Pakistan and Jordan move to elevate strategic and economic partnership

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan and Jordan on Saturday reaffirmed their commitment to bolster bilateral strategic and economic ties, with a focus on expanding mutual cooperation at regional and international forums. The development came during a meeting between Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and Jordan's King Abdullah II ibn Al Hussein, who arrived in the country earlier today on a two-day visit, state-run. The two leaders emphasised the need to deepen bilateral relations and explore opportunities to enhance cooperation across several sectors, including trade, investment, health, education, and defence. Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar, Chief of Army



Staff Field Marshal Syed Asim Munir, and Information Minister Attaullah Tarar were among the attendees of the meeting. PM Shehbaz welcomed King Abdullah II's visit to Pakistan, terming it as a "testament to the enduring friendship between Pakistan and Jordan". Jordan's king appreciated Pakistan's continued support for Jordan's role in

King Abdullah II on recent developments in the region, particularly in Afghanistan and India. King Abdullah II recognised Islamabad's role in maintaining peace and stability in the region. The two leaders also attended a ceremony for exchanging memorandums of understanding (MoUs) to enhance cooperation in media, culture, and education. PM Shehbaz then hosted King Abdullah II and his delegation for a dinner. Before his meeting with PM Shehbaz, the Jordanian leader was presented with a guard of honour at the PM House after his arrival in the country. President Asif Ali Zardari and the premier were joined by First Lady Aseefa Bhutto-Zardari, PPP Chairman Bilawal

Bhutto-Zardari, and other officials in the welcoming ceremony for Jordan's king at PAF Base Nur Khan in Rawalpindi. President Zardari expressed hope that King Abdullah II's visit would "give bilateral relations a new strategic dimension". The ties between the two countries are based on historical brotherhood, mutual trust, and shared values, he added. A special investiture ceremony is also scheduled at the Aiwan-e-Sadr (President House) to confer the highest civilian award upon King Abdullah II. King Abdullah II's visit to Pakistan comes a month after Chief of Army Staff (COAS) Field Marshal Syed Asim Munir visited the country.—RT/Agency

Russia steps in, offers to broker peace between Pakistan and Afghanistan



MOSCOW: Russia has extended an offer to mediate in the ongoing tensions between Pakistan and Afghanistan. Russia's Foreign Ministry spokesperson, Maria Zakharova, emphasised that stability in the region is a top priority. She warned that escalating border tensions pose a threat not only to the two nations but also to the wider international community. Zakharova urged both Pakistan and Afghanistan to exercise restraint, stressing that negotiations remain the only sustainable solution. She noted that both countries are important partners and highlighted Moscow's readiness to facilitate dialogue. Pakistan and Afghanistan have previously engaged in

President Zardari approves sweeping amendments for Army, Air Force and Navy

ISLAMABAD: President Asif Ali Zardari on Saturday signed the Pakistan Army, Air Force and Navy Amendment Bills 2025 into law following their approval by parliament. According to notifications shared by the PPP on the social media platform X, the president gave his assent to the Pakistan Army (Amendment) Bill 2025, the Pakistan Air Force (Amendment) Bill 2025 and the Pakistan Navy (Amendment) Bill 2025. The bills, presented by deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar and Defence Minister Khawaja Asif, were passed by both the lower and upper houses of parliament — the National Assembly and the Senate — this week. What are the key changes? Under the Pakistan Army (Amendment) Bill, the COAS will concurrently



serve as Chief of the Defence Forces for five years. Field Marshal Munir's tenure will restart from the date the new notification is issued. Article 243 provisions applicable to a Field Marshal will also apply to a General promoted to the rank. The federal government may authorise the Vice Chief of Army Staff or Deputy Chief of Army Staff to exercise powers of the COAS, under written orders issued on the

CDF's recommendation. The legislation further clarifies that once the first notification for the dual office is issued, the incumbent COAS' tenure will be deemed to have recommenced from the date of that notification. The federal government will determine the duties and responsibilities of the CDF, including multi-domain integration, restructuring and ensuring jointness across the armed forces.—RT/Agency

Cyber firm flags seven relentless cyber threats stalking Pakistan

ISLAMABAD: A global cybersecurity firm has identified seven advanced persistent threat (APT) groups targeting Pakistan's government, intelligence agencies, oil and gas industry, and corporate sector in a bid to steal sensitive information. The News reported on Saturday it said there are around one million such attacks every month, meaning Pakistan faces cyberattacks on a per-minute basis. The attempts seek to extract vital data from devices such as computers, laptops and mobile phones, and in some cases via insecure Wi-Fi networks. According to the data, more than 5.3 million on-device attacks were detected in Pakistan in the first nine months



