Bangladesh's Ousted PM Hasina Sentenced To Death Over Student Crackdown

BAGLADESH: A Bangladesh war crimes court sentenced ousted Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina to death on Monday, concluding a months-long trial that found her guilty of ordering a deadly crackdown on a student-led uprising last year.



The ruling is the most dramatic legal action against a former Bangladeshi leader in decades and comes months ahead of parliamentary elections expected to be held in early February.

Hasina's Awami League party has been barred from contesting and it is feared that Monday's verdict could stoke fresh unrest ahead of the vote.

The International Crimes Tribunal, Bangladesh's domestic war crimes court lo-

calated in the capital Dhaka, delivered the verdict amid tight security and in Hasina's absence after she fled to India in August 2024.

Hasina got a life sentence under charges for crimes against humanity and the death sentence for the killing of several people during the uprising.

There was cheering and clapping in the court after the death sentence was pronounced.

The verdict can be appealed in the Supreme Court. But Hasina's son and adviser, Sajeeb Wazed, told Reuters on the eve of the verdict that they would not appeal unless a democratically elected government took office with the Awami League's participation. —RT/Agency

Raja Faisal Rathore Sworn In As New AJK PM As Assembly Ousts Chaudhry Anwarul Haq

MUZAFFARABAD: The Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) on Monday voted to remove Prime Minister Chaudhry Anwarul Haq from his post, replacing him with Pakistan Peoples Party's (PPP) Raja Faisal Rathore.



The no-confidence motion was supported by 36 lawmakers, including those from the PPP and Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz. Two members opposed the motion.

PPP's candidate for the premier's slot, Rathore, received 36 votes, with two against.

Overall, Rathore is the 16th AJK PM and the fourth

of the current assembly. Those who have served in the top post during the incumbent assembly's tenure, apart from Haq, include Abdul Qayyum Khan and Sardar Tanveer Ilyas Khan.

Assembly Speaker Chaudhry Latif Akbar presided over Monday's session, attended by lawmakers of the PPP, PML-N, and Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf, including Leader of the Opposition, Khawaja Farooq Ahmad.

Strict security measures were put in place at the Assembly Secretariat, Ministers' Block, and Prime Minister's Secretariat.

Speaking on the floor of the assembly, PM Haq said that no single individual could be held solely responsible for the "destruction of the constitution and administrative system," noting that members of his cabinet also share responsibility for governance outcomes.

Haq said he was placing his remarks on record, expressing gratitude to the assembly that "gave him political life."

He said that no formula for the division of Kashmir



could succeed under his leadership and described signing off on ending reserved seats for refugees as "political death."

The political system could only survive, he said, if the region's borders are protected. "Without Pakistan's armed forces, nothing will remain."

On recent political developments, Haq said that he would have supported Rathore for the prime minister's post had the elections been held. "I was once asked to dissolve the assembly by February 15 this year, but I refused to do so," he added. —RT/Agency

Zelenskiy Confirms Ukraine Will Receive 100 Rafale Jets From France

UKRAINE: President Volodymyr Zelenskiy said on Monday he had signed a deal with France to obtain 100 Rafale warplanes as he seeks to bolster the country's long-term military capacity to fight Russia's invasion.



Zelenskiy is visiting Paris for talks with President Emmanuel Macron at a time when heavy Russian drone and missile attacks on Ukraine have increased in recent weeks and Moscow has reported ground advances in the southeastern Zaporizhzhia region. Zelenskiy told reporters he had ordered 100 Rafale fighter jets. "It will be the greatest air defence, one of the greatest in the world," Zelenskiy said after he signed a letter of intent with Macron in front of a Rafale

jet and the French and Ukrainian flags at Villacoublay military airport. The Elisee confirmed the number, without immediately giving details on whether the Dassault made jets would be transferred from French stocks or purchases. Two people briefed on the matter told Reuters earlier that the provision to Kyiv of multi-role

Rafale combat jets would be part of a 10-year strategic aviation agreement. Some could come directly from French stocks, although the bulk would be longer-term and part of Ukraine's efforts to increase its long-term fleet to 250 warplanes, including the U.S. F-16 and Sweden's Gripen, the people said. —RT/Agency

The arrangement was seen as a symbolic reflection of strong ties between the UAE and Pakistan in defence and aviation cooperation.

