Joint Parliamentary Committee Clears Path for 27th Constitutional Amendment Draft

ISLAMABAD: The joint committee comprising legislators from the Senate and National Assembly's standing committees on law and justice has approved the complete draft of the proposed 27th constitutional amendment, sources told on Sunday.

The joint committee began its session earlier today, chaired by Senator Farooq H Naek and MNA Chaudhry Mahmood Bashir Virk.

However, Opposition parties, including Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), Jamaat Ulema-e-Islam-Fazl (JUI-F), Pakhtunkhwa Milli Awami Party (PkMAP), and Majlis-e-Wahdatul-Muslimeen (MWM), boycotted the session as their members did not turn up for the meeting.

In fresh development, the committee granted clause-by-clause approval to 49 proposed amendments.

The draft of the 27th Constitutional Amendment, al-



ready approved by the cabinet, will be presented in the house tomorrow (Monday), the sources confirmed.

The tweaks proposed by the coalition parties will be considered in a meeting scheduled for tomorrow, the sources said.

The Awami National Party (ANP) raised objections to the 27th Constitutional Amendment and declined to attend the prime minister's dinner, it was learnt.

However, the federal government contacted the ANP

leadership and assured to address its reservations besides requesting the party's legislators to attend the PM-hosted dinner.

The sources said that ANP Senators Arbab Umar Farooq and Haji Hidayatullah will attend the event.

Prior to this development, approval for Article 243 was granted after detailed consultations by the joint parliamentary committee, the sources said, marking a key step in advancing the constitutional tweaks.

Currently, Article 243 of

the Constitution entrusts the President of Pakistan with the supreme command of the armed forces, while stipulating that their control and command shall rest with the federal government.

The federal government, a day earlier, presented a bill of the 27th Constitutional Amendment — proposing sweeping changes to the country's judicial system as well as the military command structure — in the Senate.

"The committees have completed deliberations on

the majority of the clauses of the draft, including Article 243, which was approved after extensive review," sources familiar with the proceedings revealed.

The government has requested extra time to review proposals regarding renaming Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and increasing provincial assembly seats in Balochistan.

"Both proposals will undergo further consideration, and final decisions are expected tomorrow," the sources added. The consultations are a pre-requisite step, needed to be taken before finally presenting the 27th Amendment's draft for approval in the Parliament.

After the conclusion of the session, Senator Naek confirmed that the committee gave approval to the basic draft of the constitutional amendment, adding that he and the law minister have been given powers by the members for some tweaks.—RT/Agency

KP CM Sohail Afridi Booked Under PECA for Anti-State Remarks in Explosive Case

ISLAMABAD: A case has been registered against Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Sohail Afridi under the Pakistan Electronic Crimes Act (Peca) after his videos circulated on social media allegedly tarnishing the reputation of state and national security institutions.

The First Information Report (FIR), a copy of which is available to

media with the intention to incite violence, create racial hatred, panic, fear, and disorder among the general public, along with promoting anti-state sentiments, which are detrimental to the security, integrity, and stability of Pakistan."

It further stated that after the registration of the case, the investigation was entrusted to NCCIA's SI Waseem Khan.

On Friday, Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi condemned KP CM Afridi's recent criticism of the security forces, saying he had crossed all limits of ingratitude in a province where the highest number of soldiers had embraced martyrdom.

In his forceful response, the interior minister asserted



that such comments about the "brave sons of Pakistan" were "intolerable, baseless, and factually incorrect."

"No patriotic person can make such a statement about the courageous officers and soldiers who have sacrificed their lives for the nation," Naqvi stated.

He said the chief minister's remarks were an attempt to appease the "eternal enemy."

Naqvi highlighted the acknowledged services and sacrifices of the armed forces, noting: "The entire nation and the world recognise the unmatched sacrifices of our security forces. The officers and soldiers of the security forces have nurtured peace with their precious lives."—RT/Agency

Pakistan Blasts Taliban for Empty Promises, Demands Real Action Against Terror Networks

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan on Sunday castigated the Afghan Taliban regime for using the Istanbul talks to malign Pakistan rather than address Islamabad's core concern of terrorism emanating from Afghan soil.

"Instead of finding solutions to address Pakistan's core concern, the Afghan regime used the opportunity to malign Pakistan through hypothetical accusations and jingoistic rhetoric," Foreign Office spokesperson Tahir Hussain Andrabi said in a statement.

The peace talks between the Afghan regime and Pakistan broke down, although a ceasefire continues between the South Asian neighbours.

On November 7, Defence Minister Khawaja Asif told Geo News that the negotiations have been suspended, with "no programme for the fourth round of talks." "There is a complete deadlock. The negoti-



ations have entered an indefinite phase."