(January to September) of the current calendar year, compared to 2.5 million web threats over the same period. The data is stolen and then placed on the Dark Web for various reasons. The banking and financial sector, including insurance companies, also faced such attacks, but they were reluctant to share details. During a media briefing session here on Friday, Dmitry Berezin, Kaspersky's Global Security Expert, focused on pressing cyberthreats facing the country, including exploits, ransomware, and advanced targeted attacks. "Understanding the growing and increasingly sophisticated cyberthreat landscape is crucial for organisations, while individuals should also stay aware and follow fundamental cyber hygiene principles," Kaspersky advised.—RT/Agency

UK magazine alleges Bushra Bibi's deep sway over key state decisions, Tarar weighs in

LAHORE: Federal Minister for Information Attaullah Tarar has said that a British magazine has published a story alleging that the wife of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder, Bushra Bibi, played a decisive role in state matters and influenced major government decisions. Speaking to the media in Lahore on Friday, Tarar claimed that the PTI founder would consult Bushra Bibi—not experts—before taking important decisions. He said that international



publications are now reporting that "all decisions were being made by one woman," adding that Bushra Bibi, under the guise of spirituality, was directing both political and economic affairs

of the country. Tarar argued that these revelations further expose what he described as "hypocrisy, falsehood, and deceit" at the heart of the PTI founder's politics.—RT/Agency

Pakistan envoy urges bold, economically driven reset in ties with Washington

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's Ambassador to the United States Rizwan Saeed Sheikh met US Congressman John Larson in Hartford to discuss strengthening the long-standing and consequential bilateral partnership between Islamabad and Washington. Highlighting the significance of Pak-US relations, Sheikh emphasised that the relationship had consistently proven vital not only for both nations but for the

wider free world. The ambassador highlighted the current unprecedented positive momentum in bilateral ties and called for transforming the goodwill into a strategic, economically entrenched partnership focused on mutually profitable propositions. He underscored Pakistan's improving economic indicators, including single-digit inflation, upgraded credit ratings by all three major agencies, and ongoing International Monetary Fund (IMF) engagement, as evidence of stability and opportunity. He added that sectors for collaboration included information technology (where Pakistan offered a 70% cost advantage over the US) and remained competitive with regional peers, enhanced US agricultural exports (cotton, soybeans), energy, and investment through the Special Investment Facilitation Council (SIFC).—RT/Agency

Trump says will sue BBC for up to US\$5 billion over video edit



WASHINGTON: US President Donald Trump said he would sue the BBC for up to US\$5 billion after the British broadcaster apologised for a misleading edit of one of his speeches but said it would not pay damages. "We'll sue them for anywhere between a billion and five billion dollars, probably some time next week. I think I have to do it. They've even admitted that they cheated," Trump told reporters aboard Air Force One. Trump's lawyers sent the BBC a letter on Monday accusing it of defaming the president with the video of the speech before the 2021 US Capitol riot and giving it until Friday to apologise and pay compensation. "The people of the UK are very angry about what happened, as you can imagine, because it shows the BBC is fake news," Trump said. He added that he planned to raise the BBC issue with British Prime Minister Keir Starmer, who has backed the broadcaster's

Iran's Revolutionary Guards confirm seizure of oil tanker in Gulf waters

IRAN: Iran's Revolutionary Guards confirmed on Saturday that they had seized an oil tanker in the Gulf off the country's coast, a day after security companies determined they were likely responsible after a judicial authority ordered the seizure of the cargo of an oil tanker with the trade name Talara and the flag of the Marshall Islands, the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) rapid reaction units of the naval forces monitored its movements and intercepted and seized it, said a statement from the IRGC, the ideological arm of the Islamic republic's military. "The tanker was found to be in violation of the law by carrying unauthorised cargo," the statement continued,



adding it "was carrying 30,000 tonnes of petrochemical cargo and was heading to Singapore". The vessel had departed from Ajman in the United Arab Emirates (UAE) and was heading south through the Strait of Hormuz when it was approached by three small boats, after which it made a "sudden course deviation", maritime security company Ambrey said. The

US Navy had earlier said it was "actively monitoring the situation". "Commercial vessels are entitled to largely unimpeded rights of navigation and commerce on the high seas," said the US 5th Fleet, which patrols the region. The Strait of Hormuz, a vital waterway for global oil and liquefied natural gas, has previously been the scene of similar incidents.—RT/Agency

Five militants taken down in high-intensity joint Police-CTD operation in Bannu, Lakki Marwat

PESHAWAR: Police and the Counter Terrorism Department (CTD) eliminated five militants during a joint intelligence-based operation in Bannu and Lakki Marwat, according to a media report issued by the Central Police Office (CPO) Peshawar on Friday.



