## Asif Warns: Pakistan May Strike Inside Afghanistan After Deadly Terror Attacks

ISLAMABAD: Defence Minister Khawaja Asif on Tuesday warned that Pakistan could carry out strikes inside Afghanistan following recent terrorist attacks in Islamabad and South Waziristan, slamming the Afghan Taliban regime for harbouring militants behind the violence.

Over the past two days, Pakistan has witnessed two major terror incidents — one targeting Cadet College Wana in South Waziristan and another striking Islamabad.

Speaking on media programme 'Aaj Shahzeb Khanzada Kay Sath', the defence minister said cross-border action inside Afghanistan could not be "ruled out" following the two attacks.

Asif rejected the Afghan Taliban regime's condemnation of the attacks, saying that such expressions of regret could not "be taken as proof of sincerity". "Those



sheltered by the Afghan Taliban are repeatedly attacking us," he said.

The defence minister warned India and Afghanistan against any misadventure, saying Pakistan would "pay back in the same coin".

"Pakistan will never initiate any military adventure," he assured. However, he said: "We will not let any act of aggression go unanswered; we will respond forcefully."

It is to be noted here that at least 12 were martyred

and over 30 injured in the suicide blast in Islamabad.

Prior to this, Asif warned that Pakistan was fully capable of delivering a befitting response to cross-border terrorism.

"We are in a state of war. Anyone who thinks that the Pakistan Army is fighting this war only in the border areas along Afghanistan or in the remote regions of Balochistan should take the suicide attack in Islamabad as a wake-up call," the defence czar wrote in a post on X.—RT/Agency

## Islamabad Shattered: 12 Martyred, Dozens Injured In Ruthless Suicide Attack

ISLAMABAD: A suicide blast rocked the federal capital on Tuesday, leaving at least 12 martyred and 30 injured outside a kachehri court building, said a spokesperson for the Pakistan Institute of Medical Sciences (PIMS).

Of the 30 injured brought to the hospital, about five injured are in critical condition, the PIMS spokesperson said.

Speaking to the media, Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi said the suicide attack took place at 12:39pm today.

The security czar said the suicide bomber was trying to enter the courthouse, but "when he did not get an opportunity, he attacked a police vehicle".

Noting that Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has directed to ensure the best medical assistance to those injured, the Naqvi said that the first priority will be to identify the suicide bomber.



"Those behind the court attack will be brought to light," the minister noted, adding: "There are many links in today's attack; evidence will be brought to light soon".

"There are many mes-

sages in this attack. If someone from another country is involved, it will not be forgiven," he warned.

Naqvi further revealed that the suicide bomber remained at the site for 10 to 15 minutes, planning to enter the building before carrying out the attack. He added that the attacker detonated the explosives as soon as a police vehicle arrived.

Earlier, the security czar visited the site of the explosion outside Islamabad's district courts and directed that the search operation be completed swiftly. Inspector General of Islamabad Police (IGP)

Ali Nasir Rizvi briefed the minister on the incident.

He also directed authorities to submit a comprehensive investigation report.

Earlier, police said that the explosion occurred in a car parked outside the court. The injured reportedly included the petitioners and lawyers.

The building of the kachehri court was vacated after the explosion. Those present inside the building were being evacuated through the back door of the facility and court proceedings were suspended.—RT/Agency

## President, PM Vow Ruthless Action Against Foreign-Backed Terror After Islamabad Blast

ISLAMABAD: President Asif Ali Zardari and Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Tuesday vowed continued and decisive action against foreign-backed terrorists after a deadly suicide blast in Islamabad claimed at least 12 lives.

Over the past two days, Pakistan has witnessed two major terror incidents — one targeting Cadet College Wana in South Waziristan and another striking Islamabad.

During their meeting at the President House, President Zardari and Prime Minister Shehbaz reaffirmed their commitment to continue operations against foreign-backed terrorists and their fa-



cilitators until complete eradication.

The president and prime minister also reviewed the overall security and political situation in the country.

Senate Chairman Syed Yousaf Raza Gilani and National Assembly Speaker Sardar Ayaz Sadiq were also present, along with

federal ministers Mohsin Naqvi, Chaudhry Salik Hussain, Azam Nazeer Tarrar, Khalid Hussain Magasi, and Abdul Aleem Khan. Their meeting followed a suicide blast near Islamabad's District Judicial Complex that left 12 dead and 36 injured.—RT/Agency

## 14 Security Personnel Injured As DI Khan Bomb Attack Rips Through Convoy

D.I KHAN: A bomb attack in the Daraban tehsil of Dera Ismail Khan on Tuesday injured at least 14 security personnel.

The attack, said to be a remotely controlled improvised explosive device (IED), targeted a security forces convoy, said security sources.

The explosion heavily damaged a security forces vehicle. The injured were shifted to the Combined Military Hospital (CMH) D.I Khan.

The attack came at a time when security forces are battling terrorists who attacked Cadet College Wana in North Waziristan. The military said a clearance operation is un-



derway to neutralise the three terrorists who managed to infiltrate the educational institution.

Security forces added that three of the personnel are said to be in critical condition.

Following the attack, a large contingent of police and security forces reached the incident site and cordoned off the area.

A search operation was launched to sanitise the area.—RT/Agency

## Trump Hints At Breakthrough: Says US Nearing Major Trade Deal With India

US President Donald Trump said on Monday the United States was getting close to reaching a deal with India that would expand economic and security ties between the two countries, boost US energy exports and promote investments in key US sectors. "We're getting a fair deal, just a fair trade deal," Trump told reporters in the Oval Office at the swearing-in of his envoy to India,



Sergio Gor. "We're making a deal with India, much different deal than we had in the past." Trump repeated his optimism that a deal was near, saying, "We're getting close."—RT/Agency

## Farooq Naek Confident 27th Amendment Will Secure Two-Thirds Majority In NA

ISLAMABAD: People's Party's Senator Farooq H. Naek on Tuesday said that the 27th constitutional amendment bill is expected to pass by two-third majority in the National Assembly today.