In his statement, the FO spokesperson noted that anyone following the talks held under the mediation of Turkey and Qatar could easily "discern that the Taliban regime was only interested in prolonging the temporary ceasefire, but without taking concrete and verifiable actions against the terrorist elements present on Afghan soil."

"It prolonged discussions and engaged in futile arguments to stonewall the efforts at

reaching any concrete understanding," the spokesperson added.

The statement recalled a sharp surge in terrorist attacks from Afghanistan since the Taliban took power in August 2021, adding that Pakistan, despite military and civilian casualties, had exercised maximum restraint and avoided retaliation. "Pakistan's expectation was that the Taliban regime would control TTP/FaK and BLA/FaH elements and take concrete actions against them."—RT/Agency

Shehbaz Rejects Move for PM's Immunity, Orders Immediate Withdrawal from Amendment



ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Sunday directed the withdrawal of an amendment submitted by some Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) senators proposing immunity for the prime minister.

The federal government, a day earlier, presented a bill of the 27th Constitutional Amendment — proposing sweeping changes to the country's judicial system as well as the military command structure — in the Senate. The bill was introduced in the upper house and then referred to the Standing Committee on Law and Justice after the cabinet, chaired by PM Shehbaz, virtually from Azerbaijan, approved the 27th Constitutional Amendment draft. "On my return from Azerbaijan, I have learnt that

some senators belonging to our party have submitted an amendment regarding immunity for the Prime Minister," PM Shehbaz said in a statement on X. He clarified that while he acknowledged the intent behind the proposal as being made in good faith, it was not part of the Cabinet-approved draft. "I have instructed that it be withdrawn immediately," he stated.

"As a matter of principle, an elected Prime Minister must remain fully accountable, both before the court of law and the people," the two-time PM added. The amendment proposes the creation of a Federal Constitutional Court (FCC), revises judicial appointments and transfers, and alters the structure of military command.—RT/Agency

PTI Sounds Alarm in Senate: 27th Amendment Could Kill Pakistan's Constitution



ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) senators on Sunday voiced strong opposition to the proposed changes in the Constitution via the 27th Amendment.

Senate Chairperson Syed Yousaf Raza Gilani presided over today's proceedings, which were held to mull over the proposed constitutional tweaks.

Speaking on the floor of the House, PTI Senator Ali Zafar reaffirmed his party's strong opposition to the proposed amendment, warning that altering the Constitution was akin to "tampering with the foundation of a building."

He likened the nation to a building, saying the government's actions were "weakening its very foundation."

The PTI leader expressed dismay over the pace at which the government was pushing for the proposed amendment, saying that constitutional amendments took a long time even when the country was "under dictatorship."

Senator Zafar rejected the proposed amendment, which, according to him, was introduced by a parliament with no "genuine public support." "This so-called parliament does not have the authority to amend the Constitution," he said. The PTI leader criticised the proposed judicial reforms, warning they would reduce Supreme Court judges to the level of Supreme District and Sessions Court judges.—RT/Agency

Pakistan and Saudi Arabia Deepen Strategic Ties with New Defence Partnership Pledge



ISLAMABAD: Pakistan and Saudi Arabia have reaffirmed their commitment to strengthen defence cooperation and deepen bilateral ties, the military's media wing said on Sunday. According to the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR), the understanding was reached during a meeting between Chairman Joint Chiefs of Staff Committee (CJCS) General Sahir Shamshad Mirza and Chief of General Staff of the Saudi Armed Forces General Fayyadh bin Hamed Al-Ruwaili in Saudi Arabia.

Both sides discussed the regional and global security situation and explored ways

to boost defence collaboration. The two military leaders expressed their resolve to build on the long-standing brotherly relationship and expand the enduring defence partnership between the two countries. In recognition of his services in promoting strong Pakistan-Saudi Arabia military relations, General Sahir Shamshad Mirza was awarded the "King Abdulaziz Medal of Honour of the Excellent Class." The Saudi military leadership also praised the professionalism of Pakistan's armed forces and acknowledged their sacrifices in the fight against terrorism.—RT/Agency

TTAP Launches National Movement to Block 27th Amendment in Parliament Showdown

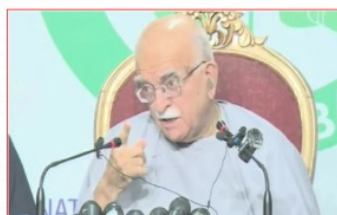
ISLAMABAD: Tehreek Tahafuz-e-Ayeen-Pakistan Chairman Mahmood Khan Achakzai on Sunday announced the launch of a movement and declared that parliament would not be allowed to function.

"The movement begins from 8:30 tonight, we will raise our slogan — 'Aise dastoor ko hum nahi mante' (we do not accept such a constitution)," Achakzai said in a presser in Islamabad.