The skies above the airshow were dominated by colourful aerobatic displays as military and commercial jets performed precision manoeuvres throughout the opening day.

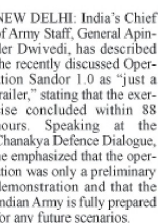
Crowds gathered around the runway and viewing stands as teams showcased high-speed turns, formations and signature stunts.

NEW DELHI: India's Chief of Army Staff, General Anil Kumar Dwivedi, has described the recently discussed Operation Sandor 1.0 as "just a trailer," stating that the exercise concluded within 88 hours. Speaking at the Chanakya Defence Dialogue, he emphasized that the operation was only a preliminary demonstration and that the Indian Army is fully prepared for any future scenarios.

When asked about the results of Operation Sandor 1.0, General Dwivedi said, "I, you see, I would say the movie hadn't even started — only a trailer was shown, and within 88 hours, that trailer was over. We are now preparing fully for what the next phases might involve."

The Army Chief's remarks suggested that the operation was designed as a limited, controlled exercise to test readi-



ness and capabilities rather than a full-scale military action.

He further added that if Pakistan provides any such opportunities, India would be ready to "teach how a responsible nation should behave towards its neighboring countries." The statement underscores India's emphasis on maintaining strategic preparedness while projecting a strong stance in regional security matters.

General Dwivedi's com-

ments at the Chanakya Defence Dialogue highlighted India's approach of combining tactical exercises with strategic messaging.

Rana Sanaullah Announces 28th Amendment To Be Tabled Soon

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister's Adviser on Political and Public Affairs Rana Sanaullah on Monday said that the 28th Constitutional Amendment would be introduced soon, expressing confidence that it would also be passed by the parliament.



Speaking to journalists in Chiniot, Sanaullah said the proposed amendment would relate to local bodies, the National Finance Commission (NFC) and health matters, noting that discussions on these subjects were already underway.

He added that if consensus is achieved, the government can move forward with formally presenting the 28th Amendment in parliament.

His remarks came days after the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N)-led

ruling coalition passed the 27th Amendment, which brought changes to the judicial structure and military command.

According to the amendment, the Chief of Army Staff will concurrently serve as the Chief of Defence Forces, making the position the central command authority for the armed forces. The military ranks of Field Marshal, Marshal of the Air

Force and Admiral of the Fleet will now remain lifetime titles.

A major structural change comes in the form of the Federal Constitutional Court (FCC), which is being established as a new judicial forum with equal representation from all provinces. The amendment empowers the FCC to exercise suo motu authority upon petitions. —RT/Agency

Pakistan IT Exports Surge 17% In October, Hit \$1.44 Billion



ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's IT sector continues its upward trajectory as the country recorded a strong 17% year-on-year increase in exports for October 2025.

The latest figures show rising demand for Pakistani IT and digital services worldwide.

According to official documents, Pakistan's IT exports reached \$386 million in October 2025, compared to \$333 million during the same month last year.

Advisor to the Finance Minister Khuram Shahzad said this marks the highest month-on-month increase in the sector so far.

From July to October, Pakistan recorded \$1.44 billion in IT exports. In the same four-month period last

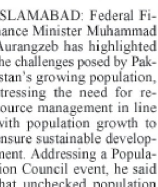
year, the country earned \$1.2 billion, reflecting notable improvement in global demand for local services.

A significant rise was observed in exports related to Telecommunications, Computer services, Information services.

Officials say these categories remain the backbone of Pakistan's digital economy and continue to show resilience despite global market challenges.

