Jordan's King Hails Pakistan Army For Unmatched Professionalism And Operational Prowess

RAWALPINDI: Jordan's King Abdullah II on Sunday praised Pakistan's military for its exceptional training, professionalism, and operational readiness, highlighting the troops' and aircrews' preparedness.

He expressed his views during a visit to the Global Industrial and Defence Solutions (GIDS) and Tilla Field Firing Ranges, according to a press release issued by the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR).

King Abdullah was accompanied by Princess Salma and a delegation of Jordanian officials. Chief of Army Staff Field Marshal Syed Asim Munir received the royal guests along with senior military officials.

During the visit, the Jordanian king was given a comprehensive briefing on the structure, capabilities, and product portfolio of



GIDS. The briefing showcased Pakistan's progress in indigenous defence production, technological innovation, and potential avenues for bilateral defence cooperation with Jordan.

The Jordanian monarch later visited the Tilla Field Firing Ranges. Prime Minister Muhammad Shehbaz Sharif also graced the occasion; whereas, Azerbaijan Minister of Defence Industry Vugar Valah oglu

Field Marshal Munir Warns Of Strong Retaliation To Any Future Aggression Against Pakistan

ISLAMABAD: Chief of Army Staff (COAS) Field Marshal Syed Asim Munir on Sunday pledged a swift and strong response to any act of aggression against Pakistan.

He, while speaking to Media at a luncheon hosted for Jordan's King Abdullah II ibn Al Hussein at the President's House, raised his finger towards the sky, saying: "I did not lead Pakistan to victory, Allah did."

"It is Allah's special blessing that Pakistan's enemy bit the dust in May. Pakistan's Army is Allah's Army, its soldiers fight in the name of Allah," he added.

The May confrontation between the two neighbouring countries saw Pakistan downing seven Indian fighter jets, including three Rafale



aircraft, after India's unprovoked missile strikes on the night of May 5 and 6, which resulted in the martyrdom of several civilians and security personnel.

India's strikes came after a terrorist attack on tourists in Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam area, which resulted in the killing of 28 men.

nuclear-armed nations ended on May 10 with a ceasefire agreement brokered by the United States.

Shortly after the war, the federal government formally promoted COAS Munir to field marshal for his leadership during the conflict.

Meanwhile, the army chief reaffirmed Pakistan's commitment to peace. He, however, said that the country would respond firmly to any aggression, similar to its response during the May conflict with India.

Field Marshal Munir, recalling verses from the Quran, said that Allah Almighty has promised believers that with faith they can defeat any enemy, regardless of its strength, adding that Pakistan demon-

strated this in May.

As the participants of the meeting began congratulating the field marshal, he asked them to pray for Pakistan's progress.

The army chief then reiterated his unwavering commitment to fulfil his duties "as commanded by Allah".

Field Marshal Munir's remarks came just days after the federal government confirmed that his tenure will restart following his new appointment as Chief of Defence Forces (CDF) Speaking during a National Assembly session on November 13, Law Minister Azam Nazeer Tahir said that the CDF's term would be five years from the date of his appointment.—RT/Agency

Defense Minister Khawaja Asif Confirms Bushra Bibi's Role With Former ISI Chief

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's Defense Minister Khawaja Asif has confirmed reports that Bushra Bibi, former spouse of Prime Minister Imran Khan, was reportedly working for former ISI Chief General Faiz Hameed. Speaking to media, Khawaja Asif stated that the news published by The Economist was accurate and that Bushra Bibi's intelligence reports often proved correct within a few days.

Khawaja Asif alleged that PTI founder Imran Khan was effectively under the control of Generals Faiz Hameed and Qamar Javed Bajwa, asserting that a woman had been used to manipulate the political process in Pakistan. He said that serious "mockery" had been played with the country through the use of her influence.



The Defense Minister also revealed that documents and raw intelligence provided by Bushra Bibi were passed to Imran Khan by General Asim Munir during his tenure as ISI Chief. Imran Khan reportedly became displeased with this and subsequently removed General Asim from his position. Khawaja Asif added that while PTI members considered Imran Khan intelligent, they were ultimately betrayed by the actions of a woman. These remarks have sparked further debate in Pakistan's political circles, raising questions about the role of intelligence in political maneuvering and the influence of personal relationships on national security decisions. Analysts say the allegations could have significant implications for ongoing political and military dynamics in the country.—RT/Agency

Pakistan Foreign Office Vows Active Role In Mediating Afghanistan Tensions



ISLAMABAD: Foreign Office (FO) spokesperson Tahir Hussain Andrabai said on Sunday that Pakistan welcomed Iran's offer of mediation between Islamabad and Kabul and would "not shy away from it".

"Iran is a brotherly, friendly country. Pakistan is always in favour of finding peaceful resolutions of issues through dialogue and diplomacy, and we appreciate the offer of mediation of our brotherly country, Iran," Andrabai told Dawn upon a query about reports that Tehran was working to convene a regional meeting for mediation between Islamabad and the Afghan Taliban. "We believe that Iran can play an important role. We would not shy away from any mediatory role by Iran. Mediations are always welcome," Andrabai said, adding that Pakistan had a "very strong case".

He further stated: "Generally, mediations are resented by a country or a side which is on a weak legal or a political case. Pakistan's case on this issue, on terrorism emanating from Afghanistan, is very strong. So, obviously we will not shy away from mediation."—RT/Agency

Pakistani Pilots Take Spotlight As Dubai Airshow Opens Today

DUBAI: The Dubai Airshow, one of the world's biggest aviation gatherings, opens today, bringing together the latest military and commercial aircraft from around the globe.

Organisers say the event is fully prepared to welcome industry professionals and aviation enthusiasts.

This year, Pakistan Air Force (PAF) pilots are expected to take centre stage, with aviation analysts noting that PAF's exceptional performance in recent operations has become a key point of interest for global air powers.

They emphasise that Pakistan's pilots have impressed the international military aviation community with their precision, discipline and operational skill.

The show will feature colourful aerial displays, formation flights and aerobatic



performances. Analysts expect the PAF demonstrations to be among the most notable of the week, showcasing Pakistan's advancing air capabilities to a global audience.