He said that a group has "taken control" of Pakistan without holding elections, adding that the movement — the PTI was seeking — would begin today.

"An attack has been carried out on the very foundations of Pakistan — this too is a 9/11," the TTAP chief added. Achakzai said that their struggle is not based on personal enmity with anyone, but for the "protection" of the constitution and democratic values.

Mustafa Nawaz Khokhar, Awaam Pakistan and TTAP leader, said the 27th Constitutional Amend-



ment was drafted considering the "interests and disadvantages" of certain individuals. "The constitution has nothing to do with personalities; the elite are amending it to protect their own interests," Khokhar added.

For his part, Majlis Wahdat-e-Muslimeen and TTAP leader Raja Nasir Abbas said the parliament and judiciary have been "destroyed," accusing the rulers of driving the country toward destruction.

He said that the opposition alliance would go to any extent to block the amendment, saying, "We will raise this slogan across the world today."

Meanwhile, in its statement, the opposition alliance led by PkMAP president Achakzai, also announced that a national consultative conference will be held in Islamabad this week, inviting representatives from all walks of life to participate. The TTAP, whose chairman is Achakzai, said that a "black day" will be observed the day after the "fake approval" of the 27th Constitutional Amendment. The public has been urged to join the protest by wearing black armbands, while lawyers are asked to demonstrate in courts by wearing black bands.—RT/Agency

PPP Pushes Lifetime Immunity for President and NAB's Abolition in 27th Amendment Proposal

ISLAMABAD: During the recent discussions between the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) and Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) on the proposed 27th Constitutional Amendment, the PPP had come up with the demand for lifetime immunity for the president and abolition of the National Accountability Bureau. Article 248 of the Constitution pro-

vides the president with immunity from criminal proceedings during the term of office, stipulating that "no criminal proceedings whatsoever shall be instituted or continued against the president or a governor or any court during his term of office." The PPP, however, had sought to extend this protection beyond the term, proposing lifetime immunity. It

means if parliament approves it, no criminal proceedings, old or new, can continue against the president even after he leaves the office and during his lifetime. The bill had also demanded the abolition of NAB, an issue that was part of the Charter of Democracy (CoD) during the PPP and PML-N in 2006.—RT/Agency

Pakistan Railways Unveils Cutting-Edge AI Security System at Rawalpindi Station

RAWALPINDI: Pakistan Railways has installed its first-ever Artificial Intelligence (AI) security system at the Rawalpindi Railway Station to enhance passenger safety and surveillance. The advanced system comprises over 180 high-definition cameras that will monitor every corner of the station—including railway tracks, parking areas, ticket counters, and platforms—round the clock.



According to officials, the integrated system includes a centralized database capable of facial recognition and real-time tracking. Every individual entering the station will be scanned, and their facial data cross-checked with the central database to identify potential threats or suspicious activity.—RT/Agency

LAHORE: The Bureau of Aircraft Safety Investigation has released its final report on the January 17, 2025 incident involving a PIA flight from Dammam to Multan, which mistakenly landed on the wrong runway in Lahore.

The report holds the Lahore Control Tower, flight captain, first officer, Pakistan Airports Authority, and PIA management responsible. According to the findings, the captain had asked his co-pilot to feed the flight path, who entered

incorrect coordinates. Both pilots failed to cross-check the route, and despite realizing the error, Lahore ATC remained silent. The tower also failed to instruct the pilot to circle and attempt a proper landing.—RT/Agency

Punjab Chokes Under Relentless Smog as Lahore Battles Toxic Air Crisis

LAHORE: The smog crisis in Punjab shows no sign of easing, as the air quality in Lahore remains dangerously polluted.

The "City of Gardens" is once again blanketed in a thick haze, with air quality indices reaching alarming levels across multiple areas.

According to the latest data, Lahore's overall Air Quality Index (AQI) has been recorded at 275, placing it firmly in the "hazardous

category. Several neighborhoods reported even higher readings, including Ravi Road (302), Lower Mall (515), Iqbal Town (517), Sanda Road (497), FC College (466), and Saddar Cantonment (437). Other major cities in Punjab are also struggling—Faisalabad recorded an AQI of 410, while Multan reached 367.

Environmental experts have warned that the continuously rising pollution levels

pose serious health risks to residents. They have advised citizens to avoid unnecessary travel, wear protective masks outdoors, and refrain from outdoor activities, especially in the early morning hours.

Meanwhile, a grand anti-smog operation is underway across Punjab to curb air pollution. The Transport and Mass Transit Department remains active around the clock, targeting smoke-emitting vehicles.—RT/Agency

Opposition Bloc TTAP Rips Into Person-Specific Tweaks to Article 243

ISLAMABAD: Opposition alliance Tehreek Tahafuz Ayeen-i-Pakistan (TTAP) on Saturday rejected the proposed changes to Article 243 of the Constitution under the 27th Amendment, calling them "person-specific."