Officials said the action was carried out as part of an intensified crackdown against the militant group referred to as Khawarij, targeting their hideouts in the two districts where they had reportedly been planning subversive activities. Law enforcement agencies launched coordinated raids after receiving credible intelligence about the presence of armed militants in the area. During the operation, the militants opened fire on security personnel, triggering a heavy exchange of gunfire. Police and CTD officials effectively retaliated, resulting in the killing of all five militants involved. The CPO report confirmed that none of the police personnel were harmed during the encounter, and all members of the operational teams remained safe. Authorities added that the militants were linked to recent terrorist plots aimed at destabilising the region. Weapons, ammunition, and communication devices were recovered from the site, and forensic teams have begun examining the seized materials.—RT/Agency

Azma Bukhari Hits Hard at Imran, Backs Damning Report on Bushra Bibi

LAHORE: Punjab Information Minister Azma Bukhari has strongly criticized Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder and his wife, Bushra Bibi, claiming that for four years, key aides—including Coach and Pirmi—misled the party leader while Bushra Bibi allegedly facilitated "halal corruption." Responding to a special report by an international magazine concerning Bushra Bibi, Bukhari stated that the findings were "100 percent accurate and fact-based." She said the report highlights Bushra Bibi's influence and exposed the hidden "devilish" elements behind alleged pseudo-spiritual practices. Azma Bukhari further accused PTI aides—Pinky, Gogi, Coach, and Buzdar—of manipulating the party leader for four years, asserting that while "fake spiritual centers" flourished, the country and its economy suffered. She said the international report sheds light on how personal influence and superstition undermined governance and accountability during PTI's tenure.—RT/Agency

Lahore Suffocates as Air Pollution Soars to Deadly 'Hazardous' Levels

LAHORE: Air quality in Lahore has deteriorated to dangerous levels, with particulate matter (PM) readings reaching 533 micrograms per cubic meter, according to the Air Quality Index (AQI). The city now ranks as the most polluted among major global cities, surpassing New Delhi in

India, which stands second, and Kolkata in third place. Karachi ranks sixth, with PM levels recorded at 164 micrograms per cubic meter.—RT/Agency

Mysticism, Power and a Nuclear State: Pakistan Cannot Afford a Rasputin Problem

The revelations published by The Economist's 1843 Magazine — penned by respected journalist Owen Bennett-Jones — should jolt Pakistan into a moment of national introspection. This is not a routine political hit job, nor the usual partisan mudslinging. It is a serious assessment from one of the world's most credible publications, warning of something profoundly alarming: the possibility that a modern nuclear state of 250 million people may have been influenced not by institutions, advisors, or democratic processes, but by mysticism channelled through the former first lady, Bushra Bibi.

The article's claims are chilling. Decisions of state allegedly filtered through spiritual rituals, intelligence inputs relayed as "divine intuition," and senior aides frustrated by what they perceived as governance dictated by esoteric

practices rather than competence. Whether every detail is



fully accurate or partly coloured by disgruntled former staff, the seriousness of the allegations cannot be ignored. The Economist is not a tabloid, and Owen Bennett-Jones is not a lightweight. To dismiss this as mere propaganda is to avoid confronting a deeper systemic rot.

Pakistan — a country with nuclear weapons, a fragile trillion Dollar economy that has huge potential, and immense global scrutiny — cannot be run on the whims of any unelected figure, mystical or otherwise. History is

filled with cautionary tales of Rasputin-like influences compromising leaders, destabilizing courts, and weakening nations. No spouse, advisor, spiritual guide, or confidant — whether associated with Imran Khan or any other leader — can be allowed such unaccountable sway.

And while Imran Khan once commanded a near-cult following that spanned continents, that sheen is undeniably fading and fading fast. Increasing numbers of Pakistanis — both at home and abroad — are beginning to see through the facade as the idiosyncrasies, misjudgments, and governance follies continue to surface. Articles such as this one, published in reputable international outlets, are accelerating that shift in perception. It is a moment of reckoning not just for Khan, but for a nation long held hostage by personality politics over institutional sanity.

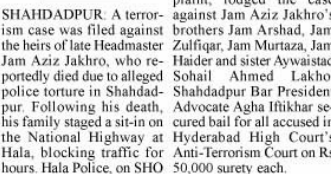

Rehan Ahmed has been ruled out of any further participation on the England Lions tour of Australia after suffering a right lower leg strain during the Ashes warm-up match against England in Perth.

Legspinner Rehan batted at No. 5 for the Lions, making 16 off 41 balls on day one before becoming one of six wickets for England captain, Ben Stokes. He played no part with the ball, or in the Lions' second innings, with the ECB announcing afterwards that he would return home to begin his recovery.

Rehan had signed up to play for Hobart Hurricanes in the 2025-26 BBL, but the BBC reported that the

injury was not expected to impact his involvement in the competition, which starts in a month's time.