Organisers confirm that China's advanced air defence system will be on display, highlighting the country's growing challenge to Western and US defence technology.

Russian aerospace industries are also set to participate with a range of military aircraft and systems.

From Pakistan, the Pakistan Aeronautical Complex (PAC) will present its latest aviation technology and MRO capabilities, while the Pakistan Aerospace Council will represent the country's broader aviation sector.

Industry insiders expect strong commercial activity during the event, with forecasts of around 300 new aircraft orders that could reshape market dynamics in the global aviation industry.—RT/Agency

Putin And Netanyahu Hold Crucial Call On Gaza Ceasefire, Iran, And Syria

MOSCOW: Russian President Vladimir Putin and Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu held a detailed phone conversation on Sunday, reviewing a wide range of Middle East developments amid an ongoing ceasefire in Gaza.

Both Moscow and Jerusalem confirmed the call, which followed earlier exchanges between the two leaders on regional issues.

Netanyahu's office said the conversation was held at the initiative of President Putin, continuing a series of previous discussions between the two leaders focused on regional matters.

Gaza ceasefire
According to Russia's Foreign Ministry, the leaders exchanged views "in light of the agreement on ceasefire and the exchange of detained persons."



They discussed recent developments in the Gaza Strip, where efforts continue to stabilize the temporary ceasefire and facilitate ongoing humanitarian processes.

Iran, Syria
The Kremlin said the call touched on the situation surrounding Iran's nuclear program, an issue Moscow and Jerusalem have frequently raised amid renewed tensions in the region.

Key Arrests Expose Fresh Details in Islamabad Judicial Complex Attack



ISLAMABAD: Major revelations have surfaced during the interrogation of the arrested facilitators and handlers involved in the deadly attack on the Islamabad Judicial Complex. According to media, investigators have uncovered critical information about the attacker's movements, failed attempts, and cross-border links.

Sources say the suicide bomber initially attempted to target the Faizabad checkpoint, but the plan failed when the explosive device malfunctioned and its safety pin did not detach. Following the failed attempt, the attacker returned to Rawalpindi.

A few days later, the same militant launched the assault on the Islamabad Judicial Complex, resulting in the martyrdom of 13 people and injuries to 30 others.

AJK No-Confidence Motion Against PM Reaches Final Stage, Voting Set For Today

ISLAMABAD: Efforts to oust the Prime Minister of Azad Jammu and Kashmir have entered their final phase, with the no-confidence vote set to take place today.

The Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) appears to have gained further momentum as another member of the forward bloc extended support to its candidate, Faisal Mumtaz Rathore.

Diwan Chughtai, Minister for Education in Anwarul Haq's cabinet, also announced his support for the PPP. His decision came after meeting PPP leader Faraz Talpur, during which he confirmed that he would back the party in the upcoming vote. With this latest devel-



opment, the PPP now commands the support of 37 members of the Legislative Assembly. According to sources close to Prime Minister Chaudhry Anwarul Haq, he intends to contest the no-confidence motion rather than step aside. Meanwhile, the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), the Muslim Confer-

ence, and the Jammu & Kashmir Peoples Party have decided to remain neutral in the no-confidence process.

The political atmosphere in Azad Kashmir remains highly charged as both sides prepare for a decisive vote expected to determine the region's next political leadership.—RT/Agency

Grenade Attack On Jaffarabad Police Checkpoint Injures Officer, Sparks Alarm

JAFFARABAD: A police checkpoint in Jaffarabad district, Balochistan, came under a grenade attack that injured a constable late on Monday, according to police officials.

Police said that unidentified motorcycle riders hurled a grenade at the Shahi Chowki police checkpoint, injuring Constable Mohammad Sajjad. He was taken to hospital. Officials reported that



Police cordoned off the area and state that all resources are in use to arrest the suspects.

Earlier, an explosion occurred on a railway track in the Rabi Canal area within the limits of Notal Police Station in Nasirabad. Police state that the blast took place a few minutes after the Jaffar Express train passed. There was no loss of life, though the track sustained damage.—RT/Agency

Russia Follows Iran, Offers Mediation To Ease Pakistan-Afghanistan Tensions

MOSCOW/ISLAMABAD: Following Iran's initiative, Russia has also offered to mediate between Pakistan and Afghanistan to help ease rising tensions along the border.

According to media reports, Russian Foreign Ministry spokesperson Maria Zakharova, during a press briefing, emphasized that regional stability is a top priority for Russia and the international community. She warned that the ongoing Pakistan-Afghanistan border tensions pose a serious threat to the region's security.

The Russian Foreign Ministry stressed that sustainable solutions to conflicts can only be achieved through dialogue, urging both Pakistan and Afghanistan to exercise restraint.

Zakharova urged both sides to: Avoid steps that could increase tensions. Resolve disputes through negotiations, and Maintain continuous communication to prevent escalation.

Russia's offer comes at a time when border-related incidents and diplomatic strains have raised concerns across the region.—RT/Agency

Hyderabad Ramps Up Dengue Battle as Cases Surge Across District

HYDERABAD: The District Administration Hyderabad has stepped up its anti-dengue campaign as Deputy Commissioner Zain-ul-Abidin Memon chaired a key review meeting at the Mayor Secretariat Hall to evaluate the progress of the ongoing fumigation drive and finalize the next phase of operations. Municipal Commissioner HMC Zahoor Lakhani and District Health Officer Dr. Pir Ghulam Hussain along with Assistant Commissioner Taluka City Babar Saleh Rahupoto visited several hospitals in Hyderabad. They inspected dengue wards, checked medicine stocks, reviewed diagnostic services, and assessed the overall treatment facilities available to dengue patients.

Meanwhile, Indoor Residual Spray (IRS) activities are underway in various localities under the supervision of Health Department field teams. Citywide fumigation operations continue across all zones, monitored by Assistant Commissioners, Town Municipal Commis-



sioners, and Union Council staff to suppress mosquito breeding and reduce dengue transmission risks. The District Administration, Hyderabad Municipal Corporation, and the Health Department reaffirmed their commitment to eliminating dengue through coordinated planning, rigorous field action, and active community participation.