The document further revealed that the overall services sector earned over \$3 billion from July to October. This includes revenue from transport, travel, construction, manufacturing-related services, insurance, business services, financial services, and logistics. —RT/Agency

"The economy and population are closely intertwined. While Pakistan's economy is progressing in a positive direction, population-related challenges remain significant," the minister said. He emphasized that balanced population growth is crucial

for sustainable economic development, noting that rapid population increases can undermine progress in health, education, and infrastructure sectors.

Aurangzeb pointed out that informal settlements, or katchi abadis, add to the country's developmental challenges. "These settlements often lack official records or data, making it difficult for the government to

provide basic services efficiently. Proper population control is essential to accelerate development and ensure equitable access to resources," he explained. The Finance Minister called for increased awareness campaigns, policy measures, and public participation in population management initiatives. —RT/Agency

UN Security Council Prepares Vote On International Force For Gaza

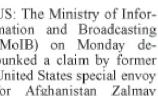
UNITED NATIONS: The UN Security Council is set to vote Monday on a US-drafted resolution bolstering Donald Trump's Gaza peace plan, especially the deployment of an international force, as Washington warns that a failure to act could lead to renewed fighting. The draft, which has been revised several times as a result of high-stakes negotiations, "endorses" the plan, which allowed for a fragile ceasefire between Israel and Hamas to take hold on October 10 in the war-ravaged Palestinian territory. The Gaza Strip has been largely reduced to rubble after two years of fighting, sparked by Hamas's attack on Israel on October 7,



2023. The latest version of the text, seen by AFP, authorizes the creation of an International Stabilization Force (ISF) that would work with Israel and Egypt and newly trained Palestinian police to help secure border areas and demilitarize the Gaza Strip.

The ISF also would work on the "permanent decommissioning of weapons from non-state armed groups," protecting civilians and securing humanitarian aid corridors. In addition, it would authorize the formation of a "Board of Peace," a transitional governing body for Gaza — which Trump would theoretically chair — with a mandate running until the end of 2027. —RT/Agency

Information Ministry Refutes Zalmay Khalilzad Claim On ISIS-K Commander In Punjab



US: The Ministry of Information and Broadcasting (MoIB) on Monday debunked a claim by former United States special envoy for Afghanistan Zalmay Khalilzad, who had alleged that an ISIS-Khorasan (ISIS-K) commander had been killed in Punjab.

Khalilzad said on social media platform X, "Good news from #Pakistan: Reportedly a senior ISIS-K related incident or a case of, known as Zaid, was killed in Patak part of Akhtarabad city in Punjab."

In response to the post, the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting's official



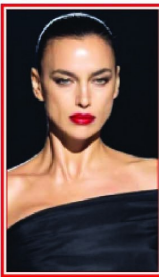
fact-checking account said the incident in question took place in Habibabad in Kasur district on March 5 and not in Akhtarabad as claimed.

"The victim, Burhan, was killed by a dacoity/robbery-related incident or a case of personal enmity, not a counter-terror operation," the ministry said, adding that a first information report (FIR) of the incident was also registered on March 6 at the

Saddar Pattoki police station. It said that Burhan was living with his father-in-law, Shah Muhammad, near a fruit market in Habibabad.

"There is no presence of ISIS/Islamic State Khorasan Province (ISKP) elements in Punjab, Pakistan, according to credible security assessments," the ministry said.

"There is no evidence linking Burhan to ISKP nor was he a commander," the ministry said, adding that Khalilzad's post twisted a "purely criminal or personal dispute into a terrorism-linked killing, creating a false impression of ISKP activity in Punjab." —RT/Agency

"There is no evidence linking Burhan to ISKP nor was he a commander," the ministry said, adding that Khalilzad's post twisted a "purely criminal or personal dispute into a terrorism-linked killing, creating a false impression of ISKP activity in Punjab"—RT/Agency

Blind Eyes Show More Vision Than Modi and India's Cricket Team Ever Will

In Sri Lanka, a historic moment unfolded at the world's first blind women's T20 tournament. Pakistani and Indian visually impaired cricketers shook hands, exchanged compliments, and celebrated the spirit of the game — despite political tensions, past military clashes, and bitter rivalries. These women, some unable to see the ball they play with, demonstrated more courage, humility, and vision than the so-called leaders of India's cricketing establishment.

