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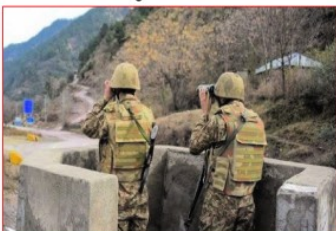

KP Operations Shock: 13 Terrorists Gunned Down by Valiant Security Forces

KP: The security forces have gunned down 13 terrorists in two separate engagements in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said on Friday. In a statement, the military's media wing said that between November 20-21, based on the reported presence of terrorists belonging to Indian proxy Fitna al-Khawarij, a joint intelligence-based operation was conducted by the security forces and law enforcement agencies in the general area of Paharkhel, Lakki Marwat district. During the conduct of the operation, the security personnel effectively engaged the khawarij's location, and after an intense fire exchange, 10 khawarij were sent to hell. Another intelligence-based operation was conducted in the Dera Ismail Khan district. In the ensuing fire exchange, three khawarij were effectively neutralised by the security forces.



Weapons and ammunition were also recovered from killed Indian-sponsored khawarij, who remained actively involved in numerous terrorist activities against the security forces, law enforcement agencies, and the target killing of innocent civilians. Sanitisation operations are being conducted to eliminate any other Indian-sponsored khawarij found in the area. The ISPR added that a relentless counter-terrorism campaign under the vision of "Azm e Istehkam" would

continue at full pace to wipe out the menace of foreign-sponsored and supported terrorism from the country. Terrorist attacks have seen a sharp increase in Pakistan, particularly in the bordering provinces of KP and Balochistan, since 2021, when the Afghan Taliban regime came into power. A police report noted that KP alone recorded over 600 terrorist incidents, in which at least 79 police personnel were martyred alongside 138 civilians, during the first eight months of 2025.—RT/Agency

Tragedy at Dubai Air Show: Indian Tejas Fighter Crashes, Pilot Dies

DUBAI: A shocking tragedy unfolded at the Dubai Air Show on Friday afternoon when an Indian Air Force (IAF) HAL Tejas fighter jet crashed during an aerial display, resulting in the death of its pilot. The incident occurred at around 2:10 pm local time, while the aircraft was performing a high-speed maneuver for the crowds gathered at Al Maktoum International Airport.

Witnesses reported seeing thick black smoke rising from the crash site as stunned spectators—comprising families, children, and aviation enthusiasts—looked on in horror. Several bystanders quickly captured the moment on their phones, and footage of the



crash swiftly spread across social media, adding to the shock of the devastating event. As authorities have yet to confirm the exact details surrounding the crash, it remains unclear whether the pilot managed to eject before impact. Official statements on the injuries or damages are still limited, with an investigation likely underway.

The crash came on the heels of a social media controversy earlier in the show, where footage of a Tejas aircraft was seen leaking fluid mid-flight. However, Indian officials quickly reassured the public that the liquid was simply condensed water released from the aircraft's onboard systems, including the Environmental Control System and oxygen generation unit—an entirely normal occurrence in humid climates. They denied any claims of an oil leak or mechanical malfunction.

The Tejas, a single-engine, multi-role fighter jet designed and manufactured by Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL), is considered one of India's most advanced military aircraft. The 4.5-generation jet is equipped with cutting-edge avionics, a digital fly-by-wire system, and a powerful General Electric F404 engine, which allows it to reach speeds of up to Mach 1.8 and travel over 3,000 km. It is capable of executing air-to-air, air-to-ground, and maritime strike missions, with various variants including the Mk1, Mk1A, and Mk2, each featuring unique upgrades. The IAF's Tejas aircraft has been a key player in several international exercises and showcases, including the Dubai Air Show, where it tragically crashed today. The loss of the pilot has cast a shadow over what was meant to be a spectacular demonstration of India's homegrown aviation technology. As the investigation continues, the aviation community mourns the loss of a skilled pilot and reflects on the risks that come with high-stakes air demonstrations.—RT/Agency

Pakistan Issues Stark Warning Against Terror Plots from Afghan Soil



ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has strongly condemned the use of Afghan territory for attacks against its soil, highlighting ongoing security concerns. Foreign Office spokesperson Tahir Hussain Andrabi also updated on Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar's recent diplomatic visits to the European Union and Moscow.

The Foreign Office spokesperson emphasized that Afghan soil continues to be exploited by terrorists targeting Pakistan. "Afghan citizens are constantly being attacked and attacks are launched from Afghan soil," Andrabi said, adding that Pakistan has suspended trade with Afghanistan due to the Taliban's support for terrorist activities.

Pakistan maintains a policy of border closure and strict trade regulation, demanding that the Afghan Taliban curb citi-

zens involved in cross-border terrorism. Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar participated in the fourth European Union Indo-Pacific Forum, engaging with EU officials on a range of issues. He held bilateral meetings with Hungarian, Danish, Slovenian, and Dutch foreign ministers.

During the visit, a memorandum of understanding was signed with Hungary on student scholarships, reflecting Pakistan's efforts to strengthen educational and cultural ties. Earlier, Ishaq Dar attended the SCO Heads of Government Meeting in Moscow on November 17-18. He met with Russian leaders, including the President, Prime Minister, and Foreign Minister, to discuss relations with Afghanistan. The SCO subsequently issued a joint statement on economic cooperation.—RT/Agency

Finance Minister Drives Virtual Asset Regulations in Global Digital Shift

He also noted a major milestone—the PVARA Chairman's inclusion in the World Economic Forum's Steering Committee on Digital Asset Regulations, underscoring Pakistan's growing influence in the global virtual assets space. The visit concluded with a reaffirmation of the government's commitment to responsible innovation, emphasizing transparency, security, and compliance with both national and international standards. This marks a significant turning point as Pakistan positions itself to navigate the future of digital assets while safeguarding its financial stability and global standing.—RT/Agency

French Commander Drops Bombshell: Inside the Rafale Shoot-Down in India-Pakistan Clash

FRANCE: A French military commander, Captain Jaquis Launay, has exposed a startling new detail about the May 2025 India-Pakistan air clash, revealing that Indian Rafale fighter jets were indeed shot down during the intense one-hour aerial combat. The revelation marks a significant blow to India's official stance, which has consistently denied the loss of its fighter jets.