Farooq Naek, who has been the chairman of the Parliament's joint committee for law and justice, in media talk show 'Bakhabar Savera' clarified that Senator Saif Abro voted for the 27th amendment without any pressure. "Saif Abro said in the house that he has voted for the Field Marshall".

He said the Opposition boycotted the Senate session during the clause-wise ap-



proval of the bill. "The opposition should have cast their votes against the 27th amendment instead of boycott", Senator Naek said.

He said the President does not belong to the government but represents the state. "The PM opting not to get the exception has made a right decision". He also said that the committee's members had reservations over the MQM's proposed local government amendment bill. It is to be mentioned here that the 27th constitutional amendment has been passed from the Senate and now the government has tabled the bill in the National Assembly for approval.—RT/Agency

## Ruckus And Rhetoric: NA Session Ends After Fiery Debate On 27th Amendment

ISLAMABAD: The National Assembly session was adjourned on Tuesday without the passage of the 27th Constitutional Amendment Bill, which was expected to be sailed through, a day after its approval by the Senate.

Law Minister Azam Nazeer Tarrar tabled the key legislation in the lower house of parliament, seeking major judicial and military reforms with a two-thirds majority.

The 59-clause amendment, passed by the Senate on Monday, seeks to overhaul the country's military and judicial structures. It was moved by the law minister and secured 64 votes in the 96-member House, with no votes against it, as opposition lawmakers boycotted the proceedings and tore up their copies in protest.



Apart from treasury members, ANP's senators, PTI-backed Saifullah Abro, and JUI-F's Ahmed Khan also supported the bill. In a surprise move, Abro refrained from joining the protest and later announced his resignation from the Senate.

The lower house session, scheduled for 11:00am, began half an hour late with



prayers offered for PML-N Senator Irfan Siddiqi, who passed away on Monday night.

Speaking on the floor of the NA, Tarrar said: "[The] Senate has passed the 27th Constitutional Amendment Bill with a two-thirds majority. In the joint parliamentary committee, the opposition should also have attended the session."—RT/Agency

## Fazlur Rehman Draws Line — JUI-F To Oppose 27th Constitutional Amendment

ISLAMABAD: Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam (JUI-F) chief Maulana Fazlur Rehman has directed party members in the National Assembly to vote against the 27th Constitutional Amendment.

Maulana Fazlur Rehman stated that the constitutional amendment is currently being presented in the National Assembly. He added that the issue had also been discussed in detail during the party's parliamentary meeting.

After thorough deliberations on all aspects of the proposed amendment, the JUI-F decided to oppose it, JUI-F chief Maulana Fazlur Rehman said, instructing all party members to cast their votes against the amendment.

Earlier in the day, the 27th Constitutional Amendment was already being passed by the Senate.

## Pakistan Sounds Alarm At UN Over Afghan Arms Fueling Cross-Border Terror

UN: Pakistan cautioned the UN on Monday that the free movement of illegal arms within Afghanistan, many of them modern weapons now used by anti-Pakistan militant outfits, represents a serious regional risk and a key point of friction in its troubled relationship with Kabul.

Ambassador Asim Iftikhar Ahmad, Pakistan's Permanent Representative to the UN, raised the issue during the UN Security Council Open Debate on Small Arms, stressing that Islamabad remains deeply concerned about developments in Afghanistan. "Pakistan is seriously concerned about the presence of stockpiles of sophisticated arms and



ammunition in Afghanistan, as noted in the findings of the Secretary General's reports," the ambassador told the members in attendance. "These sophisticated weapons pose a direct threat to neighbouring countries".

The Pakistani and Afghan militaries clashed last month, killing dozens, in the worst vi-

olence since the Taliban returned to power in Afghanistan in 2021. Both sides signed a ceasefire in Doha in October, but negotiations in Istanbul ended without a long-term deal due to a disagreement over militant groups hostile to Pakistan that operate inside Afghanistan.—RT/Agency

## Govt Eyeing 28th Amendment After Sweeping Changes In 27th, Says Sanaullah

ISLAMABAD: Adviser to the Prime Minister on Political Affairs Rana Sanaullah has said that the government plans to introduce the 28th Constitutional Amendment after the passage of the 27th Amendment.

Speaking on Media programme 'Capital Talk', Sanaullah said the upcoming amendment would focus on matters related to education, population, and local governments (LGs).

The Senate on Monday passed the 27th Constitutional Amendment Bill,



which aims to overhaul the military and judicial structures, amid the opposition's walkout and protest. Law Minister Azam Nazeer Tarrar presented the 59-clause Bill, which received the required 64 votes (two-thirds majority in the 96-member House). It will now be presented in the National Assembly for vot-

ing today. According to the NA's agenda issued late Monday night, the session will begin at 11am. Law Minister Azam Nazeer Tarrar is scheduled to table the bill in the lower house for approval. Meanwhile, PML-N Senator Sanaullah, speaking on Geo News' morning programme "Geo Pakistan" on Tuesday, stated that efforts were being made to advance local government matters, adding that the process of constitutional amendments would continue as consensus grew.—RT/Agency

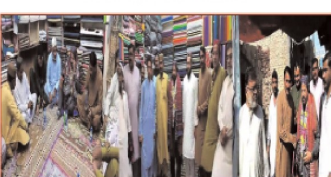
## Senior Politician Syed Noor Muhammad Shah Pledges Rapid Development for UC Pat Sharif

