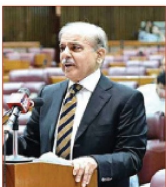
PM Shehbaz Hails Passage Of 27th Amendment As 'Milestone For National Unity'

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif said that the passage of 27th Constitutional Amendment is a historic day for national unity.

Addressing the National Assembly on Wednesday, he said that the dream of establishing constitutional courts envisioned in the Charter of Democracy has now been materialised.

The prime minister expressed heartfelt gratitude to lawmakers, congratulating them for supporting what he called a landmark reform.

Referring to the inclusion



of the Field Marshal title for Army Chief General Asim Munir, the prime minister said, "After the Marka-e-Haq, when we honoured General Asim Munir as Field Marshal, the entire na-

tion appreciated it. Now that we are incorporating it into the Constitution, what is wrong with that? Nations honour their heroes in this way."

He added that Pakistan now enjoys exceptional respect internationally, something that had been unimaginable before Shehbaz Sharif reaffirmed his stance against any step that could weaken the federation, saying, "The Kalabagh Dam may be in the national interest, but if it risks undermining the federation, I cannot support it."—RT/Agency

NA Endorses All 59 Clauses Of Landmark 27th Constitutional Amendment Bill

ISLAMABAD: The National Assembly on Wednesday approved all 59 clauses of the 27th Constitutional Amendment Bill amid the opposition's boycott, completing the clause-by-clause voting process.

The Bill has been approved in the Lower House, two days after the Senate approved the key legislation, which seeks major judicial and military reforms.

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) President Nawaz Sharif also attended the session in the Lower House of Parliament.

Following a two-day-long debate, Law Minister



Azam Nazeer Tarar moved the 27th Constitutional Amendment Bill in the National Assembly.

Speaking on the NA floor, Tarar said that the key features of the 27th Constitutional Amendment had already been presented in the

Senate. He added that amending the Constitution and laws was an evolutionary process.

The law minister added that all stakeholders were consulted regarding the proposed constitutional changes. He further clarified that Justice Yahya Afridi will continue to serve as the Chief Justice of Pakistan.

The key legislation — tabled by Law Minister Tarar after approval from the Senate on Monday — requires a two-thirds majority in the 336-member National Assembly for passage.

The ruling coalition appears well-positioned to secure the numbers, with the PML-N holding 125 seats, the PPP 74, MQM-P 22, PML-Q four, Istehkam-e-Pakistan Party four, and one seat each held by the PML-Z, Balochistan Awami Party (BAP), and National Peo-

ple Party.

The 59-clause amendment seeks to overhaul the country's military and judicial structures. It was moved by the law minister and secured 64 votes in the 96-member House, with no votes against it, as opposition lawmakers boycotted the proceedings and tore up their copies in protest.

Apart from treasury members, ANP's senators, PTI-backed Saifullah Abro, and JUI-F's Ahmed Khan also supported the bill. In a surprise move, Abro refrained from joining the protest and later announced his resignation from the Senate.—RT/Agency

Bilawal Asserts: 'No Force Can Undo The 18th Amendment' In NA Speech

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari on Tuesday strongly reaffirmed his party's unwavering commitment to the 18th Constitutional Amendment, declaring that no force or authority could reverse it.

Speaking during the National Assembly session, Bilawal said the 18th Amendment had empowered provinces by granting them constitutional autonomy and rights that were achieved through decades of democratic struggle.

"The 18th Amendment gave provinces their due rights and strengthened the federation. No one's father can undo it," Bilawal asserted, emphasizing that the amendment bore signatures from all political parties, reflecting a rare national consensus.

The PPP chairman said his party had always worked



toward consensus-based legislation, citing the example of the 26th Amendment, which took months of deliberation to finalize with agreement among all stakeholders. He claimed that even Maulana Fazlur Rahman had sought permission from the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) leadership to vote in favour of that amendment. Bilawal further revealed that the PPP's Central Executive Committee (CEC) had decided to support the government in the passage of the 27th Constitu-

tional Amendment, underscoring his party's resolve to uphold democratic and constitutional values. "We have decided that we will establish under the Constitutional Court at all costs," he added, stressing the importance of institutional reforms that ensure the supremacy of the Constitution. Concluding his speech, Bilawal Bhutto Zardari said the PPP's struggle has always centred on safeguarding the Constitution, strengthening democracy, and protecting the rights of provinces.