Chaos at Mirpurkhas Civil Hospital Gate as Daily Traffic Gridlock Paralyzes City

MIRPURKHAS: Severe traffic congestion has become a daily problem outside the main gate of Old Civil Hospital Mirpurkhas, causing great inconvenience to citizens coming from all directions. The road from the railway crossing to Khan Naswar remains continuously blocked. Expanding road-side stalls of Landa Bazaar, haphazard rickshaw parking, and clinics operating near Ashrafi Mirhai further narrow the road.

Only one traffic police constable is deployed at this critical location, who alone is unable to manage the situation effectively. 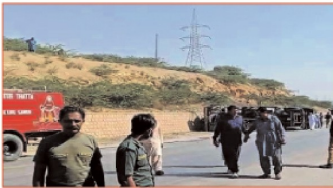


Oil Tanker Topples Near Makli, Injures Driver as Fire Teams Race to Contain Blaze

HYDERABAD: A devastating explosion in an illegal firecracker manufacturing unit in Unit 10, Leghari Goth, Latifabad, claimed four lives and left seven others critically injured on Monday. The injured victims were swiftly shifted to LMC Hospital for urgent medical treatment.

Following reports of the blast, SSP Hyderabad Adeel Hussain Chaudhry immediately deployed police teams to the site. Rescue 1122, Sindh Rangers, district administration officials, and several welfare organizations also reached the location to begin rescue and relief



operations. The deceased and injured were transported to Bhitai Hospital and LMC Hospital Hyderabad. Rescue teams continued search operations late into the day to locate any remaining victims trapped under the debris.

SSP Chaudhry later visited LMC Hospital, where he inquired about the condition of the injured and directed hospital authorities to ensure the best possible medical care. Police have launched legal proceedings against those responsible, and special teams have been formed to arrest the owners of the illegal firecracker factory.

Osman Shah Hari Press Club Razed in Tando Allahyar Amid Road Expansion Drive

Gomal University Expels Students After String of Campus Incidents Sparks Outrage

DI KHAN: Gomal University has expelled several students after a series of serious incidents on campus, the university administration announced in an official statement.

In October, students, reportedly along with outsiders, stormed the Registrar's office, assaulted a female student, attempted

to forcefully enter the Vice Chancellor's office, attacked a police guard, and disrespected the national anthem during a campus event. During a cricket match screening, anti-Pakistan slogans were also reportedly raised.

A fact-finding committee investigated the incidents and referred the matter to the disciplinary committee. Students facing allegations were issued show-cause notices, and their responses were found unsatisfactory. Consequently, the students were expelled, their admissions cancelled, and hostel rooms sealed.—RT/Agency

Ahsan Iqbal Blasts PTI, Demands Renaming of "Prisoner 804"

Federal Minister for Planning and Development Ahsan Iqbal has demanded that the government change the label of "Prisoner 804" to "420." He criticized PTI members for chanting slogans for "Prisoner 804" in the assembly, stating that the person they defend is actually a "420," a reference to fraud, who deceived 24 crore citizens. He also pointed out that those calling others thieves were themselves convicted of embezzling 190 million PKR.

Iqbal further alleged that whenever his party contributed to Pakistan's development, conspiracies were



hatched against them. He said the inexperienced leadership imposed in 2018 harmed the country and mocked the idea that an atomic power could be managed by superstition, claiming that bizarre rituals, such as burning goat heads, occurred in the Prime Minister's House.—RT/Agency

KP Chief Minister Condemns Neglect, Pledges Citizen-Friendly Policies

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) Chief Minister Sohail Afridi has said that KP is treated like a "stepmother" in national affairs. Speaking to the media, Afridi highlighted that the tribal districts were promised an annual allocation of 1 billion PKR, which has not been received. He also pointed out that the federal government owes KP over 3 trillion PKR.

Afridi criticized the lack of attention given to KP's governance and policy matters. He emphasized that after the merger of the tribal districts, KP's share should have reached 40 billion PKR, but the province has still not received its due.

Despite these challenges, Afridi assured that new policies and laws will prioritize the rights of the people. He stressed the need for fair treatment of KP in national development and resource distribution.—RT/Agency

FIA Busts Five Afghans Over Fake Documents in Peshawar Crackdown

Inheritance Denied, Justice Defied

The Supreme Court's latest ruling has once again exposed a national disgrace we refuse to confront: the systemic, ruthless, and often deliberate denial of women's lawful inheritance. For decades, Pakistani women have been robbed of what is not a favour, not a privilege, but a divinely mandated and constitutionally protected right. This entrenched injustice is not merely a legal failure — it is a moral collapse.

Justice Athar Minallah's judgment reiterates what Islam declared unequivocally and what our Constitution enshrines: a woman's share in inheritance is non-negotiable. Yet across the country, countless women continue to be bullied, deceived, coerced, or simply pushed out of their rightful property by brothers, uncles, cousins, and entire clans. The case of

ers, uncles, cousins, and entire clans. The case of



Bibi Shahida, who fought for her share since 2002 while her brother repeatedly stonewalled her through bogus litigation, is not an anomaly. It is the shameful norm.

The court has placed responsibility squarely where it belongs: on the state. It is the state's duty — not an optional gesture — to ensure every woman knows her right, can claim her right, and does not have to wage a lifetime battle for what was hers from the mo-

ment her father closed his eyes. The judgment's call for a proactive and accessible mechanism is urgent and overdue. Without such enforcement, legal rights remain paper promises easily crushed under cultural coercion.

Furthermore, those who weaponise custom, manipulate religion, or abuse legal loopholes to deprive women must face real consequences. The Rs500,000 penalty imposed on the petitioner in this case should be a precedent, not an exception.

A society that denies women their inheritance denies its own moral foundations. The state must act — now, decisively, and without compromise — to uphold the dignity, financial autonomy, and humanity of Pakistan's women. Anything less is complicity.