## Three Martyred as Terrorists Storm Wana Cadet College, Confirms Naqvi

ISLAMABAD: Federal Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi confirmed that three people were martyred in the terrorist attack on Wana Cadet College. He said the attackers attempted to take people hostage inside the college but failed due to the timely response of security forces. Speaking to the media, Naqvi revealed that the assailants were in contact with their handlers in Afghanistan. He stressed that the nation must stand united with its security forces and warned that if cross-border terror-



ists are not restrained, Pakistan will take decisive action. The minister added that Pakistan had already provided evidence of terrorist training activities being conducted inside Afghanistan. According to media reports, an opera-

tion is ongoing against three militants who took refuge inside the college premises. The attackers, believed to be of Afghan origin, are hiding in a building located far from the cadets' residential area.—RT/Agency

## Karakoram Highway Buried: Deadly Landslide in Chilas Traps Dozens of Vehicles

GILGIT: A massive landslide struck the Karakoram Highway near Ghandlu in Chilas district of Gilgit-Baltistan, burying six vehicles under debris and sweeping two others into the river. Several passenger vehicles were also affected by the incident. According to government spokesperson Faizullah Iqbal, some indi-

viduals are feared trapped under the debris, and rescue operations are underway. Chief Minister Gilgit-Baltistan has taken notice of the incident and directed authorities to expedite rescue efforts, while emergency has been declared in nearby hospitals. Iqbal added that no casualties have been confirmed so far. He said that a few

passengers managed to escape by jumping out of their vehicles in time. The landslide caused a major disruption in traffic flow on the strategic highway, linking Gilgit-Baltistan with other parts of the country, as rescue teams and heavy machinery were deployed to clear the route and search for the missing.—RT/Agency

## Naqvi Draws the Line: Only Evidence — Not Allegations — Will Speak

ISLAMABAD: Federal Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi said that Pakistan will not level accusations without evidence, unlike India, and will address every issue only with supporting proof. Speaking to reporters, Naqvi emphasized that the government is committed to a transparent, law-based approach and

pledged that no individual involved in wrongdoing would be spared once verified evidence emerges. He stressed the importance of relying on facts to preserve credibility in domestic and international affairs and warned that unsubstantiated claims undermine diplomatic discourse. ## WWII Veteran's Purple Heart Returned to Family in Illinois After Decades in Safe Deposit Box

US: A Purple Heart medal belonging to World War II veteran James Bennett of Illinois has finally been returned to his family after spending decades locked away in a safe deposit box. The medal, awarded to Bennett for his service as a U.S. Army rifleman, was located and returned as part of Operation Purple Heart, a program launched by Illinois State Treasurer Michael Frerichs to reunite unclaimed military honors with veterans' families. Bennett, a longtime resident of Oak Park, passed away in 1990 at the age of 76, and his wife, Ann, died seven years later. Their niece, Patty Knies, who became the legal guardian of their disabled daughter Susan, was

unaware of the existence of the safe deposit box until she was contacted by the Treasurer's Office. The box, registered under Ann Bennett's name, was turned over to the state in 2022.

Knies expressed deep gratitude upon receiving the medal. "I knew nothing about the safety deposit box," she told The Reporter. "When my aunt and uncle passed on, but not this. It's exciting — he was a really great guy." Treasurer Frerichs, who personally presented the Purple Heart to Knies during a ceremony on Monday, praised the emotional significance of such returns. "We have to do a bit of detective work," he told FOX

32 Chicago. "The Chicago Tribune and others have helped us track down these families because it's not always easy." Knies said she plans to proudly display the medal at home and share photos of it with surviving relatives. "I hope this also encourages others to look into retrieving their family members' Purple Hearts," she added. Frerichs noted that this marks the 17th Purple Heart successfully returned since he took office — the highest number in the country. "But our work isn't over," he said. "We still have six more medals in our possession that we'd love to place back into the warm embrace of their families instead of our cold vault."—RT/Agency

## Escaped Dog Causes Traffic Chaos in Massachusetts Tunnel Before Being Safely Rescued

Traffic came to a standstill inside the Ted Williams Tunnel in Massachusetts after a loose dog made its way onto the busy roadway, sending drivers and authorities into a frantic rescue effort.

Surveillance footage released by the Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT) showed a black-and-white dog darting between lanes of fast-moving vehicles, narrowly avoiding collisions as startled motorists tried to slow down. The unexpected sight caused traffic to back up along the Massachusetts Turnpike as drivers attempted to avoid the frightened animal.

Authorities from the Massachusetts State Police quickly responded to the emergency. Troopers coordinated efforts to temporarily stop traffic in both directions, ensuring the dog's safety as officers approached it cautiously. After several tense moments, the officers successfully coaxed the dog



into the back seat of a police cruiser, ending the ordeal without any injuries to the animal or drivers.

Officials later confirmed that the same dog had been seen earlier near the economy parking lot of Boston Logan International Airport, located not far from the tunnel's entrance. It remains unclear how the dog managed to travel from the airport area to the tunnel, but police believe it may have wandered off while its owner was nearby.