Pakistan Receives Second Shipment Of U.S. Crude Oil — Energy Ties Strengthen

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's energy landscape is undergoing a strategic recalibration with the arrival of its second shipment of American crude oil, signalling a pivotal shift in the nation's quest for energy security and economic efficiency.

The tanker MT Albany, laden with one million barrels of premium West Texas Intermediate (WTI) crude, successfully berthed at Cnergycio's offshore Single Point Mooring (SPM) terminal near Hub, Balochistan, on November 10, 2025.

This delivery is not an isolated event but part of a carefully structured energy corridor between Pakistan and the United States.

It follows the landmark



first shipment in October and precedes a third cargo scheduled for January 2026.

Cumulative, these three shipments represent a strategic investment of over \$200 million, moving Pakistan beyond its traditional reliance on Middle Eastern suppliers like Saudi Arabia and the UAE. This diversification is a core component of a broader US-Pakistan trade agreement aimed at strengthening bilateral economic co-operation.—RT/Agency

PM Shehbaz Convenes Emergency Cabinet Huddle Amid Soaring Security Fears

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has decided to convene an emergency meeting of the federal cabinet.

According to sources, the meeting is expected to take place at any time today. It will focus on the country's overall security situation, with key decisions anticipated in light of recent developments.

Cabinet members have been instructed to remain available and prepared for participation, though they have not yet been formally informed about the meeting's



agenda. It is worth mentioning that a day earlier, a suicide blast in Islamabad claimed 12 lives and injured 27 others. Pakistan has re-

Macron Draws Red Line: Warns Israel Against Any West Bank Annexation Plans

PARIS: French President Emmanuel Macron warned on Tuesday that any Israeli plans for annexation in the West Bank would be a "red line" and would provoke a European reaction.

He spoke as Palestinian president Mahmoud Abbas visited Paris one month into a fragile truce between Hamas and Israel, following two years of war triggered by the militant group's October 7, 2023, attack against Israel.

Abbas, 89, is the longtime head of the Palestinian Authority, which exercises limited control over parts of the Israeli-occupied West Bank, and is being considered to possibly assume governance in Gaza under the deal.

Macron, whose country in September recognised a Palestinian state, warned against any Israeli plans for annexation in the West Bank following an uptick in vio-



lence in the Palestinian territory.

"Plans for partial or total annexation, whether legal or de facto, constitute a red line to which we will respond strongly with our European partners," Macron said at a joint press conference with Abbas.

"The violence of the settlers and the acceleration of settlement projects are reaching new heights, threatening the stability of the West Bank and constitute violations of international law," the French president said.

Violence in the West Bank has soared since the war in Gaza broke out in October 2023.

At least 1,002 Palestinians, have been killed in the West Bank by Israeli forces or settlers since the start of the war in Gaza, according to the Palestinian health ministry.

During the same period, 43 Israelis, including soldiers, have been killed in Palestinian attacks in the West Bank, according to official Israeli figures.—RT/Agency

Islamabad Blast Probe: Motorcycle Courier Who Aided Suicide Bomber Arrested

ISLAMABAD: Police have arrested the motorcyclist who transported the suicide bomber to the District Judicial Complex in Islamabad's G-11 area ahead of Tuesday's deadly blast, it emerged on Wednesday.

The suicide explosion targeted the Islamabad District Judicial Complex, leaving 12 people martyred and at least 36 wounded.

The victims included lawyers and petitioners who came to the court.

Police said the attacker blew himself up as he approached a police vehicle, setting nearby cars ablaze and scattering debris across the area.



The rider — employed with an online service — dropped the attacker near the court, also known as G-11 kachehri, for a fare of Rs200, police sources told Media. They also said that efforts are continuing to track the bomber's movements from

Golra to the G-11 sector via Safe City cameras.