Contrast this with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's war-mongering rhetoric and the egos of India's men's and women's cricket teams, who refuse even a handshake with their Pakistani counterparts. Their shortsightedness, fueled by hatred,

ethnocentrism, and political posturing, exposes a



moral blindness far worse than any visual impairment. While blind cricketers rely on sound, trust, and instinct to play the game, these "sighted" pygmies rely on arrogance, prejudice, and nationalism — never realizing that the true spirit of cricket lies in respect, sportsmanship, and humanity.

The Pakistani blind women and their Indian counterparts remind the world that vision is more than physical sight; it is empathy, integrity, and

courage. They teach us that shaking hands is not weakness but strength — a symbol that transcends borders, ideologies, and historical grudges.

It is a shame that political leaders and mainstream cricket teams cannot learn from these visually impaired athletes. Modi and India's cricketing authorities must take a long look in the mirror: the real visionaries are on the field, not in palaces or dressing rooms. Cricket is a game of humanity first; anything less is failure. If India and Pakistan hope for peace and respect, it begins with humility and the simple act of extending a hand.

Blind eyes, it seems, see more clearly than blind egos ever will.

Australian Paralympic gold medal-winning cyclist Paige Greco has died at the age of 28 in Australia following a "sudden medical episode," her family announced on Monday.

The cyclist was born with cerebral palsy and initially focused her athletic career on running before finding success on the cycle. Greco's international debut came at the 2019 Para-cycling Track World Championships in the Netherlands.

Previously, the para-cyclist, who clinched her country's first gold medal at the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games, won another bronze medal in August at the para-cycling World Championships in Belgium, in the C3 road race event.

In a heartfelt statement, Paige's mother praised her daughter, describing her as "everything to us," and expressed their feelings following her loss, highlighting her kindness, determination, and warmth. "Paige meant everything to us. Her kindness, her determination, and her warmth touched our family every single day. She brought so much joy and pride into our lives, and her passing is something we will carry forever," her mother, Natalie, stated.—Agency

Josh Naylor Locks In Five-Year Deal to Rejoin Seattle Mariners

SEATTLE: Canadian free agent first baseman Josh Naylor has reportedly agreed to re-sign with the Seattle Mariners on a five-year contract, international media reported on Sunday.

The Mariners have not yet officially confirmed the deal, which requires a physical examination that Naylor is expected to complete on Monday.

This contract is set to be the most lucrative free-agent deal for a position player in Mariners history since president of baseball operations Jerry Dipoto took over after the 2015 season.

The previous record was a two-year, \$24 million contract awarded to Mitch Garver during the 2023-24 offseason.

Earlier, Seattle prioritized signing Naylor during the offseason. The 28-year-old first baseman had a strong season, recording 160 hits, 20 home runs, 92 RBIs, 81 runs scored, and 30 stolen bases.

He also delivered an impressive performance in the American League Championship Series, hitting three home runs and posting a 1.273 OPS.

Before the trade deadline on July 31, Naylor was hitting .292 with 11 home runs and 11 steals for Arizona.

He originally debuted in Major League Baseball with the San Diego Padres in 2019, but was traded to Cleveland before the 2020 season.—Agency

Daryl Mitchell in Doubt for Rest of ODI Series Against West Indies After Injury Scare

New Zealand all-rounder Daryl Mitchell is in doubt for the rest of the ODI series against West Indies after sustaining a groin strain during his match-winning century in Christchurch.

Mitchell, who scored a brilliant 119 off 118 balls in New Zealand's narrow seven-run victory, will stay back in Christchurch to undergo scans to assess the extent of the injury.