## KP Placed on Red Alert After Deadly Strikes Rock Islamabad and South Waziristan

## Gang convicted of ATM fraud sentenced by Lahore banking court

The Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) Lahore had registered the case in 2013. The offenders had unlawfully withdrawn hundreds of thousands of rupees from citizens' accounts by using counterfeit ATM cards. The court sentenced Mudassar Ghafoor and Waqas Yaseen to seven years' imprisonment each, while Madhina Ghafoor received 16 years in prison. Following the announcement of the verdict, the convicts were taken into custody in the courtroom and sent to jail.—RT/Agency

## Mustafa Kamal Confirms 28th Amendment Bill Set to Hit National Assembly Floor Soon

ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister Mustafa Kamal on Tuesday said that the proposed Article 140-A could not become the part of the 27th constitutional amendment owing to the lack of consensus within political parties over it. MQM legislator was speaking on the floor of the National Assembly during debate over the constitutional amendment. "The issue doesn't end here, the 28th amendment would come in this house soon," Kamal said. He claimed that the local government system doesn't exist in the country. "Provinces getting funds from the National Finance Commission (NFC) Award but there is no



mechanism to disburse funds to lower level." He said under the powers delegated in the 18th Constitutional Amendment resources freeze at the level of chief ministers. "It is the reason behind the talk about rolling back the 18th Amendment," he said.—RT/Agency

## Time to Strike Back: Pakistan Must Dismantle Terror Havens Across the Afghan Border

The blood-soaked streets of Islamabad's G-11, where 12 innocent souls were torn apart and 36 others wounded in a savage suicide bombing, mark yet another grim chapter in Pakistan's long war against terrorism. The attack — carried out brazenly outside a district court in the heart of the capital during major international events — was not random. It was a message, orchestrated by the deadly nexus of India and Afghanistan-based terror outfits determined to destabilize Pakistan.

For too long, Pakistan has exercised restraint in the face of repeated betrayals and hollow assurances from Kabul. The Taliban government's continued refusal or inability to rein in groups like the

TTP has emboldened these bloodthirsty networks to



strike at will. This stubborn negligence mirrors the Taliban's fatal mistake before 9/11 — harboring extremists until the world turned against them. History, it seems, is repeating itself.

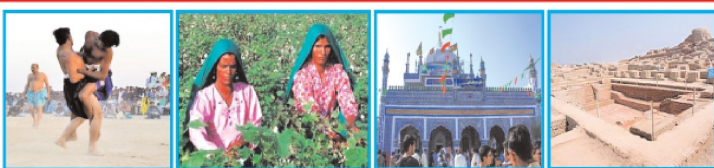
It is time for Pakistan to take off the gloves. Diplomatic niceties and empty condemnations have failed. The Afghan regime must be held accountable, and the sanctuaries nurturing cross-border terrorism must be neutralized — decisively and pre-

emptively. Pakistan's patience must not be mistaken for weakness. The sacrifices of our soldiers, police, and civilians demand justice — not mere statements. India's toxic hand in fueling these horrors through proxies has also become undeniable. From Wana to Islamabad, the pattern is clear: coordinated attempts to ignite chaos and demoralize the Pakistani state. But they will fail.

This is not the time for hesitation. The Islamabad bombing is not just an attack on Pakistan — it is an attack on peace, sovereignty, and regional stability. The message to Kabul must be unequivocal: if you cannot dismantle the terror networks on your soil, Pakistan will. For the blood of our martyrs demands nothing less.

Cristiano Ronaldo Drops Bombshell Hint on When He'll Hang Up His Boots



Portugal captain Cristiano Ronaldo has confirmed that the 2026 FIFA World Cup will mark the end of his illustrious international career, as he prepares to draw the curtain on one of football's greatest journeys.

Speaking via video link at a Saudi forum on Tuesday, the 40-year-old forward—who has scored over 950 goals for club and country—said he plans to retire from football within "one or two years."

"Definitely, yes," Ronaldo said when asked if the 2026 edition would be his final World Cup. "I'm gonna be 41 years old, and I think it will be the moment."

The Al Nassr star, who joined the Saudi club in 2023, also elaborated on his recent remarks about retiring "soon."

"Let's be honest, when I say soon, it's probably one or two years. I'll still be in the game," he added.

The five-time Ballon d'Or winner hopes to feature in a record sixth World Cup next year. His closest attempt to lifting the trophy came in 2006, when Portugal reached the semi-finals before losing to France.

Portugal are yet to confirm their qualification for the 2026 tournament in the USA, Canada, and Mexico, but can secure their spot with a win over Ireland on Thursday.

Ronaldo recently became the all-time top scorer in World Cup qualifying history, netting twice against Hungary to reach 41 goals and surpassing Guatemala's Carlos Ruiz (39).

He also holds the record for most international goals, with 143 strikes for Portugal.

In an emotional interview with Piers Morgan Uncensored last week, Ronaldo spoke candidly about the challenges of retirement.—Agency

In his clash with debutant Lei Peifan—who had earlier defeated Masters champion Shaun Murphy 4-1—Trump started strong with a 60-break, but Peifan responded with a stunning 101 to level the match. Despite opportunities to claim more frames, Peifan was unable to capitalise, allowing Trump to pull ahead to a 5-1 advantage. Peifan briefly fought back with a 72 in frame seven, but Trump sealed his victory in frame eight with a 71. World number one Trump, who won this event in 2021, praised his strong start and expressed confidence in maintaining his form throughout the week. "It's always a great feeling to get off to a strong start in this event. Every player in the field is capable of beating anyone, so you have to be sharp from the very first frame," Trump said. "I felt good out there today, found my rhythm early, and hopefully I can carry that form through the rest of the week. I just tried to play my best, and I feel like I did that today," he added. In Tuesday's highly anticipated matches, Mark Allen will face current World Champion Zhao Xintong, while 2024 World Champion Kyren Wilson will take on in-form Jack Lisowski.—Agency

Faham and Awais Smash Centuries as Faisalabad Dominate Islamabad Early

ABBOTTABAD: Opener Faham-ul-Haq and middle-order batter Muhammad Awais Zafar scored vital centuries to power Faisalabad to a formidable total on the opening day of their seventh-round Quaid-e-Azam Trophy (QEAT) 2025-26 match against Islamabad at the Abbottabad Cricket Stadium here on Tuesday.