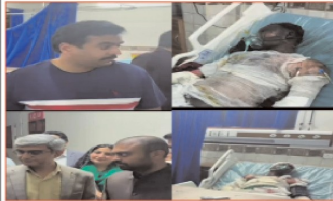

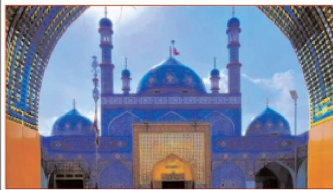

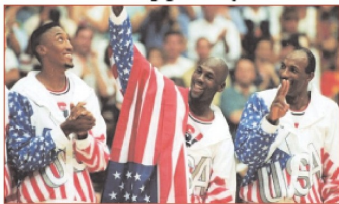

According to the sources, Sarfraz will now oversee all matters related to the Pakistan Shabees and Pakistan Under-19 teams.

His role will include supervising coaches, managing tours, and staying with the teams during training camps and series held in Pakistan. He will also have the authority to travel with the teams on overseas assignments.

It is pertinent to mention that the wicket-keeper-batter, who has an extensive international career, played 54 Tests, scoring 3,031 runs, including four centuries and 21 fifties.

In 117 ODIs, he amassed 2,315 runs with two centuries and 11 fifties, while in T20s, he scored 818 runs in 61 matches, including three fifties.

Sarfraz also boasts an impressive captaincy record. He led Pakistan to victory in the 2017 Champions Trophy and defeated India by 180 runs in the final with a 70% win rate.

He also guided the team to a 62.5% win rate in the 2019 Cricket World Cup, winning five of nine matches.—Agency

Mitchell's blazing century lifts New Zealand to tense ODI triumph over West Indies

HAGLEY OVAL: Daryl Mitchell let out a rare roar after reaching a century in New Zealand's first ODI against the West Indies at Hagley Oval.



His seventh ODI hundred, a gritty 119 on a challenging, two-paced pitch, helped New Zealand post 269, a total they defended narrowly by seven runs to take an early lead in the series.

West Indies, after electing to bowl first, remained competitive for much of the match. They replaced three spinners from their previous game with seamers, with Matthew Forde emerging as the standout in the opening overs.

Forde came close to a hat-trick in the seventh over, removing Rachin Ravindra for 4 and Will Young for a golden duck in his 50th ODI. At 24 for 2, the Blackcaps found themselves in early trouble on a pitch offering consistent seam movement.

Mitchell walked in and countered with clever footwork, nullifying the seamers' threat and steadily increasing the scoring rate.

Devon Conway contributed a scratchy but vital 49 off 58 balls as the hosts recovered to 91 for 2, before the innings stalled again under the tight bowling of Koston Chase.

Exploiting the wind and using impeccable length, Chase created multiple chances, though only one ended in a wicket. Michael Bracewell, who added 35 off 52, was relieved twice, allowing New Zealand to regain momentum.

At 192 for 5 in the 42nd over, Mitchell, on 79, pulled up with a left-leg issue and had to bat with limited running.

Despite the injury, he cleared the straight boundaries with trademark power, reaching his century with 12 fours and two sixes, ultimately dragging New Zealand to a competitive total.—Agency

Asia Cup Rising Stars final clouded by escalating trophy dispute



LAHORE: The trophy saga from the ACC Men's T20 Asia Cup 2025 may extend to the Asia Cup Rising Stars tournament.

The Rising Stars final is scheduled for November 23 in Doha, and Asian Cricket Council (ACC) President Mohsin Naqvi is expected to attend as the chief guest at the closing ceremony.

According to the sources, the Indian team is likely to reach the final, which could potentially be contested between India 'A' and Pakistan Shabees, similar to the senior Asia Cup.

Concerns have been raised that a trophy-related controversy may arise, following a similar situation in the senior tournament.

Earlier in September, the Indian team did not attend the Asia Cup 2025 closing ceremony, reportedly due to the presence of ACC President Mohsin Naqvi who is also the Chairman of the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB).

India had refused to collect the Asia Cup trophy directly from him. The trophy remains with the ACC, which has offered India the chance to receive it at a formal event.

In the senior Asia Cup, the closing ceremony saw individual awards distributed to players like Kuldeep Yadav, Shivam Dube and Tilak Varma, while Pakistan captain Salman Ali Agha received runners-up prize money.

Kuldeep Yadav also received the award for highest wicket-taker and Abhishek Sharma was named Player of the Tournament.—Agency

World Test Championship table shaken after South Africa's dramatic win over India

KOLKATA: South Africa climbed the ICC World Test Championship (WTC) 2025-27 points table after defeating India by 30 runs in a low-scoring first Test at Eden Gardens on Sunday, while India slipped down the standings.



The Proteas, coming off a 1-1 draw against Pakistan in their two-match series last month, bounced back strongly against India.

They now occupy second place in the WTC standings with two wins and one loss from three matches, totaling 24 points and a 66.67% success rate.

Off-spinner Simon Harmer starred for South Africa with figures of 4-21, dismantling India's chase of 124 as the visitors were bowled out for 93 in front of nearly 40,000 spectators.

India, meanwhile, dropped to fourth spot after recording four wins, three defeats, and one draw in eight games, earning 52 points at a 54.17% success rate.

Pakistan sits fifth with one win and one loss against South Africa last month, with 12 points and a 50% success rate. Australia remains at the top, winning all three of their games to accumulate 36 points and a 100% success rate.

Harmer continued his dominance by dismissing Dhruv Jurel and Rishabh Pant, reducing India to 38-4, and later trapped Ravindra Jadeja for 18. Aiden Markram then removed a set, Washington Sundar (31), further crippling India's chase.—Agency

Conor Benn admits he'll break down in private after emotional revenge over Eubank Jr.

Conor Benn has said that he would "go home and cry" after getting revenge from Chris Eubank Jr. in a rematch.



Benn outboxed Eubank Jr., delivering a clinical performance and displaying a fight many thought he didn't have in his locker.

In their first match in April, Eubank Jr narrowly defeated Benn in a thrilling 12-round contest in which all three judges scored the bout 116-112 in his favour.

However, this time around, Benn turned it around, winning by unanimous decision at Tottenham Hotspur Stadium, including two knockdowns in Round 12 to cap off a remarkable performance.

Conor Benn was emotional at the post-match press conference after getting a win for the Benn family, saying he will cry after going home.

"I feel like I'm going to go home and cry," Benn said. "Oh man it's been hard. Facing my first loss, coming back from adversity. It's things you've got to do. As a man you go through things in life, and you don't know why. But you just have to keep fighting. Staying in shape, staying in shape when you really don't want to turn up."