Left-hander Henry Nicholls has been called up for the second ODI in Napier on Wednesday.

Nicholls, who last played an ODI in April, is currently in outstanding domestic form, leading the Ford Trophy run charts with 306 runs at an average of 76.50, including consecutive centuries against Otago and Auckland.

Mark Chapman remains the other spare batter in the squad, averaging an impressive 101.33 from four ODIs this year.



Mitchell has been a key performer for New Zealand this season, having earned the Player of the Series award against England.

"He is a man for a crisis," captain Mitchell Santner said after the innings. "He played extremely well, even on one leg at the end."

The Blackcaps are already missing several players due to injuries, including Mohammad Abbas (ribs), Finn Allen (foot), Lockie Ferguson (hamstring), Adam Milne (ankle), Will O'Rourke (back), Glenn Phillips (groin) and Ben Sears (hamstring).—Agency

Shaheen Breaks His Silence on Wasim Jr's Limited Game Time

Pakistan's ODI captain Shaheen Afridi has addressed journalists' concerns regarding pacer Mohammad Wasim Jr's limited appearances in the format after the recently concluded three-match ODI series against Sri Lanka, which Pakistan won 3-0.

Speaking at the post-match press conference in Rawalpindi, Afridi explained the reasoning behind Wasim Jr's inconsistent run, stressing that the pacer had been part of the squad despite battling multiple injury setbacks.

"I think he was being rotated, but perhaps you people weren't aware. Wasim Junior had a few injuries, and you usually give players opportunities based on those injuries," Shaheen said.

He further elaborated on



how team management deals with players who are traveling with the squad but are not fully fit.

"If a player is only as fit as his condition allows... for example, if a player is traveling with the team but not fully fit—Wasim Junior was with the team, but he was carrying several injuries—then the team management naturally keeps rotating him," he added.

"This was right up there for us. Coming to India, playing at Eden Gardens, doing something we haven't done for 15 years, this is right up there,"

"We won a Test match in Pakistan, we've now won a Test match here but the job's far from done. You don't come to a country to win a Test match, you obviously want to win the series."

Haaland Blasts Norway into the World Cup and Sends Italy to Playoffs

MILAN: Erling Haaland scored twice as Norway qualified for the 2026 FIFA World Cup on Sunday after a 4-1 away victory against Italy in their final qualifying match, sending the Gennaro Gattuso side to the playoffs.

Norway has ended its successful qualifying campaign with eight wins, ahead of four-time World Cup winners Italy, who have missed the last two editions of the event, and will compete in the playoffs for the third consecutive occasion.

When Italy started the game, they were required to win by a nine-goal margin because of Norway's superior goal difference. The Italians started aggressively scoring early through



Francesco Pio Esposito just after the 10-minute mark, as he swept in a close-range finish.

The hosts dominated the first half and went close to a second goal several times.

However, in the second half, Norway turned it around with Antonio Nusa scoring an equaliser in the 63rd minute with a left-foot finish from inside the box.

Haaland scored another goal a minute later, taking his tally for the campaign to 16.

Italy, which will play the playoffs for the third consecutive time, finished second in their group four years ago as well, behind Switzerland, and were forced to play the playoffs, suffering a shock exit to North Macedonia.

They also finished second behind Spain in 2018 in the group and lost their playoff to Sweden 1-0 on aggregate.

"We'll find a solution. We want to reach the semi-finals, push through to the final, and earn our place at the World Cup," Italy coach Gennaro Gattuso told Rai Sport.

"We first and foremost have to apologise to our fans, because 4-1 is a heavy result."—Agency

Jannik Sinner Defends ATP Finals Title After Masterclass Win Over Carlos Alcaraz



TURIN: Italy's Jannik Sinner successfully defended his ATP Finals title on Sunday, electrifying the crowd with a hard-fought 7-6(4), 7-5 victory over world number one Carlos Alcaraz in a high-quality finale at the season-ending championships.