Faisalabad captain Ali Shan's decision to bat first proved beneficial as his team finished day one at 322/4 in 81 overs, with century Awas unbeaten in the middle.

Shan-led side, however, had a contrasting start to their innings and thus had been reduced to 111/3 as opener Hasan Raza (15), Asim Ali Nasir (27) and Atiq-ur-Rehman (18) fell after making meagre contributions.

Following the slump, Awas joined Faham in the middle, and the duo put Faisalabad in control by putting together 188 runs for the fourth wicket.

Jawad Ali eventually broke the monumental partnership by getting rid of Faham, who scored 109 off 232 deliveries with the help of 18 fours.

Awais, on the other hand, remained firm and knitted an unbeaten 23-run partnership for the fifth wicket with Raees Ahmed, unbeaten on three, to ensure there were no further setbacks.

He remained the top-scorer for Faisalabad with an unbeaten 138 off 139 deliveries, studded with 16 fours and five sixes, and will resume his innings on his second day, alongside Raees.

For Islamabad, Jawad Ali picked up two wickets, while Ahsan Sheikh and Hunain Shah could take one apiece on the first day's play.

At the Shoaib Akhtar Cricket Stadium in Rawalpindi, a collective bowling effort helped Abbottabad book Karachi Blues for a modest total on the opening day of their seventh-round QEAT match.

Opting to bat first, Karachi Blues could accumulate 258 runs before being bowled out in 80 overs despite Danish Aziz's gutsy half-century.

Danish waged a lone battle for Karachi Blues with an unbeaten 89 off 152 deliveries, featuring seven fours and two sixes. Top-order batter Shan Masood was the other notable run-getter with his 48-ball 43.—Agency



Shadab Khan Nears Long-Awaited Return as Pakistan Eye Squad Boost

Pakistan's T20I vice-captain, Shadab Khan, is set to make a comeback to the national team ahead of the 2026 T20 World Cup, scheduled to be held in India and Sri Lanka in February-March.

According to the sources, the selection committee, along with white-ball head coach Mike Hesson, is considering Shadab's return to help boost his momentum ahead of the major tournament.

The 27-year-old's fitness has reportedly satisfied both the medical panel and the team physiotherapist, as he recovers quickly and is already bowling full spells.

On Monday, Shadab, along with emerging pacer Ali Raza, participated in a practice match at the LCCA Ground after completing their rehabilitation programs.

A video shared by the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) showed Ali Raza bowling at full pace, troubling the batters, while Shadab appeared in control with both bat and ball.

The duo's performance was closely monitored by the academy coaches, with Director of the National High Performance Centre, Aqib Javed, also in attendance.

Shadab had undergone surgery in the United Kingdom a few months ago to address persistent discomfort in his right shoulder, an issue that had troubled him prior to Pakistan's T20I series against Bangladesh in Dhaka in July.

Following medical consultations, surgery was deemed necessary to fully resolve the problem. The leg-spinner resumed training at the National Cricket Academy (NCA) last month, taking part in fielding and bowling sessions under the guidance of the academy's coaching staff Shadab, who served as Pakistan's vice-captain during the white-ball tour of New Zealand earlier this year, missed several key assignments during his recovery, including the away T20I series against Bangladesh, the white-ball tour of the West Indies, the tri-nation T20I series involving UAE and Afghanistan, the ACC Men's T20 Asia Cup 2025, and the white-ball home series against South Africa.—Agency



Marcus Trescothick Fires Back at Critics Over England's Ashes Build-Up

England assistant coach Marcus Trescothick has defended the team's streamlined preparation ahead of their three-day warm-up match against the Lions at Lilac Hill in Perth on Thursday.

The match serves as England's only on-field practice before the first Ashes Test at Optus Stadium next Friday.

Trescothick described the approach as "the way of the modern game," noting that Ashes tours have historically begun with multiple warm-up fixtures against domestic or invitational teams.

However, in recent years, such matches have been reduced as boards aim to streamline schedules.

"It's the way that series are generally done nowadays—for us and other opposition teams around the world," Trescothick told reporters on Tuesday.

"With the volume of cricket that's played elsewhere, you don't always have the time for two or three first-class games like in the past. You make the most of a prep game or training facilities, and that's the approach we've taken," he added.

Since Brendon McCullum and Ben Stokes took over as head coach and captain, England have largely moved away from traditional warm-up matches, favouring training camps and intra-squad games—a strategy that has still seen them start series strongly.

They have won the first Test in each of their last five overseas tours, including India, Pakistan, and New Zealand last year.

Michael Vaughan, who opened the batting alongside Trescothick during England's 2002-03 Ashes tour, questioned the value of preparing on a club ground, warning it may "bounce really low" ahead of a first Test at Optus Stadium, which is expected to be fast with steep bounce.

Trescothick, however, said England were "very happy" with their preparation.

"We've had facilities here with the nets and out in the middle, plus the prep game. In my day, playing at the WACA was unique, but you adapt to different pitches and facilities. We'll have three days of prep at Optus and go from there. We're very happy at the moment."—Agency



Carlos Alcaraz Outguns Taylor Fritz in ATP Finals Epic to Keep Dream Run Alive



World number one Carlos Alcaraz came under extreme pressure before overcoming American Taylor Fritz 6-7(2) 7-5 6-3 in a thrilling round-robin match at the ATP Finals on Tuesday, leaving the Spaniard on two wins from two.

Last year's finalist Fritz played the tennis of his life, as both men served up the best encounter of the season-ending championships so far, but the American ran out of steam as Alcaraz turned on the style and took the deciding set with ease.

Carlos Alcaraz and Fritz had won their opening Jimmy Connors Group matches, and the Spaniard looked in real trouble when the American took the opening set in a tiebreak. Alcaraz faced break points in the second set but rallied back to draw level.