England Lions are scheduled to play another four-day match at Lilac Hill, against a Cricket Australia XI, next week, before a one-off unofficial Test against Australia A in December. The Lions are also expected to be involved in a pink-ball tour game between England and the Prime Minister's XI in Canberra between the first and second Ashes Tests. It had been speculated that Rehan, who missed out on selection as the second spinner in the main Ashes squad to Will Jacks, could stay on with England after the Lions programme concluded.—Agency

KKR Shake-Up as Venkatesh Iyer Leads Star-Studded List of Released Players

Venkatesh Iyer, who made a name for himself and was elevated to the national team following a strong IPL debut season in 2021 for Kolkata Knight Riders (KKR), is among the players being released by the three-time champions.

ESPNcricinfo has learned that Iyer, who was bought for a record INR 23.75 crore at the IPL 2025 mega auction by KKR, who used a right-to-match card to get him, is part of a lengthy list of high-profile names who are not being retained by the franchise.

The other high-profile players being let go are the South African duo of Anrich Nortje (bought for INR 6.5 crore) and Quinton de Kock



(INR 3.6 crore), Australian quick Spencer Johnson (INR 2.8 crore), Afghanistan wicketkeeper-batter Rahmanullah Gurbaz (INR 2 crore) and England allrounder Moeen Ali (INR 2 crore).

The uncapped Indian pair of Luvnith Sisodia and Chetan Sakariya, who had replaced the injured Umran Malik last season, are also being released.

After making a big impression in his debut IPL season - which came after he had starred for Madhya Pradesh in the domestic limited-overs tournaments in 2020-21 - Iyer had a quiet IPL 2022, but was again a star for KKR in IPL 2023, when he scored 404 runs, including a century, to average

28.86 at a strike rate of 145.85 for the season.

A key part of the team, he has even led the side on occasion and, last year, was talked about as a possible captain before Ajinkya Rahane was handed the reins. As it happened, Iyer scored just 142 runs in 11 games at a strike rate of 139.22.

KKR, who won the IPL in 2024, finished near the bottom of the table the following season. Among the players to perform poorly was de Kock (152 runs in eight innings at a strike rate of 129.91), while the likes of Nortje, Johnson, Gurbaz and Moeen didn't get too many opportunities for one reason or another and weren't too impressive when fielded.—Agency

Jamie Smith ensured the game wrapped up quickly, clubbing an unbeaten 39 off 22 while Ben Stokes finished 15 not out as England hauled in the target in just 34.4 overs.

There had been an unknown over whether the final day would meander into an early finish or whether a chase late in the day would be conjured.—Agency

India Close In on Triumph After Chaotic 15-Wicket Day at Eden Gardens

South Africa 159 and 93 for 7 (Bavuma 29*, Jadeja 4-29) lead India 189 (Rahul 39, Harmer 4-30, Jansen 3-35) by 63 runs

India started the second day 122 runs behind in the first innings with nine wickets in hand. Less than six dramatic hours of cricket later, they were sensing a win, having reduced South Africa to effectively 63 for 7 in their second innings. Fifteen wickets fell on the day, Shubman Gill retired with a neck spasm, 39 remained the top score in the Test, and 57 the top partnership. This was the lowest top score in the first two innings of a Test in India, and the lowest in any Test since Durban 2010-11 between the same sides.



Absolutely nobody predicted the pitch would turn out to be so difficult to bat on. It looked like a normal Indian track, good for batting for first two days, but the top surface began to come off in the second half of the first day. On the second day, it became near unplayable. Even the fast bowlers drew generous

help to take 11 of the 26 wickets to fall.

The pitch might seem at odds with India's public utterances after the series loss to New Zealand last year that they want to play on more balanced surfaces, but commentator Dinesh Karthik said on air that it was not watered on the day before the Test, which

comes across as unusual. What wasn't unusual was that the best player on this moving day was Ravindra Jadeja, who scored 27 largely trouble-free runs before his old-fashioned technique of hiding the bat behind the pad got him out lbw to Simon Harmer.

Harmer himself showed all the hype was real, that he is now a vastly improved bowler to the one that showed up in India 10 years ago, taking 4 for 30 to keep South Africa in arrears of only 30 after being bowled out for 159 on the first day. Jadeja, though, showed 30 was plenty with an unerring unbroken spell of 13-3-29-4 as South Africa ended the day on 93 for 7.—Agency

ICC Unveils Women's Emerging Nations Trophy in Major Global Expansion



A new global tournament, the ICC Women's Emerging Nations Trophy, involving eight teams from four continents, will be played from November 20 to 30 in Bangkok, Thailand, Papua New Guinea, Netherlands, UAE, Scotland, Namibia, Tanzania and Uganda will take part in the inaugural edition.

The trigger for the tournament, an ICC statement said, was the success of the recent ODI World Cup in India and Sri Lanka, where "more than 500 million viewers in India" were recorded and there was also "significant growth in viewership across countries".

