritime Expo in Karachi on Wednesday.

The device, produced at the National Electronics Complex, was displayed on the opening day of the Karachi Maritime Expo, where demonstrators said it successfully began neutralising so-called kamikaze drones.

Khalid, manager of the company that manufactures the anti-drone jammer, described the system's operational parameters.

He said the gun is deployed effectively within a 30-degree angle and a range of 1.5



kilometres, with the angle adjustable to suit tactical requirements.

Within that envelope, the Sufru gun can either seize control of an incoming drone and force it to land, or render both the drone and its remote control inoperable, he added.

Asked about saturation attacks, Khalid told reporters the system had been designed to cope with multiple incoming drones. "No matter how many hostile drones arrive, the gun has the capability to neutralise them."

Officials suggested the system could be installed along border areas to counter cross-border threats and deployed at large urban gatherings where security risks are elevated.—RT/Agency

Putin Orders Blueprint For Potential Russian Nuclear Test

MOSCOW: Russian President Vladimir Putin ordered his top officials on Wednesday to draft proposals for a possible test of nuclear weapons, something Moscow has not done since the 1991 collapse of the Soviet Union.

The order — responding to President Donald Trump's announcement last week that the United States would resume testing — was a further signal that the two countries with the world's largest nuclear arsenals are rapidly nearing a step that could sharply escalate geopolitical tensions.

"I am instructing the Foreign Ministry, the Defence Ministry, the special services and relevant civilian agencies to do everything possible to collect additional information on the issue, analyse it at the Security

Council and make agreed proposals on the possible start of work on the preparation of nuclear weapons tests," Putin said in televised remarks.

Russia-US relations have deteriorated sharply in the past few weeks as Trump, frustrated with a lack of progress towards ending the war in Ukraine, has cancelled a planned summit with Putin and imposed sanctions on Russia for the first time since returning to the White House in January.

Putin issued his instruction at a meeting of his Security Council, where parliamentary speaker Vyacheslav Volodin departed from the official agenda of transport safety to ask how Moscow would respond to Trump's plans to carry out US nuclear testing for the first time in 33 years.—RT/Agency

PTI Vows To Fight 27th Amendment, Calls It A 'Provincial Power Grab'

KP: Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Sohail Afridi said on Wednesday that the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) would strongly oppose the proposed 27th Constitutional Amendment, terming it an attempt to undermine provincial autonomy guaranteed under the 18th Amendment.

"Any move weakening the democratic mandate of the provinces will be resisted," the provincial chief executive said while speaking to journalists outside Parliament House after attending a parliamentary party meeting.

The ruling Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) is now seeking a broad political agreement on the proposed constitutional tweaks for establishing a Constitutional Court, and making certain changes to the National Finance Commission (NFC) Award.



This tweak also sought to amend Article 243 — which pertains to the supreme command of the armed forces — as well as several other constitutional adjustments, according to Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari.

Other proposals included the introduction of executive magistrates, provisions for the transfer of judges, and the removal of protections related to provincial shares in the NFC Award.

Deputy Prime Minister Senator Ishaq Dar said on Tuesday that the government was currently in discussion with its major coalition partner, the PPP, and would also take other allied parties — including the Muttahida Qaumi Movement-Pakistan (MQM-P), the Awami National Party (ANP), and the Balochistan Awami Party (BAP) — into confidence before finalising the draft.—RT/Agency

Zohran Mamdani Makes History As New York City's First Muslim Mayor After Meteoric Rise

NEW YORK: Zohran Mamdani, a 34-year-old democratic socialist, won the New York City mayoral race on Tuesday, capping a meteoric rise from a little-known state lawmaker to one of the country's most visible Democratic figures.

Mamdani will become the first Muslim mayor of the largest US city. He defeated Democratic former Governor Andrew Cuomo, 67, who ran as an independent after losing the nomination to Mamdani in the primary election.

The campaign served as an ideological and generational contest that could have national implications for the Democratic Party.



In Virginia, Democrat Abigail Spanberger easily won the election for governor, becoming the first woman elected to serve in that role. And in New Jersey, Democrat Mikie Sherrill won the governor's race.