"Facing your own demons every single day, that's the hardest fight really. Getting in the ring for 36 minutes is no problem."

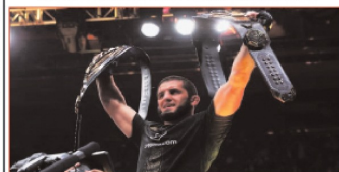
Originally, Benn and Eubank Jr were scheduled to fight in 2022 for the first time, but the former failed two drug tests. He was later allowed to fight in the UK again in 2024, but admitted that he struggled with suicidal thoughts in the two years in between.

He dedicated the fight to those who supported him during a tough period.

"There's a lot of people in the changing room that were there for me during times, gave me words of advice. Ultimately, I couldn't do it alone. I weren't strong enough to do it alone," Benn said.

"I had good support people round [who] helped me carry the load. The people in that room, the win's for them. Every single one of us because when I was down, we were all down. And when I'm up we're all up.—Agency

Islam Makhachev crushes Della Maddalena at UFC 322 to cement two-division dominance



Islam Makhachev has become a two-division champion after defeating former welterweight title holder Jack Della Maddalena by unanimous decision, 50-45, 50-45, 50-45, on Saturday night at UFC 322 in the main event at Madison Square Garden in New York.

Former UFC lightweight champion Makhachev (28-1 MMA) has become the 11th fighter in UFC history to win multiple titles across divisions.

The Russian is also close to breaking Anderson Silva's record for the UFC's longest winning streak with 16 consecutive outings, as he has tied the record with the victory against Australia's Della Maddalena (18-3 MMA).

"This is the dream," Makhachev said. "All my life I've fought for this. I make it difficult for the worked hard for this moment."

Makhachev sees an opportunity to cement his status as MMA's top champion and is aiming to fight at the UFC's planned White House event next summer, if he stays healthy.

"I'm coming," Makhachev said.

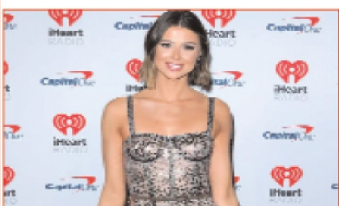

KARACHI: The Sindh Health Department has confirmed that three more dengue patients have died, raising the total number of deaths this year to 36. According to media reports, the latest fatalities include a 50-year-old man and an 80-year-old woman in Hyderabad, while a 55-year-old woman passed away in Karachi.

Over the past 24 hours, 180 new dengue cases were reported across hospitals in



Sindh. Of these, 113 patients were admitted to government hospitals, while 57 were taken to private facilities. Currently, 241 dengue patients are

under treatment in both public and private hospitals.

In the last day alone, 44 patients were admitted in Karachi Division, 35 in Hyderabad, and 34 from other districts.

Health officials have urged citizens to take precautionary measures, eliminate mosquito breeding sites, and seek immediate medical help if symptoms appear.—RT/Agency

Transport Fares Jump Four Percent as Fuel Price Surge Hits Hard

KARACHI: President of the Pakistan Goods Transport Alliance, Malik Shehzad Awan, has strongly condemned the recent increase in petroleum product prices and announced a 4% hike in transport fares.

According to media reports, Awan stated that government policies are forcing transporters toward a nationwide strike, adding that the alliance will soon unveil its strategy against what he termed as "government irregularities."



A day earlier, the government announced petrol prices for the next 15 days. Under the new notification, the price of diesel has been increased by Rs6 per litre, while the price of petrol has been kept un-

changed. Awan warned that if the government fails to reconsider its decisions, the transport community may resort to strong protest measures to safeguard their economic interests.—RT/Agency

Pakistani Rapper Talha Anjum Stuns Fans by Waving Indian Flag at Nepal Concert in Peace Gesture

KATHMANDU/KARACHI: Pakistani rapper Talha Anjum sparked attention during his concert in Nepal after he waved the Indian flag as a gesture of friendship and cross-border harmony. The moment, captured by fans, highlighted the artist's message of unity beyond political

boundaries. Anjum's fellow rapper Talha Yunus also joined in by waving the Nepalese flag, drawing cheers from the crowd. Both performers emphasized that music has the power to bring people together, promoting goodwill and cultural brotherhood among na-

tions. The duo—popularly known for their contributions to Pakistan's hip-hop scene—used the platform to convey a message of peace, respect, and mutual understanding among Pakistan, India, and Nepal.—RT/Agency

Notorious Target Killer Nabbed in Rangers–Police Joint Raid, Linked to Extortion and Drug Rings

KARACHI: Sindh Rangers and Karachi Police have arrested a wanted suspect involved in target killings, extortion, drug trafficking, and multiple police encounters.

According to the Sindh Rangers spokesperson, the arrested suspect, Shaukat Ali alias Agha Shaukat, had multiple FIRs registered against him in various Lyari police stations under charges of murder, attempted murder, police encounters, and terrorism. The spokesperson revealed that Agha Shaukat had fled abroad during



the Karachi Operation to evade arrest but returned to Pakistan recently and had begun reorganizing his criminal network. Investigations show that the suspect joined the Abdul Rehman Dacot group of the Lyari gang in 2004, later becoming part of the Peoples Ann Committee in 2009, and eventually joining the group of gang commander Noor Muhammad alias Baba Ladla in 2013.—RT/Agency

Two Gunmen Captured After Fierce Shootout With Police in Karachi's Qayyumabad

KARACHI: Two suspects were arrested following an exchange of fire with Defence Police near the Qayyumabad B Area graveyard.

According to police, officers signaled two men on a motorcycle to stop for inspection, but the suspects opened fire instead, prompt-

ing retaliation from the police. During the encounter, one suspect was injured and later shifted to the hospital for treatment, while the other was arrested on the spot.

Police recovered a 30-bore pistol, a motorcycle, and three mobile phones from the suspects' possession. Officials added that a

third accomplice managed to escape, and efforts are underway to track him down. Legal proceedings have been initiated against the arrested suspects as investigations continue into their criminal background and possible involvement in other illegal activities.—RT/Agency

Dhabeji Breakdown Shatters Two Major Pumps, Karachi Braces for Water Shortage



KARACHI: The Water Corporation has reported a temporary disruption in water supply after a power breakdown at the Dhabeji Pumping Station affected two pumps of the second phase. Officials warned that the city could face a shortage of nearly 100 million gallons of water as a result.