"Nearly 300,000 fans attended matches across India and Sri Lanka and the event concluded with India becoming the first Asian team to lift the Women's Cricket World Cup, a watershed moment in the evolution of the sport and the socio-cultural context of gender roles," an ICC statement said. "Building on the extraordinary impetus provided by the marquee event, the ICC continues to invest in creating a sustainable future for women's cricket. The Women's Emerging Nations Trophy is part of a new three-tier development pathway designed to offer high-performance exposure to emerging nations."

Sanjay Gupta, the ICC chief executive, said, "It is the ICC and the Chair's [Jay Shah] vision to sustainably expand cricket's footprint across the world and grow the women's game. Providing elite athletes from emerging nations more opportunities to play at the highest level is aimed at fast-tracking their development and improving the competitiveness of their teams.—Agency

"The exempted heavy vehicles would also be allowed only during the scheduled time," DIG said.—RT/Agency

MQM Under Fire After PTI's Mobeen Breaks Ranks to Back 27th Amendment

Karachi Administration Reopens 255 Cafes and Hotels After SOP Compliance Drive

KARACHI: The Karachi administration has de-sealed 255 roadside cafes and hotels that were previously closed during operations against encroachments on footpaths and roads, after the businesses fulfilled comprehensive legal requirements. The committee, headed by Additional Commissioner Ghulam Mehdi Shah, approved new standard operating procedures (SOPs), which hotel owners and associations have formally agreed to in writing and via affidavits. According to the SOPs, no business will be allowed to occupy space on roads wider than 100 feet. Any obstruction on footpaths or roads will require verification by the Traffic Police and local authorities, followed by a No Objection Certificate (NOC) from the relevant Deputy Commissioner.—RT/Agency

Transparency International Sounds Alarm Over Port Qasim's Rs60bn Dredging Scandal

KARACHI: A major controversy has surfaced involving Port Qasim Authority (PQA) after reports revealed an alleged attempt to award a Rs60 billion dredging contract through a direct, non-competitive process. According to Geo News, the move included presenting a "false justification" by citing urgent instructions supposedly issued by the prime minister. Transparency International Pakistan has formally requested the prime minister's intervention, highlighting serious concerns over violations of procurement laws. In a letter addressed to the PM's adviser, the watchdog stated that it received a complaint accusing PQA and the newly established National Dredging and Marine Services (NDMS) of preparing to award the country's largest maritime dredging contract to a private firm without competitive bidding.—RT/Agency

His remains were moved to Jinnah Postgraduate Medical Centre (JPMC) while an inquiry was initiated.—RT/Agency

Young Man Gunned Down in Targeted Killing on Abu al-Hasan Isfahani Road

KARACHI: A young man was shot dead in a targeted attack on Abu al-Hasan Isfahani Road, according to media reports. The incident occurred when armed assailants opened fire on the victim while he was riding a motorcycle. The initial burst of gunfire caused the young man to fall to the ground. Witnesses reported that within a minute, two armed men on another motorcycle returned to the spot and fired multiple additional shots at the injured victim to ensure he was killed. During the escape, one of the assailants reportedly stopped an online food delivery rider, sat behind him, and fled the scene. Police officials said the attack appears to be a targeted killing, possibly motivated by personal enmity. They added that the circumstances of the incident are unusual and the case remains shrouded in mystery as investigations continue.—RT/Agency

Dust Storm Danger: Viral Infections Explode Across Karachi



KARACHI: A surge in viral infections is being reported across Karachi as changing weather and rising dust pollution trigger widespread illness. According to media reports, cases of flu, cough, cold, and high fever have spiked dramatically, with hundreds of patients arriving daily at hospitals city-wide. Major hospitals—including Civil, Jinnah, and Abbasi Shaheed—are receiving nearly 6,000 patients every day. Doctors warn that pollution, dirt, and dust are driving the outbreak. Experts advise wearing masks, avoiding dusty areas, washing hands frequently, and eating clean, home-cooked food.—RT/Agency

Sindh High Court Demands Complete Land Records of Malir Villagers

KARACHI: The Sindh High Court has directed the Deputy Commissioner Malir and Survey Superintendent, Board of Revenue, to submit complete records, including survey reports, of lands, villages, and graveyards in Deh Dando, Deh Kotero, and Deh Joreji by November 26, 2025. Villagers of Wali Dad Salar, Muhammad Khan Salar, Dodo Kabeer, and other areas have expressed hope that the order will clarify land boundaries and help resolve longstanding disputes over ancestral properties.