These remarks came a day after the controversial bill was tabled in the Senate and the subsequent announce-

ment of TTAP to launch a nationwide protest campaign.

TTAP leaders—including the alliance head Mahmood Khan Achakzai, Vice Chairman Mustafa Nawaz Khokhar, and MWM Chairman Senator Allama Raja Nasir Abbas—held a joint press conference in Islamabad to raise their objections.

Khokhar said the amendments violated the principle of separation of powers and the idea of a social contract. He criticised the proposed lifetime immunity for the president, terming it "person-specific" and disconnected from public concerns at a time when half of Pakistan is below the poverty line.—RT/Agency

Punjab Extends Section 144 Amid Worsening Pollution and Public Health Concerns

LAHORE: The Punjab Home Department has extended the enforcement of Section 144 across the province for another seven days, keeping restrictions in place until November 15. The official notification has been issued accordingly.

According to a spokesperson for the Home Department, all kinds of public gatherings, protests, rallies, sit-ins, and similar activities will remain banned during this period. Under Section 144, the assembly of four or more people in public places will not be allowed.

The spokesperson added that displaying weapons,

using loudspeakers (except for Azaan and Friday sermons), and spreading hate or sectarian material are strictly prohibited across the province. The extension has been made to maintain law and order and to protect lives and property.

The Punjab government took the decision in view of potential threats to public peace and the possibility of terrorist activities. However, the restrictions will not apply to weddings, funerals, or official duties performed by government officers and court proceedings.—RT/Agency

Shehbaz Sharif's Bold Rejection of PM Immunity is Very Welcoming

In a rare and refreshing moment for Pakistan's fragile democracy, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has decisively rejected any attempt to grant his office immunity under the proposed 27th Constitutional Amendment. This move, bold in both spirit and symbolism, has significantly elevated his stature as a leader who places principle above privilege.

At a time when public confidence in political accountability has been waning, the Prime Minister's decision sends a powerful message: no leader, however high his office, stands above the law. By withdrawing the controversial clause — which some senators had floated in apparent good faith — Shehbaz Sharif has demonstrated the ma-

turity and moral courage that true democratic



leadership demands. His statement that an elected leader "must remain fully accountable before the courts and the people" reaffirms the core democratic value of answerability, which many fear has been eroded in recent years.

This single act of restraint could well mark a turning point. It signals that Pakistan's leadership is ready to strengthen institutions, not shield individuals. In rejecting immunity, Shehbaz Sharif

has distanced himself from the culture of impunity that has too often undermined governance and public trust.

The timing, too, is crucial. With political tensions surrounding the 27th Amendment already high, the Prime Minister's directive injects a sense of integrity and balance into the process. It sets a valuable precedent — that constitutional reform must never become a tool for personal protection.

In essence, Shehbaz Sharif's decision is more than a withdrawal of a controversial proposal; it is a restoration of principle. And in that act, he may well have rekindled a long-lost faith in the democratic promise of accountability.

ICC narrows race to eight cities as India gears up for 2026 T20 World Cup



The Narendra Modi Stadium in Ahmedabad and the Eden Gardens in Kolkata have been shortlisted to host the semifinals of the T20 World Cup, scheduled for February–March next year.

According to Indian media, the International Cricket Council (ICC), in collaboration with the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) and Sri Lanka Cricket (SLC), has shortlisted eight venues for the tournament.

In India, matches will be held across five cities—Mumbai, Delhi, Chennai, Ahmedabad and Kolkata—while Sri Lanka will host games at three venues, including two stadiums in Colombo and one in Kandy.

The venue for the final is yet to be decided and will depend on the teams that reach the title clash, particularly whether Pakistan qualifies. Ahmedabad remains a potential host for the final if Pakistan does not make it to the final.

Regarding the semifinals, if Sri Lanka or Pakistan reaches the last four, that match will be staged in Colombo.

If neither team reaches the semifinals, both matches will take place in India. Should Pakistan reach the final, it will be played in Colombo. The ICC has kept these decisions flexible for now.

According to an ICC release on October 17, the 20-team tournament will follow the same format as the 2024 T20 World Cup in the USA and West Indies—Agency

Djokovic pulls shock exit from ATP Finals fresh off 101st career triumph

TURIN: Novak Djokovic, seven-time ATP Finals champion, has withdrawn from the season-ending tournament due to a shoulder injury, just hours after securing his 101st career title at the Hellenic Championship.

Djokovic defeated Lorenzo Musetti in a thrilling three-hour final, winning 4-6, 6-3, 7-5, but the Italian finalist will now take his place in Turin, where the ATP Finals begin on Sunday.