According to the Water Corporation spokesperson, the breakdown was reported at 6:35 a.m., causing Line No. 5 to be

affected due to the electricity outage. Authorities stated that repair work is underway, and the pumping station's system is expected to return to normal once maintenance is completed.

The corporation has urged citizens to manage water usage carefully until full restoration of services and assured that teams are working to resolve the issue as quickly as possible.—RT/Agency

Karachi Cools Down as Temperature Swings Between 15.8°C and 25°C



KARACHI: The minimum temperature in Karachi was recorded at 15.8°C today, while the current temperature stands at 25°C. Humidity levels are at 49 percent, with a light breeze from the north-east blowing at 3 km/h.

According to the Pakistan Meteorological Department, the maximum temperature is expected to range between 31°C and 33°C. The weather will remain generally dry, with cooler conditions expected during the night. Residents are advised to enjoy the mild weather while taking standard precautions for the daytime heat, especially in exposed areas.—RT/Agency

Over 61,000 E-Challans Issued in Karachi, Government Vehicles Also Nabbed



KARACHI: Under the e-challan system, more than 61,850 traffic fines have been issued in Karachi so far, including penalties for government vehicles. According to official figures, 589 government vehicles were fined, including 118 vehicles of the Sindh Police.

Traffic violations by heavy vehicles resulted in 964 e-challans, while motorcyclists riding without helmets received 11,000 fines. The highest number of penalties, 41,431 e-challans, were issued for not wearing seat

belts.

Other violations included jumping traffic signals, resulting in 2,200 e-challans, and using mobile phones while driving, which led to 1,447 fines. Vehicles with illegal tinted windows were also penalized, with 795 e-challans issued. Authorities emphasized that the e-challan system aims to improve road safety and urged citizens to comply with traffic rules to avoid penalties and ensure safer roads across the city.—RT/Agency

PM Shehbaz Sharif Set to Unveil Upgraded Karachi Cantt Station



Karachi: Prime Minister Mian Muhammad Shahbaz Sharif is expected to visit Karachi today for a one-day official trip. During his visit, he will arrive at Karachi Cantt Railway Station to inaugurate the completed renovation and modernization work, sources said.

The station has undergone extensive upgrades, in-

cluding the installation of four escalators, construction of Commercially Important Person (CIP) lounges, and two new waiting halls for passengers. Executive washrooms, POS machines for quick ticketing, and ATM facilities have also been added to enhance the convenience and comfort of travelers.—RT/Agency

Sindh CM Reviews Fast-Tracking of Shahrah-e-Bhutto Construction Work

KARACHI: Sindh Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah conducted an on-site review of the Shahrah-e-Bhutto development project, focusing on key construction milestones. The CM visited the Murgli Khana segment, where Section-1 (15 km) has achieved 98% completion, highlighting significant progress in road infrastructure.

Key structures along the route are also advancing steadily: the Samoon Village elevated structure is 65.67% complete, Memon Goth Bridge at 80%, Mai Niyani Bridge at 95%, and KWSB

the government's commitment to improving transport infrastructure and connectivity across Sindh, urging contractors to maintain timelines and quality standards for the safe and timely completion of the project.—RT

Robbers Hit Sindhi Singer's Karachi Home, Flee With Rs 7 Million

KARACHI: Police are investigating two thefts at the home of Sindhi singer Bedil Masroor, where a total of PKR 7 million in cash was stolen. Authorities said Masroor had sold his plot for PKR 7 million and stored the money in two portions inside a traditional chest (kanister) at his residence.

The first theft oc-

curred on November 12, when PKR 3 million was taken, which Masroor immediately reported to the police. The following day, November 13, another PKR 4 million was stolen from the same location.

Police officials confirmed that a thorough investigation is underway, with the Crime Scene Unit collecting

evidence and geo-fencing of the area being conducted. Authorities have urged witnesses or anyone with information about the thefts to come forward to help identify and apprehend the suspects. The incidents have raised concerns about security measures at high-profile residences in Karachi.—RT/Agency

Karachi to Deploy Smart System to Detect Fake Number Plates, Says DIG Traffic

KARACHI: DIG Traffic Pir Muhammad Shah has explained how the new traffic surveillance system will help authorities detect vehicles using fake or tampered number plates in Karachi.

Speaking on a Podcast, DIG Pir Muhammad Shah was asked how the system would identify cases where, for example, a Vigo is running on a Mehran's number plate.

In response, he said the latest system will immediately flag such violations. He gave an example stating that when officials stopped a vehicle with black-tinted windows and checked its details,



the Excise Department had no matching record.

The reason, he said, was that the number plate installed on the Vigo did not belong to that vehicle but to an FX, and it was caught on the spot.

The DIG traffic added that such violations are now detected within seconds. Under the Safe City project, smart surveillance vehicles will be deployed at major intersections.—RT/Agency

Fire Erupts at Tariq Road Restaurant, One Person Injured

KARACHI: Karachi's Tariq Road witnessed a fire at a local restaurant, prompting a swift response from emergency services. Two vehicles from the Fire Brigade and Rescue 1122 reached the scene immediately after the incident was reported.

During the blaze, one per-

son sustained burn injuries. The injured, identified as Sajjad, an employee of the restaurant, was promptly taken to a nearby hospital for treatment.

Rescue officials confirmed that the fire has been completely brought under control, and cooling opera-

tions are currently underway to prevent any further flare-ups. Authorities are investigating the cause of the fire.

No other casualties have been reported, and the prompt action of emergency responders helped contain the situation before it escalated.—RT/Agency

Waseem Akhtar Slams Sindh Leadership, Reveals Deep Personal Struggles

Pakistan Sweeps ODI Series, All-Round Performance Overpowers Sri Lanka

RAWALPINDI: Fakhar Zaman and wicketkeeper batter Mohammad Rizwan's fifties after a discipline bowling performance helped Pakistan beat Sri Lanka in the third one-day international (ODI) on Sunday at the Rawalpindi Cricket Stadium to sweep the three-match series.