Razaqabad Tragedy as Speeding Dumper Crushes Rickshaw Driver

KARACHI: A tragic accident occurred near Razaqabad Training Center in Malir when a speeding dumper collided with an Hiac van and a rickshaw, killing rickshaw driver Rahim Bakhsh, 45, on the spot. Several others were injured and rushed to Jinnah Hospital for treatment. Rescue officials and police confirmed that the dumper lost control while turning due to excessive speed, first hitting the Hiac and then the rickshaw, which was completely destroyed. The dumper driver fled, and the vehicle has been impounded for investigation. Heavy vehicle accidents are on the rise in Karachi, with trailers, water tankers, and dumpers causing dozens of fatalities this year. Traffic police warn that unmonitored heavy vehicles pose a major safety risk, emphasizing the ban on dumpers and tankers operating without trackers.

Two Lives Lost in Separate Heavy Traffic Mishaps Across Karachi

KARACHI: Two more lives were lost in alleged heavy traffic-related accidents in Karachi. In the first incident at Razaqabad, a dumper collided with a passenger van and a rickshaw, killing one person and injuring several others. The deceased was identified as Rahim Bakhsh, the rickshaw driver. The second accident occurred near Chattri Chowranghi in Korangi, where a trailer ran over a pedestrian. Police said the identity of the deceased has not yet been established, and the body was transferred to a hospital for further procedures.—RT/Agency

Fuel Dealers Warn of Crisis as Artificial Diesel Shortage Hits Pumps

KARACHI: Fuel traders warn that a manufactured shortage of high-speed diesel is affecting petrol pumps nationwide, calling on the government to act before conditions deteriorate. The News reported on Saturday. In a letter to the chairman of the Oil and Gas Regulatory Authority (Ogra), the Petrol Pump Dealers Association said oil marketing companies (OMCs) have been limiting diesel supplies for the past week. According to the dealers, some companies are delivering very small amounts, while others are not supplying fuel at all. Because of this, many pumps are running dry and are unable to serve customers. Dealers say they place orders that later get cancelled, and fuel trucks are left waiting for hours without being loaded.—RT/Agency

Federal Government Slashes Debt by Rs1,283 Billion in First Quarter

ISLAMABAD: The federal government has reduced its total debt by Rs1,283 billion during the first quarter of the current fiscal year, according to media reports. By September 2025, the government's total debt stood at Rs76,605 billion, down from Rs77,458 billion in August 2025. The decline was driven by a reduction in both domestic and external borrowing. Domestic debt decreased by Rs649 billion in a single month, falling from Rs53,424 billion in August to Rs53,424 billion in September. Similarly, external debt dropped by Rs203 billion during the same period, from Rs23,385 billion in August to Rs23,181 billion in September. Officials stated that the decline reflects continued efforts to manage the fiscal deficit and improve debt sustainability. Analysts said the reduction, if sustained, could ease pressure on public finances and support macroeconomic stability. The government continues to monitor debt trends closely while exploring avenues to maintain fiscal discipline in the coming months.—Agency

Congo, M23 sign framework for peace in Qatar, more steps needed

DOHA: The Democratic Republic of Congo and the M23 rebel group signed on Saturday a framework agreement for a peace deal aimed at ending fighting in eastern Congo that has killed thousands of people and displaced hundreds of thousands more this year.

The agreement was signed by representatives from both sides at a ceremony in the Qatari capital Doha.

It was the latest of several documents that have been signed in recent months as part of efforts, backed by the United States and Qatar, to end the decades-long conflict in

Congo that has often threatened to escalate into a full-blown regional war.

The framework was described by US and Qatari officials as an important step to peace but one of many that lie ahead.

The top US envoy to the region, Massad Boulos told Reuters the framework covered eight protocols, and that work still needed to be done to agree on how to implement six of them.

Boulos also acknowledged that implementing the first two protocols concern-

ing the exchange of prisoners and the monitoring of a ceasefire, agreed in recent months, had been slow.

"Yes, they were a little bit slow in the first few weeks," he told reporters after the signing. "Yes, people were expecting to see probably some immediate results on the ground, but this is a process... This is not a light switch that you just switch on and off."

M23, in the latest of a string of actions supported by neighbouring Rwanda, seized Goma, eastern Congo's largest city, in January and went on to make gains across North Kivu and South Kivu provinces.

Rwanda has long denied allegations that it has helped M23, which has seized more territory in Congo than it has ever previously held.

In Congo, the violence has continued through the various diplomatic processes in Washington and Doha. On Friday, local officials reported that as many as 28 people killed by Islamic State-allied militants in eastern North Kivu province.

Qatar has hosted multiple rounds of direct talks between the Congo government and the rebels going back to April, but they have dealt largely with preconditions and confidence-building measures. —RT/Agency

Moonis Elahi gains major reprieve as Interpol closes two-year probe

LONDON/LYON: The General Secretariat of the International Criminal Police Organisation (Interpol) has dropped its probes into PTI leader Moonis Elahi after investigating him for nearly two years on the complaints filed by Pakistani authorities — including a Gujarat murder case registered against him in June 2023 when he was in London.