Backed by a passionate home crowd at the Inalpi Arena, Sinner collapsed to the court after breaking Alcaraz in the final game, before sprinting towards his box to celebrate amid loud chants of "Ole, Ole, Ole, Sinner, Sinner."

"Finishing in front of the Italian public was incredible — maybe even better than last year," Sinner said. "Thank you very much for the support. It felt like being on a football pitch."

Throughout a season dominated by the Sinner-Alcaraz rivalry, their meeting in the championship match felt inevitable. Both players arrived unbeaten in Turin, setting the stage for one last showdown in 2025.

Alcaraz applied early pressure and created the only break point of the first set, but Sinner held strong. He edged the tiebreak with bold shot-making, sending the arena into a frenzy.

Though Alcaraz will finish the year as world number one — having swept his three round-robin matches — Sinner claimed the final word of the season, capping off the finest year of his career.

The 24-year-old reached all four Grand Slam finals in 2025, winning the Australian Open and Wimbledon. Alcaraz, meanwhile, captured Roland Garros and the US Open, defeating Sinner in both finals.—Agency

Nigeria Crashes Out of World Cup Race After Penalty Shootout Loss to DR Congo



RABAT: Nigeria will miss the second FIFA World Cup in a row after the Democratic Republic of Congo edged them 4-3 on penalties after a 1-1 draw at the end of extra time to win the African qualifying playoffs in Morocco.

DR Congo will now feature in the inter-confederation playoff in March, where they will be chasing a first World Cup spot since 1974.

Frank Onyeka put Nigeria in front in the third minute, but Meschack Elia scored an equaliser in the first half for DR Congo.

The teams finished the second half with a 1-1 draw and failed again to score in 30 minutes of extra time, before Chancel Mbemba scored the decisive spot-kick to send DR Congo to the next stage.

The mini-tournament in

Rabat was played among the best runners-up across the nine African qualifying groups, which concluded last month with the nine winners automatically making it to the World Cup in Canada, Mexico and the U.S. next year.

Nigeria, who have played the elite tournament six times previously, started the match perfectly as the Congolese cleared an early cross but only onto the edge of their penalty area, where Onyeka capitalised on the effort and helped it into the net by a slight deflection off Axel Tuanzebe.

The Congolese had the chance to level it within nine minutes if Ngal'ayel Mukau had not put his close-in effort over the crossbar after Nigeria goalkeeper Stanley Nwabali had flapped at the ball.—Agency

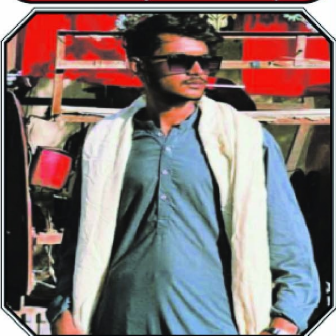

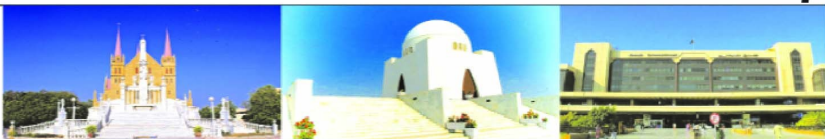

Sharjeel Slams Talk of Sindh's Breakup, Urges MQM to Abandon Politics of Hate

KARACHI: Sindh Information Minister Sharjeel Inam Memon has firmly dismissed any possibility of dividing Sindh, calling such discussions "baseless and pointless." Speaking alongside Nazir Hussain at a press conference, he said there are "no sacred cows" and urged the MQM to abandon what he described as politics rooted in hatred.

Memon stated that all political tactics previously used by MQM have lost relevance



and urged the party to adopt a constructive approach, assuring that the Sindh government is willing to engage positively. He added that MQM's recent press conference was "a bundle of lies,"

saying their statements should be "heard from one ear and released from the other."