The Serbian star announced his withdrawal on social media, citing the injury. "I was really looking forward to competing in Turin and giving my best," Djokovic wrote.

"But after today's final in Athens, I'm sad to share that I need to withdraw due to an ongoing injury."

The 35-year-old who missed the end of last season due to injury, revealed that he had been managing the shoulder issue throughout the tournament in Athens.

Arsenal remain top of the table with 26 points, Chelsea sit second on 20, and Manchester City can all but guarantee the title if they defeat Liverpool on Sunday.

Promoted Sunderland are enjoying a dream start to the season, sitting fourth with 19 points.

After the match, Arsenal manager Mikel Arteta expressed his frustration over the goal conceded but also praised Sunderland for their determination.

Higgins demolishes Maguire to storm into International Championship final



NANJING: Scotland's John Higgins produced a vintage display to thrash compatriot Stephen Maguire 9-2 and advance to the final of the International Championship in Nanjing.

The 50-year-old four-time world champion set up a clash with home favourite Wu Yize in Sunday's title match, dominating from start to finish with a masterful all-round performance.

Higgins stormed through the opening session, winning six straight frames to take a commanding lead. Despite dropping the final two frames before the interval, he regained control in the evening session by winning three more frames with breaks



of 93 and 64 to seal the victory.

The world number six also registered impressive century breaks of 101 and 137, underlining his confidence and consistency throughout the encounter.

Higgins, who is bidding for his third ranking title of the season, will now face 22-year-old Wu in what promises to be a thrilling final.

Reflecting on his form and the upcoming challenge, Higgins said he expects Wu to be buoyed by the home crowd but hopes the occasion might bring some nerves for his young opponent.

"Wu is going to be on the crest of a wave, but I'm hoping he finds the nerves tomorrow because it's his first final in China," Higgins said.

Earlier this year, Higgins ended a four-year ranking title drought by winning the World Open in March, followed by victory at the Tour Championship in April. He credited the World Open triumph as a turning point that restored his confidence.

"It was pivotal to win the World Open," Higgins remarked. "It gave me that bit of self-belief in my game. It doesn't matter who you are—when you start losing that, the game becomes so difficult."

With momentum on his side, Higgins now looks to add another major trophy to his illustrious career when he faces Wu in the International Championship final.—Agency

Rybakina topples Sabalenka to capture her first-ever WTA Finals crown



RIYADH: Kazakhstan's Elena Rybakina capped off a flawless week at the WTA Finals with a commanding 6-3, 7-6(7-0) victory over world number one Aryna Sabalenka to claim her maiden season-ending championship and a record prize of \$5.235 million.

The WTA Finals featured four Grand Slam champions this year, but it was Rybakina, who had not advanced past a Grand Slam quarterfinal in 2025, who emerged as the surprise champion.

Her qualification came on the back of strong performances, including a title win in Ningbo and a semi-final run in Tokyo.

Rybakina's triumph also carried symbolic weight, as she earned 1,500 ranking points, her highest total to date.

This comes after she was denied points for her 2022 Wimbledon victory due to the ATP and WTA's sanctions against the tour-

nament for banning Russian and Belarusian players following Moscow's invasion of Ukraine.

Reflecting on her success, Rybakina described her week as "incredible" and credited her focus and resilience for the achievement.

"It's been an incredible week. I honestly didn't expect to go so far—it's just amazing," said Rybakina after lifting the Billie Jean King Trophy, her third title of the season.

She also praised Sabalenka for maintaining her position as the world's top-ranked player.

"Congratulations to Aryna for finishing the year as world number one for the second season in a row—what an amazing achievement. Today was such a tough battle; there were moments I didn't like, but that's tennis. I hope we'll play many more finals in big tournaments together," she added—Agency

fuddoula will officiate on-field alongside Faisal Afridi (ICC International Panel). Alexander Wharf will assume third umpire duties, with Asif Yaqoob as the fourth umpire.

In the third and final ODI on November 15, Alexander Wharf and Rashid Riaz will be the on-field umpires, while Saikat Sharfuddoula and Faisal Afridi will serve

as third and fourth umpires, respectively.

The series follows Pakistan's successful home campaign against South Africa, where the hosts won both the T20I and ODI series — clinching the latter 2-1 — while the Test series concluded in a 1-1 draw.

Overall, Pakistan and Sri Lanka have met 157 times in ODIs, with Pakistan winning

93 matches, Sri Lanka 59, four ending with no result, and one tied encounter.

After the ODI series, Zimbabwe will join Pakistan and Sri Lanka for a T20I tri-series, beginning on November 17.

The opening two matches will be played in Rawalpindi, before the action shifts to Lahore's Gaddafi Stadium for the remaining fixtures, including the final on November 29.