Chasing 212, Pakistan crossed the finish line in 44.4 overs with six wickets in hand, winning the series 3-0. Pakistan stumbled early in the chase as opener Haseebullah Khan was dismissed for a duck off eight balls by Mahesh Theekshana, leaving the team at 8-1 after four overs.

The experienced duo of Babar Azam and Fakhar then steadied the innings, forging a 74-run second-wicket partnership that helped Pakistan reach 82-2 in 15.2 overs.



Fakhar continued his fine form, scoring 55 off 45 balls, including eight boundaries, to record his 19th ODI fifty before being dismissed by Rizwan under pressure at 101-4.

Rizwan and Hussain Talat then combined to rebuild the innings, steadily scoring and taking Pakistan past the 150-run mark.

Their crucial 50-run partnership for the fifth wicket eased the pressure, pushing the team to 167-4 after 37 overs.—RT/Agency

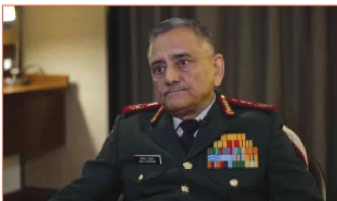
India's CDS Slams Defence Companies Over Delays And Broken Promises

DELHI: India's Chief of Defence Staff (CDS) General Anil Chauhan has castigated the country's defence industry, exposing deep fissures in New Delhi's self-proclaimed drive for military self-reliance and raising fresh questions about the reliability of equipment.

Speaking at a seminar in New Delhi, the CDS slammed several manufacturers for misleading the military by falsely branding imported equipment as "70% indigenous".

"We expect a bit of nationalism and patriotism in your profit-driven endeavours. I am given to understand... actually, the Army was telling me that they were scouting for 5th and 6th EP procurements, most of the people have over-promised things and they have failed to deliver in that time frame," the CDS said.

According to Indian publication The Print, EP refers to emergency procurements under which the services



have been given powers to sign contracts up to INR3 billion each to beef up their capabilities without going through the procurement processes of the defence ministry.

He also criticised Indian firms for repeatedly failing to deliver defence equipment ordered under emergency procurement powers, despite government claims of unprecedented military capacity.

Chauhan said companies had "over-promised" and routinely missed deadlines, leaving the armed forces short of critical capabilities.

The CDS warned that such misrepresentation compromised national security, noting that contracts were being awarded to firms with no real manufacturing capability, which simply repackaged imported material.

"Industry will have to be truthful about their capabilities to us. You cannot leave us in a lurch. You sign a contract, don't deliver in that particular time, it is a capability that is being lost. You have to be truthful about your indigenous capability. There could be security-related issues," he added.—RT/Agency

Ukraine Pushes For Swap Of 1,200 Prisoners With Russia



Ukraine is working to resume the exchange of prisoners with Russia, hoping for the release of 1,200 Ukrainians. President Volodymyr Zelenskyy and his Security Council chief said.

"We are... counting on the resumption of exchanges," Zelenskyy said in a video posted on the Telegram messaging app on Sunday. "Many meetings, negotiations and calls are now devoted to this."

His security chief, Rustem Umerov, said on Saturday that he had held consultations in Turkey and the United Arab Emirates, with the support of Kyiv's partners, on resuming the process of exchanges.

"As a result of these negotiations, the parties agreed to return to the Istanbul agreements," he said. "This concerns the release of 1,200 Ukrainians," Umerov said in a statement on Telegram.

There was no immediate comment from Moscow to Ukraine's statements.—RT/Agency

Musadik Malik Urges Action Against Glacial Melt Threatening Pakistan's Mountains

ISLAMABAD: Minister for Climate Change Dr Musadik Malik has called for expedited efforts to address climate-induced glacial melt in the Himalayas-Karakoram-Hindu Kush (HKH) mountain range, warning at the sidelines of COP30 that glacial melt was occurring at an "unprecedented rate".

Pakistan is home to about 13,000 glaciers. According to a 2023 report by the International Centre for Integrated Mountain Development (ICIMOD), Himalayan glaciers, which provide critical water to nearly two billion people, are melting faster than ever before due to climate change, exposing communities to unpredictable and costly disasters.

The minister made the remarks at the sidelines of COP30, at an event titled "Cryosphere Adaptation & Disaster Risk Reduction", where he delivered the keynote address via video, the Press Information Department (PID) said on Saturday.



Malik told the participants that "climate-induced glacier melt is occurring at an unprecedented pace," calling for the "urgent need" to protect the HKH cryosphere, which he described as the "white rooftops of the world" and the "primary lifeline of millions across South Asia."

As per the PID statement, the event — organised by the Ministry of Climate Change & Environmental Coordination in collaboration with the ICIMOD — featured interventions from Deputy Ministers of Türkiye and Azerbaijan, the Director General of ICIMOD, and senior representatives from Nepal,

Bhutan, UNESCO, UNDP, and the Asian Development Bank (ADB).

"Pakistan hosts 13,000 glaciers, which feed the Indus River system and sustain the country's agricultural, ecological, and economic foundations," the press release quoted Malik as saying.

He informed the audience that climate-induced glacier melt was "resulting in severe losses and damages, including Glacial Lake Outburst Floods (GLOFs)." A GLOF refers to a rush of water from a glacial lake, which could lead to severe flooding downstream.—RT/Agency

Iran Claims US Not Ready For Equal And Fair Nuclear Negotiations



TEHRAN: Washington's current approach toward Tehran does not indicate any readiness for "equal and fair negotiations", Iran's foreign minister said on Sunday, after US President Donald Trump hinted last week at potential discussions.

Following Israel's attack on Iran in June, which was joined by US strikes on Iranian nuclear facilities, attempts at renewing dialogue on Tehran's nuclear programme have failed.

The United States, its European allies, and Israel accuse Tehran of using its nuclear programme as a veil for

efforts to develop the capability to produce weapons. Iran says its nuclear programme is for peaceful purposes only.

Tehran and Washington underwent five rounds of indirect nuclear talks prior to the 12-days-war, but faced obstacles such as the issue of domestic uranium enrichment, which the US wants Iran to forego.