Fritz began to tire, and Alcaraz broke to lead 4-2 in the final set before wrapping up the win in two hours and 48 minutes by serving out to love.

"It was pretty tight. I was struggling more than him in the first set," Alcaraz said. "I wasn't serving well, and I think he was pretty comfortable from the baseline, from everywhere."

Carlos Alcaraz will be assured of a semi-final place if Alex de Minaur defeats Lorenzo Musetti in the evening match.—Agency

Trevoh Chalobah Drafted In to Replace Injured Marc Guehi in England Squad



LONDON: Chelsea defender Trevoh Chalobah has been called up to the England squad as a replacement for Marc Guehi, who suffered a foot injury during Crystal Palace's UEFA Conference League clash against AZ Alkmaar last week. Chalobah will link up with the Three Lions ahead of their final World Cup qualifying fixtures against Serbia and Albania, reuniting with former Chelsea boss and current England manager Thomas Tuchel. The 25-year-old has earned his first senior England call-up under Tuchel in May, making his debut against Senegal. However, he was overlooked for the last two international breaks before earning a recall this month. Chalobah has been a consistent presence for Chelsea this season, stepping in for the injured Levi Colwill and impressing with his versatility across the backline. Despite this, Tuchel—who has attended several Chelsea matches this season—had previously admitted the defender was "unlucky" to miss out on the September squad to face Andorra and Serbia. Tuchel played a key role in Chalobah's development, having handed him his Chelsea debut in 2021. This season, Chalobah has featured in all but four matches for the Blues, who currently sit third in the Premier League, have reached the Carabao Cup quarter-finals, and are competing in the Champions League phase.—Agency

KARACHI: Sindh Home Minister Zia-ul-Hassan Lanjar has alerted police across the province, including Karachi, following the Islamabad suicide blast on Tuesday.

At least 12 people were martyred and over 20 were injured in a suicide blast outside Islamabad's Katcheri.

At the time of the explosion, between 35 to 40 people were present in the vicinity, the preliminary report added.

The explosion also damaged nearby parked vehicles and motorcycles, officials confirmed. The fire



has since been brought under control. Lanjar in his statement, strongly condemned the suicide blast outside Islamabad's district court and stated that suicide bombers and terrorists have no religion and are enemies of humanity. He said that Sindh Police have been placed on high alert until further notice. The home minister directed that security checks and surveillance at all provincial entry and exit points be further intensified.—RT/Agency

## PML Moves Court to Challenge Sky-High e-Challan Penalties in Karachi

KARACHI: The central leadership of Pakistan Muslim League (PML) has filed a petition in the Sindh High Court challenging the hefty e-challan fines imposed on motorists in Karachi.

The petition argues that the city's infrastructure is in complete disarray, with roads in poor condition and traffic management systems ineffective. It contends that imposing exorbitant fines on citizens is akin to a form of punishment and that threats to block national identity cards under the guise of e-challans are unacceptable.



Highlighting a disparity, the petition questioned why fines in Lahore are Rs200 while Karachi motorists are being charged Rs5,000. It criticized Sindh's rulers for competing in imposing fines instead of addressing infrastructure issues, terming the situation as "two laws in one country, which amounts to injustice."—RT/Agency

## Inferno Engulfs Gul Ahmed Textile Warehouse, Karachi Firefighters Battle Massive Blaze

KARACHI: A massive fire broke out at Gul Ahmed Textile Mills Limited's warehouse in Karachi, causing extensive damage to inventories and fixed assets, the company confirmed in a statement to the Pakistan Stock Exchange (PSX). While the blaze led to substantial material losses, Gul Ahmed assured stakeholders that all affected inventories were fully insured under comprehensive coverage, minimizing the financial impact.



The company stated that it is working closely with insurance providers, safety authorities, and regulators to assess the extent of the damage and ensure operational continuity. Reaffirming its commitment to transparency and compliance, Gul Ahmed pledged to keep shareholders and the public informed with timely updates as investigations into the cause of the fire continue.—RT/Agency

## Altaf Shakoor Calls for Public Referendum on Controversial 27th Amendment

KARACHI: Pashan Democratic Party (PDP) Chairman Altaf Shakoor has suggested that the government hold a referendum on the proposed 27th Constitutional Amendment to gauge public sentiment directly, amid concerns that the parliament is increasingly being treated as a rubber stamp.

Speaking on Tuesday, Shakoor acknowledged the need for constitutional amendments, particularly to facilitate the establishment of a megacity government system. However, he emphasized that public participation through a referendum would ensure legitimacy and transparency. He also highlighted the growing demand for the creation of new administrative units in Pakistan and urged that this be properly addressed in any amendment.

Criticizing the elite-dominated parliament, Shakoor called for the introduction of a proportionate electoral system to give ordinary citizens a stronger voice in governance.—RT/Agency

## Nationwide Flight Chaos as Airlines Grapple with Major Operational Turmoil

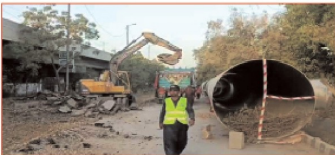
KARACHI: Operational issues in several airlines have led to the cancellation of six flights and delays in 38 others, while one flight was diverted for an alternative landing. According to Jang News, a private airline cancelled two Karachi-Islamabad flights and two Lahore-Dubai flights, while the national carrier called off two Karachi-Skaru flights.



Meanwhile, a foreign airline's flight to Islamabad was diverted back to Tehran. Flight delays ranged from one hour to over ten hours across various airports. Islamabad saw delays of 1 to 6.5 hours in ten flights, while nine other flights faced delays between 1 to 10 hours. At Lahore Airport, eight flights were delayed between 1 to 2 hours, and at Karachi Airport, ten flights experienced delays from 1 to 8.5 hours.—RT

KARACHI: A portion of University Road has been closed to traffic due to ongoing development and repair work, officials confirmed on Monday.