Lawyers Announce Protest Drive from November 14 Against 27th Amendment

The deadline for completing the pipeline installation under the project has been set for December 30.—RT/Agency

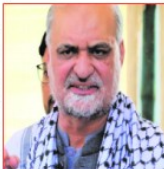

The Green Line BRT, while a start, covers only a small corridor, and its second phase has stalled due to

political conflicts between the Sindh government and Karachi Mayor Murtaza Wahab.

Feeder services are limited, and integration with other transit modes is poor. Weak traffic enforcement further exacerbates the issue, with lane indiscipline, illegal parking, and chaotic pedestrian movements causing bottlenecks.—RT

Hafiz Naeem Slams Lifetime Immunity for President as 'Un-Islamic Shame'

Al-Sharaa Poised to Make History as First Syrian President to Visit the White House

BEIRUT: Two decades ago, Ahmad al-Sharaa was held in a U.S.-run detention center in Iraq after joining al-Qaida militants fighting against American forces there.

Few would have predicted that he would go on to become the first Syrian president to visit Washington since the country's independence in 1946.

Since rebel forces he led ousted former Syrian President Bashar Assad last December, al-Sharaa — who cut ties with al-Qaida years earlier — has gone on a largely successful charm offensive to establish new ties with countries that had shunned Assad's government after its brutal crackdown on protesters in 2011 spiraled into a 14-year civil war.

Al-Sharaa met with U.S. President Donald Trump in Saudi Arabia in May, where



Trump announced that he would lift decades of sanctions.

The two men will meet again on Monday in Washington, where Syria is widely expected to officially join the U.S.-led coalition against the Islamic State group. Al-Sharaa arrived in the U.S. on Saturday ahead of the meeting, according to Syrian state media. Apart from that agreement, al-Sharaa will use the visit to push for a full removal of the remaining sanc-

tions imposed on his country.

Al-Sharaa's media adviser, Ahmad Zeidan, told the Saudi-owned Al Arabiya TV that the "foremost" issue on the president's agenda in Washington is to call for a repeal of the Caesar Act, which imposed sweeping sanctions over human rights abuses by Assad's government and security forces.

The Caesar sanctions are currently waived by presidential order, but a permanent repeal will require a congressional vote.

Days ahead of al-Sharaa's visit, Trump told reporters that he had moved to lift sanctions from Syria "to give them a fighting shot, and I think (al-Sharaa's) doing a very good job so far."

"It's a tough neighborhood and he's a tough guy, but I got along with him very well, and a lot of progress has been made with Syria," he said. On Thursday, the U.N. Security Council voted to lift sanctions from al-Sharaa and his interior minister, and the U.S. then removed them from its "specially designated global terrorist" list.

Meanwhile, senators have advanced a repeal of the Caesar Act through an annual defense authorization bill, but the final legislation is being negotiated with the House, where some top Republicans want to put conditions on it.

Rep. Brian Mast, the Republican chair of the House Foreign Affairs Committee, has expressed reservations about a full repeal. Sen. Lindsey Graham, a South Carolina Republican who is close to Trump, has also pushed for conditions on the repeal, including security and representation for religious and ethnic minorities, "maintaining peaceful relations with other states in the region, including the State of Israel," and removing foreign fighters from government and security institutions. Skeptics of al-Sharaa point to eruptions of sectarian violence over the past year during which pro-government Sunni gunmen killed hundreds of civilians from the Alawite and Druze religious minorities. Al-Sharaa has promised to hold perpetrators accountable, but minority communities remain wary. —RT/Agency

Mamdani's New York Triumph Exposes Deep Rifts in Jewish Democratic Politics

NEW YORK: Zohran Mamdani's election as New York's next mayor exposed a deepening rift between traditional Democratic Jewish voters and younger progressives — one that could reshape politics for years in the metropolitan area with the world's largest Jewish population outside Israel.



Mamdani, a 34-year-old democratic socialist, handily defeated Andrew Cuomo, the Democratic former governor of New York who ran as an independent, while beating back accusations of anti-Semitism over his support of Palestinians in the conflict in Gaza.

A Pew Research Center poll last year found that just half of Jewish Americans under 35 said the way Israel has carried out the war has been acceptable, while 68% of Jews ages 50 and older said it was acceptable.

In New York, about one-third of Jewish voters in Tuesday's election supported Mamdani, exit polls showed,

powering a victory that alarmed his Jewish opponents accustomed to backing the losing candidate.