The trio of races offered the beleaguered Democratic Party a test of differing campaign playbooks a year ahead of the 2026 midterm elections, when control of Congress will be at stake. Since President Donald Trump's win last year, Democrats have found themselves locked out of power in Washington and struggling to find the best path out of the political wilderness.—RT/Agency

Trump Heads To Miami To Unveil Economic Vision On Election Anniversary

WASHINGTON: President Donald Trump is heading to Miami on Wednesday — the anniversary of his reelection to a second term — to speak to a forum of business leaders and global athletes about what he sees as his economic achievements.

The Republican president's speech to the American Business Forum will be a broad look at his economic agenda and how investments he has secured abroad help U.S. communities, according to a senior White House official. It's a significant effort from Trump to put a positive spin on the economy at a time when Americans remain uneasy about the state of their finances and the cost of living — and when major campaigns in Tuesday's election were centered on affordability and the economy.

The AP Voter Poll survey, which included more than 17,000 voters in New Jersey, Virginia, California and New York City, suggested the pub-



lic was troubled by higher prices and fewer job opportunities despite Trump's promises to tame inflation and unleash growth.

In his speech, Trump will touch on deregulation, energy independence and oil prices, and affordability, said the White House official, who insisted on anonymity to preview the president's address. Trump spent five days in Asia last week with stops in Malaysia, Japan and South Korea. He worked to ease trade tensions with Beijing in a meeting with Chinese leader Xi Jinping. In Tokyo,

he promoted several major energy and tech projects for the U.S. that will be funded by Japan.

Miami Mayor Francis Suarez said he thinks Trump's recent travels "have been transformational in his presidency" and said his speech will be a highlight of the forum, which organizers have described as a more accessible version of the World Economic Forum in Davos, Switzerland, or the Milken Institute Global Conference, which gathers the world's elite for discussions on the economy.—RT/Agency

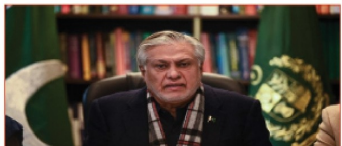
Dar Slams 'Cup Of Tea' Policy, Says It Cost Pakistan Dearly At The Border

ISLAMABAD: Deputy Prime Minister-cum-Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar on Tuesday said that a "cup of tea" cost Pakistan immensely when the then-government opened the border to Afghanistan.

Addressing the Senate session, the DPM said that under the guise of that "cup of tea," the previous government had opened Pakistan's border with Afghanistan.

Ishaq Dar continued to criticize the former PTI government without naming it, stating that as many as 100 hardened criminals were also released.

He informed the house that he had received six telephone calls from his Afghan counterpart, Amir Khan Muttaqi.



Dar registered Pakistan's complaint, demanding one thing: "no terrorist activities be launched from their soil."

He expressed that, as a person who supports the Islamic country, he has been disappointed by this act (terrorism) originating from Afghanistan.

On a positive note, he expressed optimism that the process will move forward when the two sides meet again in Istanbul on November 6.

He said recent dialogues with Afghanistan's interim government, held in Turkey and Qatar, focused on engaging Afghan authorities to curb cross-border militancy.

He noted that militant groups such as Fatah al-Khawarij, Tehrik-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP), and Fatah al-Hindus-tan BLA are operating from Afghan soil and conducting terrorist activities against Pakistan.—RT/Agency

PIA Chaos Deepens As Engineers' Protest Grounds Flights For Second Day

KARACHI: The Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) aircraft engineers' protest has entered its second day, as dozens of flights in Karachi were delayed on Tuesday, with several cancelled outright, leaving scores of passengers stranded.

A dispute between Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) management and its aircraft engineers has brought flight operations to a near standstill, as engineers stopped issuing safety clearances, leaving several aircraft parked on the ground and passengers stranded across major airports.

Sources said the protest has thrown the schedule into disarray. After about 8pm on Monday, none of PIA's inter-



national flights managed to take off, and dozens of domestic and outbound services have since been delayed or cancelled.

The airline's management has begun taking disciplinary action against the engineers, reporting, for duty and clearing only the aircraft they believe are fit to fly.—RT/Agency