A report prepared by the investigation institutions had stated that the suicide bomber reached Islamabad on Friday and travelled to the court from Pirwadhai on a motorcycle.—RT/Agency

Nawaz Attends NA Session As Bilawal Extends Warm Greeting During Pivotal Debate

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) President and former Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif attended the National Assembly session on Wednesday, marking a significant political moment as lawmakers gathered to deliberate on crucial legislative matters, including the anticipated passage of the 27th Constitutional Amendment Bill.

Nawaz Sharif's arrival at Parliament was met with enthusiasm by party members, who warmly received him outside the Assembly hall. Inside the chamber, he exchanged greetings and handshakes with fellow lawmakers, reflecting a cordial and



cooperative atmosphere among parliamentary members.

In a symbolic and friendly gesture, Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari walked up to Nawaz Sharif's seat and shook hands with him, drawing attention from both benches and signaling a moment of mutual respect amid ongoing political discourse.—RT/Agency

Trump Highlights Vital Role Of International Students In Powering U.S. Economy

WASHINGTON: U.S. President Donald Trump has highlighted the crucial role of international students in sustaining American universities and the broader economy.

According to international media reports, Trump stated that students from abroad significantly strengthen the financial framework of U.S. educational institutions. He warned that without these students, dozens of universities could face closure, and a sharp decline in their numbers could "destroy half of the Ameri-



can university system."

Trump emphasized that the U.S. hosts students from China and many other countries. Limiting their enrollment, he said, would harm not only educational institutions but also the economy.—RT/Agency

Khawaja Asif Hits Back At Critics Of Judicial Reforms

ISLAMABAD: Federal Defence Minister Khawaja Asif has strongly criticized those sending letters opposing parliamentary decisions on judicial restructuring, urging them to remember the history of their own institutions.

Speaking to the media, Asif remarked that the judiciary has, in the past, been involved in controversial decisions, including the execution of former Prime Minister Zulfikar Ali Bhutto, and has repeatedly undermined the Constitution. He questioned whether those raising objections had forgotten these historical instances or were "suffering from selective amnesia."

The Defence Minister clarified that the current judicial restructuring does not



limit judicial independence, nor does it transfer powers to any other institution. Highlighting past judicial controversies, he referenced cases involving Justice Munir, Nasim Hasan Shah, Ishaq Hasan Khan, and the Panama case judges, claiming these instances demonstrated abuses of authority.

Asif emphasized that those who advocate for jus-

tice must also ensure their actions are fair and consistent. "Before writing letters, they should first examine themselves," he added, urging accountability and reflection among critics of the judicial reforms. The remarks come amid ongoing debates over the scope and impact of proposed changes to Pakistan's judicial framework.—RT/Agency

Afghan Government Condemns Islamabad Blast And Wana Cadet College Terror Attack

KABUL/ISLAMABAD: The Afghan government has strongly condemned the recent terrorist attacks in Islamabad and Wana.

According to media reports, the Afghan Ministry of Foreign Affairs issued a statement expressing deep sorrow over the tragic incidents. The statement described the Islamabad G-11 court blast and the attack on the educational institution in Wana as "regrettable" and firmly condemned both acts of terrorism. The Afghan government extended condolences to the families of the victims and prayed for the speedy recovery of the injured. The statement high-



lighted the loss of precious lives and reiterated Afghanistan's support in condemning such violent acts. It is reported that the Islamabad blast on November 11 resulted in 12 fatalities and 30 injuries, while the attack on the Cadet College in Wana two days earlier was foiled by security forces, who suc-

cessfully neutralized all four terrorists of the Fitna al-Khawarij group.