The Interpol has formally certified that Elahi, 49, is not currently the subject of any Interpol notice or diffusion based on Pakistan's request seeking criminal charges and extradition of the PTI leader.

A credible source at the organisation told media that Barcelona-based PTI leader "Elahi is not listed in its system under any form of international alert" after an investigation that lasted nearly two years.



Credible sources at the Interpol have confirmed that it dropped a long-running investigation into Elahi after establishing that not enough evidence exists against him of the alleged wrongdoings, as complained by the Pakistani authorities. Correspondence sent by the Pakistani authorities to Interpol alleged that Elahi is sought in Pakistan by the Federal Investigation Agency (FIA), National Accountability Bureau (NAB), Anti-Corruption Establishment (ACE) and Punjab Police for murder, money laundering, bribery, fraud and misuse of authority. The Pakistani authorities had repeatedly asked Interpol for a Red Notice and extradition in money-laundering and other cases since early 2023, requesting that Interpol hand over the PTI leader and former federal minister to Pakistani authorities. In February and July 2024, the FIA told courts that a Red Notice request for Elahi was with Interpol and still "under process". —RT/Agency

Justice Shams Mehmood Mirza resigns from Lahore High Court bench

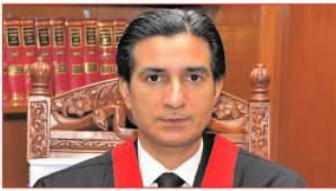
LAHORE: Justice Shams Mehmood Mirza has resigned as Lahore High Court (LHC) judge due to "personal reasons", sources said on Saturday.

As per the insiders, Justice Mirza submitted his resignation to President Asif Ali Zardari.

The judge was ranked fifth in seniority at the LHC and also served as a member of its administration committee.

Appointed as an additional judge in 2014, Justice Mirza's supernumerary was scheduled for March 6, 2028.

His resignation comes just two days after the National Assembly passed the 27th Constitutional Amendment, making changes to the judicial structure and military command.



The amended bill finetunes the structure of the newly established Federal Constitutional Court (FCC), clarifies the titles and ranking of the country's top judges, and drops several clauses from the Senate-approved draft that had sought to alter oath-related provisions for various constitutional offices.

The latest move follows the resignations of Supreme Court judges Justice Mansoor Ali Shah and Justice Athar Minallah, who had issued letters strongly criticising the 27th Amendment.

The jurists had criticised the 27th Amendment, describing it as a "grave assault on the Constitution of Pakistan". However, the federal government called the judges' resignations "political speeches" and the latter's allegations "unconstitutional". RT/Agency

US weighs dramatic nuclear test revival, pushes high-stakes F-35 deal with Saudi Arabia

US: The United States will resume nuclear testing in line with other nations, President Donald Trump said, while also confirming he is weighing a potential agreement to supply Saudi Arabia with F-35 fighter jets. He did not clarify whether the testing plans involve detonating a nuclear warhead. "I don't want to tell you about that, but we will do nuclear testing like other countries," Trump told reporters aboard Air Force One as he travelled to Florida for the weekend. Trump last month ordered the US military to immediately restart the process for testing nuclear weapons after 33 years, making the surprise announcement on Truth Social while aboard his Marine One helicopter flying to meet Chinese President Xi Jinping for a trade-negotiating session in Busan, South Korea.



F-35s deal with Saudi Arabia in the offing. Trump also said that he is considering agreeing to a deal to supply Saudi Arabia with F-35 stealth fighter jets, which are made by Lockheed Martin. "They wanna buy a lot of jets," Trump told reporters. "I'm looking at that. They've asked me to look at it. They want to buy a lot of '35s' - but they want to buy actually more than that, fighter jets." The potential sale comes as Trump plans to host Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman at the White House next week, when they are expected to sign economic and defence agreements. Asked about the talks, Trump told reporters it was "more than a meeting, we're honouring" Saudi Arabia. Meanwhile, President Trump is expected to reach a deal with Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, allowing Riyadh to acquire F-35 stealth fighter jets, Bloomberg News reported citing a White House official. —RT/Agency

KP Chief Minister Afridi unveils 40.8 MW Koto Hydropower Project



LOWER DIR: Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Sohail Afridi on Saturday inaugurated the 40.8-megawatt Koto Hydropower Project during his visit to Lower Dir.

The project, completed at a cost of Rs21.7 billion, is expected to generate 207 million units of electricity annually, producing an estimated revenue of Rs2.4 billion. During the inaugural ceremony, officials provided a briefing highlighting the project's role in strengthening the province's energy capacity and economic growth.

In addition to the hydropower project, Chief Minister Afridi also inaugurated the 18.5-kilometre Tormang-Razgram Road, completed at a cost of Rs1.5 billion.

Pakistan's Asia-leading bond surge expected to continue as global investors reopen access

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's dollar bonds are expected to extend their Asia-leading rally as recent credit-rating upgrades and plans to re-enter global debt markets lift investor sentiment, according to Bloomberg.