## 'Moment Of Reckoning': Justice Minallah Urges CJP To Convene Judicial Conference On 27th Amendment

ISLAMABAD: Supreme Court's Justice Athar Minallah has written a letter to Chief Justice of Pakistan (CJP) Yahya Afridi on the 27th Constitutional Amendment, terming it a "moment of reckoning" for the judiciary and seeking a judicial conference to discuss the matter.

In a seven-page letter — also circulated to all judges of the Supreme Court, dated October 8, 2025 — Justice Minallah also expressed deep concern over what he described as the "continued capture" of the institution.

Justice Minallah opposed



the proposed constitutional amendments, saying that preparations are being made to house a new Constitutional Court within the building of the Federal Shariat Court "even before Parliament had considered the plan".

The apex court judge said he was recording it as "a solemn duty to the Constitution" to place on record how "destiny was being shaped behind the marble walls of

the last resort of justice."

"Regrettably, the Supreme Court chose to stand beside the forces that had attacked the independence of a constitutional court trusted by the people, so much so that the minutes of two full court meetings, for obvious reasons, remained concealed from public view," Justice Minallah added. He warned that institutions "can be destroyed in no time through fear, surrender, or submission to the powers."

calling that the "unconstitutional" removal and subsequent "judicial execution" of the elected prime minister Zulfikar Ali Bhutto remains one of the gravest and most unpardonable betrayals of our oath and of the people's trust. "Justice Minallah said the persecution of Benazir Bhutto, disqualification and "humiliation" of Nawaz Sharif, and the "victimisation" of Imran Khan were "not isolated events but a continuation of a pattern of suppression of the people's will when the interests of the unelected elite were threatened." —RT/Agency

## Cadet College Wana Attack: All Students, Teachers Safe As Operation Continues

WANA: Pakistan security forces are conducting an 'operation' against three Afghan militants hiding inside the Wana Cadet College, who are reportedly receiving continuous instructions from Afghanistan via telephone, ARY News reported on Tuesday, citing security sources.

According to security sources, the three militants — identified as Afghan nationals — are entrenched inside one of the college's buildings located at a considerable distance from the cadets' residential quarters.

To ensure the safety of the cadets, the clearance operation is being carried out with exceptional skill and caution. A day earlier, the militants had rammed an explosive-laden vehicle into the main gate of the college, completely destroying the entrance and damaging nearby structures.



Security officials confirmed that Pakistan Army personnel bravely neutralized two militants on the spot during the initial exchange. Authorities asserted that attacking innocent tribal students has no link to Islam or the prosperity of the people of Pakistan. The security forces reaffirmed their resolve to continue the operation until the elimination of the last terrorist.

Earlier, ISPR reported that security forces conducted multiple intelligence-based operations (IBOs) in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, killing 20 militants linked to the banned outfit "Fima al-Khwareji". According to the military's media wing, on 8-9 November, twenty khwareji belonging to Indian Proxy, Fima al-Khwareji were killed in two separate engagements in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Province. —RT/Agency

## IMF Demands Special Audit Into Pakistan's Supplementary Spending

ISLAMABAD: The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has demanded a special audit of supplementary grants issued by Pakistan over the past ten years.

An IMF technical mission has arrived in Pakistan to review progress on targets related to the budget process and public finance management reforms.

The mission will assess implementation of goals set for improving the budgetary framework and modernizing public finance management (PFM).

According to sources, the IMF has also proposed limiting the federal government's powers to issue supplementary grants without parliamentary oversight.

Sources further said that a high-powered committee will be established to oversee the



digitized Public Finance Management Master Plan.

The International Monetary Fund delegation is expected to stay in Pakistan for over a week to provide technical assistance to relevant ministries.

As part of the reforms, the Finance and Planning Ministries of Pakistan will jointly issue the Budget Call Circular before the upcoming fiscal year's budget preparations.

In addition, the Auditor General of Pakistan will conduct an audit of the supplementary grant mechanism to ensure greater transparency and efficiency.

According to the Finance Ministry sources, the Public Finance Management Act may also undergo certain amendments as part of the ongoing reform process. —RT/Agency

## Veteran PML-N Senator Irfan Siddiqui Passes Away — Nation In Mourning



ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) Senator Irfan Siddiqui passed away in Islamabad on Monday after battling illness for the past two weeks.

Siddiqui had been receiving treatment at a private hospital in the federal capital, where his condition deteriorated before his demise.

He served as the PML-N's parliamentary leader in the Senate and was known as one of the closest aides to party president Nawaz Sharif.

The veteran lawmaker was also a member of committees on Business Advisory, Human Rights, Information and Broadcasting, Interior and Narcotics Control, and National Health Services, Regulations and Coordination.

He was also a member of the Senate Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs. The PML-N stalwart was elected to the Senate on a general seat from Punjab.

The PML-N lawmaker was also a columnist for Daily Jang. —RT/Agency

## Pakistan Defeat Sri Lanka By Six Runs In ODI Series Opener

Pakistan grabbed a six-run victory over Sri Lanka following Salman Ali Agha's century and Harris Rauf's four-wicket haul in the first ODI match at Rawalpindi Cricket Stadium on Tuesday.

Chasing a daunting 300-run target, Sri Lanka could accumulate 293/9 in their allotted 50 overs despite Wanindu Hasaranga's gutsy half-century.

Hasaranga remained the top-scorer for the touring side with a valiant 59 off 52 deliveries until falling victim to Naseem Shah in the penultimate over when Sri Lanka needed 21 runs in nine balls.