The Afghan Ministry emphasized the importance of regional cooperation in combating terrorism and called for continued efforts to ensure the safety and security of civilians in the region.—RT/Agency

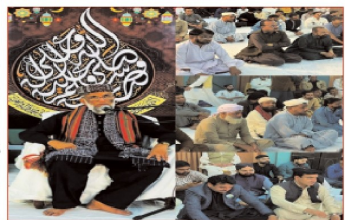
Abrar Ali Shah said the committee includes officials from the police, jail, women development, education, health, and social welfare departments. The committee will monitor the overall human

Imran Khan's Political Missteps Paved the Road to the 27th Amendment Earthquake

The passage of the 27th Constitutional Amendment marks a seismic shift in Pakistan's political and judicial order—one that has left the nation stunned, subdued, and uncertain about what comes next. While the ruling coalition now celebrates its sweeping two-thirds majority as a victory for stability and governance, history will remember this as the moment Pakistan's political balance was fundamentally rewritten. Yet amid the fanfare and fury, one man's political rigidity looms large in the background—former Prime Minister Imran Khan.

Khan's refusal to compromise, his defiance against dialogue, and his insistence on confronta-

tion over collaboration have, in many ways,



brought Pakistan to this juncture. His walkout politics and relentless attacks on institutions weakened his own leverage and alienated potential allies, making it easier for the ruling coalition to cement control. The 27th Amendment, which abolished the Supreme Court's suo motu powers and established a new Federal Constitutional Court, symbolizes not just a legal transformation but the triumph of the very system Khan sought to

dismantle.

Had Imran Khan shown even a flicker of political foresight or flexibility—had he worked within the system instead of trying to upend it—the dynamics of today's Pakistan might have been drastically different. Instead, his populist rigidity created a vacuum swiftly filled by his rivals.

For Imran Khan, this must serve as a long-overdue reckoning: real change comes not from the fringes of defiance but from the corridors of governance. If Pakistan is to move forward, egos must yield to pragmatism, and leadership must learn that reforming the system requires being part of it—not endlessly fighting against it.

Reece James Sounds Alarm Over Brutal Conditions Awaiting England in 2026 World Cup

England defender Reece James has warned his teammates about the "super difficult" conditions they could face at next year's 2026 World Cup in North America, drawing on his experience of extreme summer heat during Chelsea's Club World Cup campaign earlier this year.

James guided Chelsea through sweltering heat in Philadelphia and thunderstorms in Charlotte during the Club World Cup, held from June 14 to July 13 in the United States.

Reflecting on those challenges, he stressed that England will need to prepare carefully for the intense heat expected during the tournament. The 2026 World Cup will feature 104 matches across 16 host cities in the US, Canada, and Mexico, with temperatures in cities such as Dallas, Houston, Miami, Atlanta, Monterrey and Guadalajara frequently exceeding 33°C (91°F) during June and July. "Everyone is aware of that. We are trying to prepare as best we can for it. It's super difficult conditions to play in that heat, especially for us playing in



England, where we don't experience anything like that," James said.

"You feel the heat the minute you step outside the hotel. Once you're out there, you adapt the longer you are there. When you're settled in one place, you try to limit things where you can. Later kick-offs, when it's not so hot and humid, would definitely help," James noted that some venues, including Vancouver, Seattle, San Francisco and Toronto, are expected to offer milder conditions during next year's finals. However, he added that pitch quality can also compound the challenges. "The pitches when we were there weren't the greatest either, which made it a bit harder, but hopefully by the time the World Cup comes around, that will be better," he added. —Agency

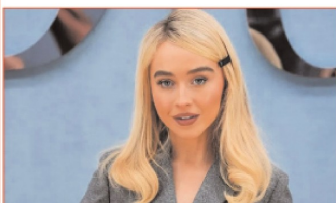
"I just tried my best out there and I'm really happy with how I played today. I missed a few shots and Kyren took full advantage to go 5-3 ahead," Xintong said.

Opposition To Launch Nationwide Protests Against 27th Amendment On Friday

ISLAMABAD: After the government passed the 27th Constitutional Amendment in the National Assembly, the head of the opposition alliance, Tehreek-e-Tahafuz Ayeen-e-Pakistan (TTAP), Mahmood Khan Achakzai, on Wednesday announced launching a public movement against the tweaks from Friday.

After the Senate, the National Assembly passed the 27th Constitutional Amendment Bill today amid an opposition walkout, which brought changes to the judicial structure and military command.

Achakzai, along with Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman Barrister Gohar Ali Khan, held a press conference in the Parliament House where they strongly criticised the newly-approved constitutional amendment.