Clarifying concerns about the proposed 27th Constitutional Amendment, Memon said that local governments were never part of the agenda, and Chairman Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari has already outlined the amendment's key points. He stressed that the PPP has not secretly agreed to any clause.—RT

Governor Sindh Hails Veterans' Cricket as Over-40 T20 World Cup Set for November 21 Kickoff

KARACHI: Sindh Governor Kamran Khan Tessori has commended efforts to promote veterans' cricket in Pakistan, saying that the experience of senior players serves as a "guiding light" for the younger generation. He expressed these views during a meeting with Pakistan Veterans Cricket Association (PVCA) Chairman Fawad Ejaz Khan at the Governor House.

The meeting featured detailed discussions on the



role of veterans' cricket in encouraging healthy, positive activities and elevating the sporting landscape in Pakistan. Chairman Fawad Ejaz Khan also briefed the Governor on preparations for the Over-40 T20 World Cup 2025.—RT/Agency

PTI Leader Sounds Alarm Over Worsening Crises, Claims Public Being Distracted from 27th Amendment

KARACHI: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Karachi Division Senior Vice President and former MNA Faheem Khan has accused political rivals of crafting "fabricated narratives" to divert public attention from the proposed 27th Constitutional Amendment and other national crises. He was addressing a rally in Korangi held to demand the release of former prime minister Imran Khan.

Faheem Khan said Imran



Khan "lives in the hearts of the people" and warned that the country "cannot function without his release." He alleged that corrupt political forces had plunged Pakistan

into darkness and intensified political instability, worsening the economic situation.

He claimed that inflation had reached unprecedented levels, with essential items including sugar, ghee and lentils becoming unaffordable for ordinary citizens. Unemployment, he said, was rising sharply while lawmakers were focused on "self-serving amendments" instead of public welfare.—RT/Agency

Sindh CM Presses Prime Minister for Urgent Federal Backing on Karachi Circular Railway

CM Murad Ali Shah expressed gratitude to Prime Minister Shahbaz Sharif and Federal Railways Minister Hanif Abbasi for their commitment to Karachi's development. Highlighting ongoing transport improvements, he noted initiatives such as

electric buses, the People's Bus Service, and women-dedicated pink buses, but stressed that a comprehensive mass transit solution like the KCR is essential to meet the city's growing needs.

He also pointed out that until the Karachi-Hyderabad motorway is completed, train travel remains a vital option for commuters, calling for expedited federal efforts to complete the motorway for enhanced regional connectivity.

Woman Killed, Another Injured in Super Highway Crash as Police Arrest Driver

KARACHI: Police have arrested a driver involved in a fatal traffic accident in Dumba Goth along the Super Highway, Malir. According to a spokesperson for Malir Police, the incident occurred within the jurisdiction of Gadap City Police Station when a speeding car struck two women riding a scooter. As a result, Samira died on the spot while Rabia sus-

tained serious injuries. Police reached the site immediately after receiving the report and shifted both victims to the hospital. Authorities confirmed that the two women were on their way to a school in Bahadurabad, where they worked as teachers, when the collision occurred near the M-9 location in Dumba Goth.—RT/Agency

Heavy Security Blanket as PM Shahbaz Sharif Arrives at Karachi Cantt Station

KARACHI: Strict security measures were enforced at Karachi Cantt Station on the occasion of Prime Minister Shahbaz Sharif's visit, with passengers, porters, and other station staff asked to vacate the premises temporarily. Karachi Police Arrest Woman and Accomplice for Husband's Murder

Mochko Police Halt Smuggling of Indian Gutka and Mawa into Karachi

He appealed to citizens not to take the law into

their own hands by resorting to protests, violence, or vandalism following accidents. "The responsible driver should face legal action. That is what the police and law enforcement are for," Mehsud said, urging authorities to ensure prompt investigation and enforcement.—RT/Agency

Karachi Traffic Police Seize Unregistered Dumper, Arrest Driver in Swift Action