Besides the all-rounder, middle-order batter Sadeera Samarawickrama (39), debutant opener Kamal Mishra (38) and captain Charith Asalanka (32) made significant contributions, but their efforts eventually proved insufficient to lead Sri Lanka to glory. Harris led the bowling charge for Pakistan with figures of 4/49 in his 10 overs, followed by Faheem Ashraf and Naseem Shah with two



each, while Mohammad Nawaz chipped in with one. Put into bat first, the Green Shirts accumulated 299/5 in their allotted 50 overs, courtesy of a vital fifth-wicket partnership between Agha and Talat.

The home side got off to a shaky start to their innings as in-form opener Saim Ayub (six) fell victim to Asitha Fernando in the fifth over with just 18 runs on the board. Following the early stutter, star batter Babar Azam and Fakhar Zaman added valuable runs to the total by putting together 54 runs for the second wicket.

With Babar and Fakhar in

the middle, Pakistan were comfortably placed at 68/1 in 17.4 overs, before Wanindu Hasaranga forced Sri Lanka's comeback by taking three wickets in quick succession.

The spinner dismissed Fakhar, Mohammad Rizwan (five) and Babar as Pakistan slipped to 95/4 in 23.2 overs. Fakhar and Babar made notable contributions to Pakistan's total with 32 and 29, respectively. Following the brief collapse, the all-rounder duo of Agha and Talat scripted an astounding turnaround by putting together 138 runs during their fifth-wicket partnership. —RT/Agency

## Modi Vows Retribution, Promises To Hunt Down Culprits Of New Delhi Car Blast



DELHI: Indian police are investigating a deadly car blast in New Delhi under a law used to fight "terrorism", an officer said on Tuesday, as Prime Minister Narendra Modi vowed to bring to justice all those responsible.

The explosion near the historic Red Fort on Monday evening killed at least eight people and injured 20. It was the first such blast in the heavily guarded city of more than 30 million since 2011.

"Today, I have come to Bhutan with a very heavy

heart," Modi said in Thimphu, the capital of the neighboring Himalayan nation, as he arrived on Tuesday for a scheduled visit.

"The horrific incident that happened in Delhi last evening has deeply disturbed everyone," Modi told a public meeting.

"Our agencies will get to the very bottom of this conspiracy. The conspirators behind this will not be spared. All those responsible will be brought to justice." —RT/Agency

## ATC Orders Passport Block For PTI Leaders In Sangjani Rally Case

ISLAMABAD: The Anti-Terrorism Court (ATC) has ordered the blocking of passports of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) leaders Omar Ayub and Zartaj Gul in connection with the Sangjani rally case.

According to media reports, Judge Tahir Abbas Supra of the Islamabad ATC conducted the hearing of the case related to the controversial Sangjani public gathering. During the proceedings, the court directed that the passports of the two PTI leaders be blocked immediately and reports on the action be submitted to the court.

In addition to the passport orders, the ATC also issued arrest warrants for Sheikh



Waqas Akram, another accused in the case. The court postponed the next hearing until December 3 to allow law enforcement agencies to execute the warrants and comply with the court's directives regarding the passports. The Sangjani rally case has been a subject of intense political and media attention,

with authorities investigating alleged violations of law and security protocols during the public gathering. By ordering the blocking of passports, the court aims to ensure that the accused remain within the country and are available for ongoing investigations and trial proceedings. —RT/Agency

## US Senate Passes Bill To End Shutdown, Awaits House Nod

US: The United States Senate on Monday approved a compromise that would end the longest government shutdown in US history, breaking a weeks-long stalemate that has disrupted food benefits for millions, left hundreds of thousands of federal workers unpaid and snarled air traffic.

The 60-40 vote passed with the support of nearly all of the chamber's Republicans and eight Democrats, who unsuccessfully sought to tie government funding to health subsidies that are due to expire at the end of the year. While the agreement sets up a December vote on those subsidies, which benefit 24 million Americans, it does not guarantee they will continue.

The deal would restore funding for federal agencies that lawmakers allowed to



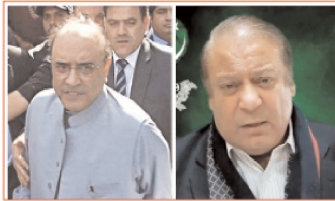
expire on October 1 and would stall President Donald Trump's campaign to downsize the federal workforce, preventing any layoffs until January 30.

It next heads to the Republican-controlled House of Representatives, where Speaker Mike Johnson has said he would like to pass it as soon as Wednesday and

send it on to Trump to sign into law. Trump has called the deal to reopen the government "very good".

The deal would extend funding through January 30, leaving the federal government for now on a path to keep adding about \$1.8 trillion a year to its \$38tr in debt. —RT/Agency

## Nation Grieves Passing Of Senator Irfan Siddiqui — Tributes Pour In

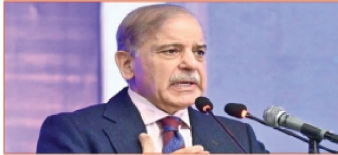

Speaking at the inaugural ceremony of the Parliamentary Speakers' Conference on Tuesday, he said a stable Afghanistan is essential for connectivity, growth and prosperity. "Afghanistan must realise that lasting peace can only be realised by reining in TTP and other terrorist groups operating from the Afghan territory," he said. The prime minister noted Pakistan has faced disturbances "both internally and externally" but remained steadfast in pursuing



the peace through sincere and honest efforts," he added. He warned that militant groups continue to imperil peace within Afghanistan and beyond its borders. Referring to last month's attacks on Pakistani border posts from the Afghan side, he said the response was "firm and decisive," intended to deliver an unforgettable lesson to those who targeted Pakistan. —RT/Agency