"The morning after the election, many members of our community woke up with a sense of unease," said Hinda Poupko, a senior vice president at the UJA-Federation of New York, a major Jewish nonprofit. "There's a lot of uncertainty about how Mayor Mamdani might act once in City Hall." —RT/Agency

Before Trump Talks, Riyadh Holds Firm on Conditions for Normalizing Ties with Israel

United States President Donald Trump has been talking up the prospects of Saudi Arabia agreeing to normalise ties with Israel, but it is unlikely to happen when Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman visits the White House this month.



The establishment of diplomatic relations between Israel and Saudi Arabia after decades of enmity could shake up the political and security landscape in the Middle East, potentially strengthening US influence in the region.

Trump said last month he hoped Saudi Arabia would "very soon" join other Muslim countries that signed the 2020 Abraham Accords normalising ties with Israel.

But Riyadh has signalled to Washington through diplomatic channels that its position has

not changed. It will sign up only if there is agreement on a roadmap to Palestinian statehood, two Gulf sources told Reuters.

The intention is to avoid diplomatic missteps and ensure alignment of the Saudi and US positions

before any public statements are made, they said. One said the aim was to avoid any confusion at or after the White House talks on November 18.

The Crown Prince, widely known as MBS, "is not likely to entertain any possible formalising of ties in the near future without at least a credible pathway to a Palestinian state," said Jonathan Panikoff, former deputy US national intelligence officer on the Middle East. —RT/Agency

US Air Travel Faces Near Standstill Amid Government Shutdown Crisis



WASHINGTON: U.S. flights will be reduced to "a trickle" in the run-up to the Thanksgiving holiday as the federal shutdown continues because of rising air traffic control staffing shortages, Transportation Secretary Sean Duffy said in remarks that aired on Sunday.

Major airlines were dealing with a third day of government-mandated flight cuts after thousands of delays and cancellations snarled traffic on Saturday. The shutdown, which has reached a record 40 days, has led to shortages of air traffic controllers who, like other federal employees, have not been paid for weeks.

"It's only going to get worse... the two weeks before Thanksgiving, you're going to see air travel be reduced to a trickle," Duffy said on CNN's "State of the Union" program.

Millions of people usually travel in the run-up to Thanksgiving, one of the most important U.S. holidays, which this year falls on November 27.

"Many of them are not going to be able to get on an airplane, because there are not going to be that many flights that fly if this thing doesn't open back up,"

Duffy said. The Federal Aviation Administration instructed airlines to cut 4% of daily flights starting on Friday at 40 major airports because of air traffic control safety concerns. Reductions in flights are mandated to reach 6% on Tuesday and then hit 10% by November 14.

As of 10:30 a.m. ET (1530 GMT) on Sunday, there had already been 1,400 flight cancellations and 2,700 delays as conditions looked to be worsening. The Federal Aviation Administration said it had staffing issues at 12 towers.

A growing number of air traffic controllers have retired since the federal shutdown started on October 1, Duffy said. The FAA is 1,000 to 2,000 controllers short of full staffing, he told CNN.

"I paid experienced controllers to stay on the job and not retire," Duffy said. "I used to have about four controllers retire a day before the shutdown... now up to 15 to 20 a day are retiring."

Some 1,550 flights were canceled and 6,700 were delayed on Saturday, up from 1,025 cancellations and 7,000 delayed flights on Friday. —RT/Agency

Iran Steps Forward to Mediate Between Pakistan and Afghan Taliban in Bid for Regional Calm

ISLAMABAD: Iran has offered to mediate between Pakistan and the Afghan Taliban to help defuse the mounting tensions following the recent collapse of talks between the two neighbors, diplomatic sources said on Sunday.

According to the sources, Iranian Foreign Minister Seyyed Abbas Araghchi held separate phone conversations with Pakistan's Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar and Afghanistan's Acting Foreign Minister Amir Khan Muttaqi, offering Tehran's assistance in fostering reconciliation and building mutual trust.

During the discussion, the Iranian and Pakistani foreign ministers reviewed bilateral relations, regional developments, and international issues. Araghchi stressed that peace and stability along the Pakistan-Afghanistan border must be preserved and reiterated Iran's willingness to facilitate dialogue between the two sides.

"The Iranian foreign minister voiced concern over the

growing tensions between Pakistan and Afghanistan and urged both countries to continue dialogue to settle their differences," a diplomatic source said. Araghchi further assured that Iran was prepared to provide all possible support to promote peace and understanding in the region.

Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar briefed his Iranian counterpart on the recent Istanbul talks between Islamabad and Kabul, which ended without progress. He reaffirmed Pakistan's commitment to resolving issues through diplomacy, stressing that regional stability remains a top priority for Islamabad. Both sides agreed to maintain close coordination and consultation, with Iran expected to play a constructive mediating role in the coming days. Separately, sources confirmed that Araghchi also spoke with Afghan Foreign Minister Amir Khan Muttaqi, conveying Iran's view that continuous engagement is vital to prevent further deterioration in bilateral ties. —RT

Khawaja Asif Urges Muslim Unity to End Oppression Stretching from Gaza to Kashmir

SIALKOT: Defence Minister Khawaja Asif on Sunday highlighted the plight of Muslims in the world, especially in Gaza and Kashmir, and urged the ummah to unite to end oppression.