"The US cannot expect to gain what it couldn't in war through negotiations," Abbas Araqchi said during a Tehran conference named "international law under assault".—RT/Agency

US House Speaker Says 'Nothing To Hide' In Epstein Files

US: US House of Representatives Speaker Mike Johnson said on Sunday that he believed the approaching vote on releasing Justice Department files related to Jeffrey Epstein should help put to rest allegations that President Donald Trump had any connection to the late sex offender's abuse and trafficking of underage girls.

"They're doing this to go after President Trump on this theory that he has something to do with it. He does not," Johnson, the Republican leader in the House, said on the "Fox News Sunday" programme.

"Epstein is their entire game plan, so we're going to take that weapon out of their hands," Johnson said of Democrats. "Let's just get this done and move it on. There's nothing to hide."

Though Trump and Epstein were photographed together decades ago, the president



had said the two men fell out prior to Epstein's convictions. Emails released last week by a House committee showed Epstein believed Trump "knew about the girls," though it was not clear what that phrase meant.

Trump has since instructed the Department of Justice to investigate prominent Democrats' ties to Epstein.

The battle over disclosure of more Epstein-related documents, a subject Trump himself campaigned on, has opened a rift with some of his allies in Congress.

Trump, late on Friday, withdrew his support for US Representative Marjorie Taylor Greene of Georgia, long one of his staunchest supporters in Congress, following her criticism of Republicans on certain issues, including the handling of the Epstein files.

In an appearance on CNN's "State of the Union" program on Sunday, Greene said she did not believe as-yet-unreleased files would implicate the president, but she renewed her call for further transparency.—RT/Agency

Talal Chaudhry Asserts Constitution Must Reflect Parliament And People, Not Judges

ISLAMABAD: Responding to criticism of the Supreme Court's judges against the constitutional amendments, Minister of State for Interior Talal Chaudhry on Sunday defended the federal government's move, saying that making changes to the Constitution is the parliament's exclusive right.

His statement came after two top court jurists, Mansoor Ali Shah and Athar Minallah, tendered their resignations following the enactment of the 27th Constitutional Amendment earlier this week.

Not only the top court, a Lahore High Court (LHC) judge, Shams Mehmood Mirza, also resigned a day ago, saying he was "not inclined as a matter of principle and in good conscience to continue as a judge" after the 27th Amendment.

The tweaks fine-tuned the



structure of the newly established Federal Constitutional Court (FCC), clarified the titles and ranking of the country's top judges, and approved changes to the military command.

On Friday, President Asif Ali Zardari approved Shah and Minallah's resignations.

"Amending the Constitution is Parliament's exclusive right, and it will do so whenever it chooses," he stated while talking to journalists in Faisalabad today.

He stressed that judges "are not a political party" and only take an oath to uphold the Constitution.

Criticising sections of the judiciary, Chaudhry said that the Constitution will reflect the parliament and the people of Pakistan, not judges. He added that the legislature "must be seen as Parliament", arguing that certain actors had "reduced it to a municipal corporation".—RT/Agency

At Least Four Dead As Two Migrant Boats Capsize Off Libyan Coast

TRIPOLI: At least four migrants have died after two overcrowded boats carrying irregular migrants capsized off the coast of Libya, officials confirmed on Thursday. The tragic incidents occurred near the Al-Khums coastal area, a region that has long been a departure point for migrants attempting the dangerous Mediterranean crossing toward Europe. According to international news agencies, the two boats were carrying a total of 95 migrants when they overturned in rough waters. The first vessel, carrying 26 Bangladeshi migrants, capsized shortly after departing the coast. Authorities reported that four Bangladeshi



nationals lost their lives, while others were rescued by local teams and humanitarian groups operating in the area. The second boat, which was transporting 69 migrants, included Egyptian nationals and several Sudanese migrants. Rescue officials stated

that survivors were brought ashore, but detailed information regarding additional casualties or missing persons has not yet been confirmed. Search and rescue operations are ongoing, with teams combing the surrounding waters for those still unaccounted for.—RT/Agency

Arrest Warrant Issued For Bushra Bibi's Son Musa Maneka In Servant Shooting Case

SAHIWAL: Senior Civil Judge Masood Ahmed Faridi issued an arrest warrant for Musa Maneka, the younger son of Khawar Maneka and Bushra Bibi, over his repeated absence from the court proceedings.

Mr Musa is the main accused in a case of a domestic servant over a minor dispute at his residence in the Pir Ghani area of Pakpattan on July 17, 2025.

The judge directed the Pakpattan Sadar Police to arrest Musa Maneka and present him before the court on November 19. A case was registered against Mr Musa at the Sadar police station



after getting enraged when his 18-year-old servant, Ali Bahadur, removed bed sheets from his room without his permission. In a fit of anger, Musa allegedly fired a 30-bore pistol at Ali, hitting him in the left knee. The bullet passed through his leg. Witnesses claimed that Mr Musa then threatened other household servants with similar consequences if they attempted to assist the injured servant.—RT/Agency

India Arrests IIOJK Resident Over Delhi Car Blast

DELHI: India's federal anti-terrorism agency on Sunday said it had arrested a resident of Indian Illegally Occupied Kashmir (IIOJK) who it accused of conspiring with the driver of a car that exploded in Delhi last week, killing 12 people and wounding at least 20 others.

The National Investigation Agency said it had arrested Amir Rashid Ali in Delhi, adding the car used in the attack was registered in his name.

The NIA accused Ali of conspiring with the alleged suicide bomber, who it identified as Umar Un Nabi, a resident of IIOJK's Pulwama district.

It said Ali came to Delhi to facilitate the purchase of



the car, which was used as a "vehicle-borne Improvised Explosive Device to trigger the blast."

The agency said it had seized another vehicle belonging to Nabi for examination. So far, it has interrogated 73 witnesses, including those injured in the blast.

Last week, the Indian government said it was treating the car blast as a "terror incident" and vowed to bring the perpetrators to justice as swiftly as possible.

The blast outside Delhi's historic Red Fort was the first such explosion in the heavily guarded city since 2011. It was also the most significant security incident since April 22, when 26 tourists were killed at the civilist site of Pahalgam in IIOJK.—RT/Agency