The TTAP head said that they are ready to hold talks with the incumbent government, however, it would be organised to discuss return of the stolen mandate.

Gohar said that the amendments were brought to the parliament in haste and blamed the coalition government, ruled by the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) with its key ally — Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP), for making "decisions in personal interests". He centred that the federal government added clauses A and B to Article 260, making the post of the chief justice of Pakistan (CJP) a "musical chair" after the formation of the Federal Constitutional Court (FCC). The PTI chairman claimed that the said tweaks mentioned that the current CJP's post will be retained by the current top jurist, who is Justice Yahya Afridi of the Supreme Court, till completion of his tenure. —RT/Agency

Despite India's Boycott, Pakistan To Keep Engaging In Indus Water Treaty Proceedings

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan on Wednesday reaffirmed its commitment to the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT) arbitration process, announcing that it will continue to fully participate in the Neutral Expert proceedings in good faith, despite India's decision to halt its participation.

According to a statement issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MoFA), the Neutral Expert proceedings were initiated at India's request, with the next phase scheduled to take place in Vienna from November 17 to 21, 2025. The ministry noted that the Neutral Expert has ruled that India's non-participation could not operate as a bar to the proceedings going forward.

The Foreign Office also said that Pakistan had taken note of the Procedural Order issued by the Court of Arbitration in parallel with its latest decision. The order af-



firms that the Court will continue to conduct the arbitration in a phased manner while taking into account the Neutral Expert proceedings under Article IX and Annexure F of the IWT.

In its statement, the MoFA said Pakistan had also noted the decision of the Permanent Court of Arbitration (PCA) rendered on November 8, 2025, which offered helpful clarifications on aspects of the court's earlier award on Issues of General Interpretation of the Indus

Waters Treaty, published on 8 August 2025.

The PCA explained that the Court's clarifications cover the scope of Paragraph 8(a) of Annexure D, confirming that the prohibition extends to all design components capable of artificially raising water levels beyond the Full Pondage Level. It also affirmed that these design criteria are mandatory at the planning stage of such projects and cannot be replaced by operational restraints. —RT/Agency

Post-Mortems Completed For Victims Of Islamabad's G-11 Court Blast



ISLAMABAD: The post-mortem examinations of all individuals killed in the G-11 Court blast on Tuesday, November 11, have been completed.

According to media reports, the administration of Pakistan Institute of Medical Sciences (PIMS) confirmed that the bodies have been handed over to their families.

Among the deceased, the body of lawyer Zubair Aslam Ghuman was also released to his relatives. The identities of all victims have been officially confirmed.

Authorities reported that 13 injured individuals are still undergoing treatment, with one patient in critical condition. The incident continues to be investigated, and emergency services have been closely monitoring the situation to provide timely medical care to those affected.

Officials have appealed to the public and media to respect the privacy of the victims' families during this difficult time. —RT/Agency

Ex-CJP Jawwad S. Khawaja Challenges 27th Amendment In Supreme Court

ISLAMABAD: Former chief justice of Pakistan (CJP), Jawwad S. Khawaja, on Tuesday filed a constitutional petition in the Supreme Court against the federal government, challenging the proposed 27th Constitutional Amendment under Article 184(3) of the Constitution.

In his petition, the former CJP argued that the apex court's constitutional jurisdiction cannot be transferred to any other court or forum.

He urged the top court to strike down any amendment that seeks to curtail the Supreme Court's powers or limit its constitutional authority.

The former top judge also requested the court to suspend the implementation of the contentious provisions of the 27th Amendment until a final decision is reached on his petition.

The development came a



day after the Senate passed the 27th Constitutional Amendment Bill, which aims to overhaul the military and judicial structures, amid the opposition's walkout and protest, tearing their copies.

On Monday, a group of retired judges and senior lawyers penned a letter to Chief Justice of Pakistan Yahya Afridi, seeking a full court meeting over the proposed 27th Constitutional Amendment.