Speaking to the media here, the minister said a campaign has been underway against the Muslim world; "if we do not unite, everyone will face the same hardships endured by the Muslims of Palestine, Gaza and Kashmir," Khawaja Asif urged the nation to keep the message of Allama Iqbal alive; all Pakistanis must embody Iqbal's poetry. "Allama Iqbal and Quaid-e-Azam are benefactors of the nation — living nations always remember their benefactors, and those that forget them lose their way," he

added. He said that today in Sialkot we are celebrating Allama Iqbal's birth anniversary in his own birthplace. "My elders also lived in Iqbal's neighbourhood in Sialkot. Iqbal's poetry in Urdu and Persian will always remain alive."

The minister regretted that "we have forgotten the message of the Poet of the East. Allama Iqbal dreamed of a separate homeland for the Muslims of the subcontinent, the poetry and philoso-

phy of the Poet of the East were known in the world before and remain so now." Khawaja Asif said the Ummah is currently straying; Muslims from Gaza to Kashmir have been facing oppression. "May Allah give us the courage to stand for the oppressed Muslims of Gaza, Palestine and Kashmir. We must raise our voices for the causes of Gaza, Palestine and Kashmir," the defence minister concluded. —RT/Agency

Hamas Announces Plan to Return Body of Israeli Soldier Held in Gaza Since 2014

TEL AVIV: Hamas announced it will hand over on Sunday afternoon the body of an Israeli soldier who was killed in 2014 and who has been held in Gaza since then. His remains are the only ones held in Gaza since before the latest, two-year war between Israel and Hamas.

The return of the soldier, Hadar Goldin, would be a significant development in the U.S.-brokered truce and close a painful, 11-year saga for his parents, who spearheaded a campaign, along with the family of another soldier whose body was taken in 2014, to bring their son home for burial.

According to the announcement, Hamas said it

found the Goldin's body in a tunnel in the enclave's southernmost city of Rafah on Saturday. Goldin was killed on Aug. 1, 2014, two hours after a ceasefire took effect ending the that year's war between Israel and Hamas.

Israeli media, citing anonymous officials, have reported that Hamas was delaying the release of Goldin's body in hopes of negotiating safe passage for more than 100 militants surrounded by Israeli forces and trapped in the enclave's southernmost city of Rafah.

Gila Gamliel, the minister of science and technology and a member of Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's Likud party, told Army radio said

that Israel is not negotiating for a deal within a deal.

"There are agreements whose implementation is guaranteed by the mediators, and we shouldn't allow anyone to come and play (games) and to reopen the agreement," she said. Hamas made no comment on a possible exchange for its fighters stuck in the so-called yellow zone, which is controlled by Israeli forces, though they acknowledge that there are clashes taking place there. Goldin is one of five bodies of deceased hostages still remaining in Gaza. As part of the U.S.-brokered truce deal, the militants are expected to return all of the remains of hostages. —RT

Shock Visa Crackdown: Diabetes, Obesity Could Cost You Entry into the U.S.

The visas of foreigners seeking residence in the US face the possibility of rejection if the applicants have certain medical conditions, including diabetes or obesity, according to US-based news outlet.

The publication reported this, citing a new directive from the Trump administration. According to the outlet, this new directive was outlined in a cable issued by the US State

Department to embassy and consular officials.

It "directs visa officers to deem applicants ineligible to enter the US for several new reasons, including age or the likelihood they might rely on public benefits," KFF reported. "The guidance says that such people could become a 'public charge' — a potential drain on US resources — because of their health issues or

age," the report said. "You must consider an applicant's health," the cable read, according to KFF. It added: "Certain medical conditions — including, but not limited to, cardiovascular diseases, respiratory diseases, cancers, diabetes, metabolic diseases, neurological diseases, and mental health conditions — can require hundreds of thousands of dollars' worth of care." —RT

PIA Slams 'False Narrative' After Plane Windscreen Crack Sparks Uproar

LAHORE: Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) has denied reports suggesting a major in-flight emergency, calling it a "false narrative" aimed at defaming the airline. A PIA spokesperson clari-

fied that the aircraft's windscreen has three strong layers, and only the inner layer was cracked, posing no safety risk. The airline condemned at-scheduling, weather, or attempts to undermine national aviation for per-

sonal agendas, calling the claims a conspiracy against PIA's progress. It added that flight cancellations occur only due to adjustments. —RT/Agency