The government intends to issue yuan-denominated bonds later this year and to return to the Eurobond market in 2026 for the first time in nearly five years, a key milestone for a country that came close to default two years ago. The move could spur further gains in debt, according to Goldman Sachs Asset Management and UBS Asset Management. These planned issues highlight Pakistan's effort to diversify its funding sources and curb reliance on the International Monetary Fund. So far this year, its dollar bonds have delivered a 24.5% return, the highest in Asia. Danske Bank Asset Management, which bought Pakistan's dollar bonds at the



peak of its financial crisis two years ago, has increased its holdings several times this year, said Soren Morch, head of emerging markets debt. "We are optimistic that Pakistan will stay on the reform course, rebuilding buffers like higher dollar reserves and also getting market access and taking advantage of that," he told Bloomberg. S&P Global Ratings and Fitch Ratings have both upgraded Pakistan's sovereign rating this year, pointing to better fiscal management and reform momentum. Under Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's International Monetary Fund (IMF) backed programmes, the government has obtained billions in IMF funding by raising taxes and keeping fiscal policy discipline. "The outperformance will sustain as long as they're sticking to the IMF policies, which we believe they have a strong commitment to do so," said Shamaila Khan, head of fixed income emerging markets and Asia Pacific at UBS Asset Management. A potential reopening of market access for Pakistan is another support, she added, because "then you really are not concerned about refinancing over the next two to three years." —RT/Agency

Massive blast rocks industrial zone south of Argentina capital

ARGENTINA: Powerful explosions rocked an industrial area and ignited a fire south of Buenos Aires on Saturday, officials said, with at least 22 people sent to the hospital.

The incident occurred inside the Spagazzini Industrial Park in Ezeiza, where multiple factories were affected. "The explosions and fire breaking out in the different factories are huge," said Gaston Granados, mayor of Ezeiza where the events unfolded. He said the cause of the explosions was unknown. TV footage showed thick smoke pouring from the industrial area, while dramatic videos on social media captured towering flames and a powerful shockwave sweeping through the area.

The blast, felt across Ezeiza and Canelas, shattered windows in nearby homes, and some residents told local media they saw an object fall from the sky moments before impact. Hospital director Carlos Santoro said his facility had received 22 injured people. According to local media, five factories were hit by the explosions and



fire. The industrial area features companies making tyres and chemical products, among other goods. Granados said the flames affected several plants in the industrial park. "One of them is a chemical plant, where the warehouses caught fire, and where there are facilities related to agriculture and fertilisers. There is also a plastics plant called Plásticos Lago," he told local media.

Granados described the scene as chaotic. "It's all very confusing. We're trying to ensure safety in the area and evacuate anyone who might be nearby. Fire crews are working to combat the intense fire that's burning in all areas," he said. The mayor confirmed that 15 fire crews responded to the emergency.

Africa CDC confirms deadly Marburg virus outbreak in Ethiopia

AFRICA: Ethiopia has confirmed an outbreak of the deadly Marburg virus in the south of the country, the Africa Centres for Disease Control and Prevention (Africa CDC) said on Saturday. The Marburg virus is one of the deadliest known pathogens. Like Ebola, it causes severe bleeding, fever, vomiting and diarrhoea and has a 21-day incubation period. Also like Ebola, it is transmitted via contact with bodily fluids and has a fatality rate of between 25 and 80 percent. The head of the World Health Organization, Ethiopia's Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, confirmed on Friday that at least nine cases had been detected in southern Ethiopia, two days after Africa CDC was alerted to a suspected haemorrhagic virus in



the region. "Marburg virus disease (MVD) has been confirmed by the National Reference Laboratory (in Ethiopia)," Africa CDC said. "Further epidemiological investigations and laboratory analyses are underway and the virus strain detected shows similarities to those previously identified in East Africa." It said Ethiopian health authorities had acted swiftly to confirm and contain the outbreak in the Jinka area. —RT/Agency

Nawaz leaves for London for medical tests amid political scrutiny

LAHORE: Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) president and former prime minister Nawaz Sharif departed for London on Saturday.

Nawaz Sharif travelled to London via Qatar Airways and is expected to stay in the United Kingdom for around 15 days. During his visit, he will undergo routine medical examinations. His departure comes just days after he attended the National Assembly session and cast his vote in favour of the 27th Constitutional Amendment on Wednesday. Pakistan's National Assembly passed the landmark 27th Amendment Bill with a two-thirds majority as the opposition staged a walkout. The session featured



high political drama and was attended by key national figures, including Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, PML-N President Nawaz Sharif, PPP Chairman Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari. Two senior judges of the Supreme Court of Pakistan (SC), Justice Mansoor Ali Shah and Athar Minallah, have resigned from their posts. Justice Mansoor