The letter — written by

Advocate Faisal Siddiqui and also signed by former Supreme Court's senior puisne judge, Justice (ret'd) Mushir Alam, and ex-Sindh High Court senior puisne judge, Justice (ret'd) Nadeem Akhtar — expressed "deep sadness and regret" over what they termed the "greatest threat" to the apex court since its establishment in 1956, arising from the proposed 27th Constitutional Amendment. —RT/Agency

Epstein Files Released: U.S. House Democrats Claim Trump 'Knew About The Girls'

U.S. Democrats released emails on Wednesday in which convicted sex offender Jeffrey Epstein suggested that United States President Donald Trump was aware of the financier's sexual abuse and definitely "knew about the girls".

Trump has denied any involvement in or knowledge of the sex-trafficking activities of his former friend, who died by suicide in federal prison in 2019 as he was awaiting trial.

But Democrats on the House Oversight Committee said the emails "raise serious questions about Donald Trump and his knowledge of Epstein's horrific crimes".

The furor around the disgraced financier is still roiling Trump's administration four months after his Justice Department effectively



closed the case, announcing there was no more information to share.

Democrats in the House — keen to capitalise on the simmering controversy — have been trying to force a vote that would compel publication of the full Epstein case files.

The newly released emails were written to longtime associate Ghislaine Maxwell, who was convicted of sex trafficking after Epstein's death, and author Michael Wolff. —RT/Agency

Barrister Gohar Declares Nawaz Politically Irrelevant In Pakistan's New Power Order

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman Barrister Gohar Ali Khan on Wednesday announced that the opposition will stage a walkout and protest against the 27th Constitutional Amendment.

Speaking to the media in Islamabad, Barrister Gohar said that Nawaz Sharif has become irrelevant in Pakistan's politics.

"We have already announced that we will not be part of this amendment," Barrister Gohar said. "We will walk out, protest, and deliver speeches against it."

He added that whether Nawaz Sharif attends the National Assembly session or not, he no longer holds politi-



cal relevance in the country.

"Nawaz Sharif thought he would be brought back and welcomed with a red carpet," Gohar remarked. "But no one in Parliament rolled out a red carpet for him."

Notably, Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) President Nawaz Sharif is set to attend today's National Assembly session to vote for the 27th Constitutional Amendment. —RT/Agency

U.S. Aircraft Carrier's Arrival In Latin America Sparks Venezuela Tensions

US: The Gerald Ford aircraft carrier strike group has moved into the Latin America region, US officials said on Tuesday, dramatically escalating a military buildup that has deepened tensions with Venezuela. President Donald Trump ordered the deployment of the Ford last month, adding to the eight warships, a nuclear submarine and F-35 aircraft already in the Caribbean. The Pentagon confirmed the arrival, which was first reported by Reuters, saying in a statement it would help "disrupt narcotics trafficking and degrade and dismantle Transnational Criminal Organizations." Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro has repeat-



edly alleged that the U.S. buildup is designed to drive him from power, Washington in August doubled its reward for information leading to Maduro's arrest to \$50 million, accusing him of links to drug trafficking and criminal groups that Maduro denies. The US military has carried out at least 19 strikes so far against suspected drug

vessels in the Caribbean and off the Pacific coasts of Latin America, killing at least 76 people.

When the US first announced the Ford's deployment, Maduro warned that if the US ever intervened in the country, "millions of men and women with rifles would march across the country." —RT/Agency

Pakistan And Tajikistan Strengthen Defence Cooperation Amid Heightened Regional Security Talks

RAWALPINDI: Colonel General Sobirzoda Emomali Abdulrahim, Defence Minister of Tajikistan, called on General Sahir Shamsad Mirza, Chairman Joint Chiefs of Staff Committee (JCSC), at the Joint Staff Headquarters in Rawalpindi.

The meeting covered a broad range of subjects relating to bilateral interests, with particular focus on the prevailing global and regional security environment.

Both sides reviewed ongoing collaborations and explored new measures to expand the scope and scale of military cooperation between Pakistan and Tajikistan. General Mirza emphasised that Pakistan and Tajikistan, as



brotherly nations with shared regional interests, continue to work closely to strengthen and broaden defence ties. He reiterated Pakistan's commitment to regional peace, stability, and cooperation with Central Asian partners. —RT/Agency