In an exclusive statement, Launay confirmed that the Rafales were downed during the fierce dogfight that unfolded on the night of May 6-7, 2025, between India and Pakistan. Although the Indian government has long rejected these claims, the mounting confirmations from military sources across the globe are now painting a different picture.

The air combat, which has been extensively analyzed by global armed forces, has provided a rare opportunity to study the real-time performance of

fighter jets, pilots, and air-to-air missiles under active combat conditions. Captain Launay, who commands the Naval Air Base at Landivisiau in France—a base equipped with over 40 Rafale jets—provided additional insights into the factors that led to the dramatic shooting down of the jets, adding fuel to the already contentious situation.

Launay, who has been flying Rafales for over 25 years and has participated in numerous high-stakes operations from the Middle East to Europe, is a seasoned authority on the aircraft. He has overseen operations involving 94 naval warships,

10 nuclear submarines, and a fleet of 190 aircraft, including his beloved Rafales. His military credentials were further cemented last week when he supervised a nuclear missile test without a warhead. The shooting down of Rafales has become a source of global embarrassment for India, as it contradicts the country's official narrative of the air combat. The French commander's revelations have sparked international discussions, with military analysts across the world now revisiting the details of the incident, seeking to draw lessons for future air combat strategies.—RT/Agency

Pakistan Calls for Negotiated End to Ukraine-Russia War



ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has expressed strong concerns over the Ukraine-Russia war, emphasizing its severe humanitarian, regional, and global impact.

Speaking at the United Nations, Pakistan's Permanent Representative to the UN Asim Iftikhar urged both sides to pursue dialogue, diplomacy, and patience to end the bloodshed. Asim Iftikhar said Pakistan is concerned about the Ukraine-Russia conflict and its "profound regional and international repercussions." He noted that people around the world—and especially civilians caught in conflict zones—are suffering greatly as a result of the prolonged war. He stressed that Pakistan has reservations regarding the targeting of civilian infrastructure, calling it a violation that should not occur under any circumstances. Call to protect civil-

ians, critical infrastructure. The Pakistani envoy underscored that civilian protection is a core principle of international law. He stated that the destruction of homes, hospitals, and basic services is worsening the humanitarian crisis and preventing progress toward peace.

According to Iftikhar, the ongoing bloodshed is making it extremely difficult for the parties to move toward a viable solution. Appeal for restraint, patience, diplomacy. Iftikhar appealed to both Ukraine and Russia to show patience and tolerance, urging them to reduce tensions and work toward ending the conflict. He noted that momentum for negotiations had begun earlier this year, and had that process been taken seriously, the war might have reached a meaningful conclusion by now.—RT/Agency

Mass Protests Erupt Across Pakistan Over Imran Khan's Sisters' Treatment and 27th Constitutional Amendment

PUNJAB: Tensions reached new heights across Pakistan on Friday as Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) and the Tehreek Tahaful Ayeen-i-Pakistan (TTAP) organized large-scale protests in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP), Punjab, and Karachi. The demonstrations were sparked by two key issues: the controversial 27th Constitutional Amendment and reports of mistreatment faced by PTI founder Imran Khan's sisters outside Rawalpindi's Adiala Jail. In a coordinated move, PTI and TTAP supporters flooded the streets, condemning the government's actions. The protests gained momentum as protesters in various districts across KP, including Peshawar, rallied in defiance of government policies. PTI workers, holding portraits of their party leader, chanted fiery slogans against state institutions, venting their frustration with both the amendment and the treatment of their leader's family. The protests were organized under the leadership of PTI's KP President Junaid Akbar, and were marked by



high emotion and intensity. In Peshawar, a particularly charged demonstration took place outside the Peshawar Press Club. Local government representatives, including Provincial Minister Meena Khan Afridi and MNA Sher Ali Arbab, were among those who addressed the crowd. They decried the constitutional changes and expressed solidarity with Imran Khan's family. Meanwhile, in Karachi, the authorities moved swiftly to contain the unrest, detaining at least six individuals before they could reach the designated protest venue. Despite this, a show of resistance was maintained, with police efforts failing to entirely quell the demonstrations. The widespread

protests highlighted the growing public discontent over the treatment of Imran Khan and his family, as well as concerns regarding the constitutional amendments. The 27th Constitutional Amendment, which has sparked controversy for its perceived bias and implications for Pakistan's political landscape, remains a flashpoint in the ongoing political crisis. PTI and TTAP vow to continue their resistance, with future protests likely as tensions between the opposition and government continue to escalate. These nationwide protests are a stark reminder of the deepening political rift in Pakistan, with Imran Khan and his party showing no signs of backing down.—RT/Agency

Faisalabad Horror: Deadly Chemical Factory Boiler Blast Kills 17, Dozens Feared Trapped

FAISALABAD: A devastating boiler explosion at a chemical factory in Malikpur, Faisalabad, has claimed the lives of at least 17 people, with authorities fearing more casualties as rescue operations continue. The tragic blast occurred on Friday, sending shockwaves through the local community.



Deputy Commissioner Nadeem Nasir confirmed the rising death toll, stating that the victims include factory workers, women, children, and elderly individuals. Early reports suggest the explosion was triggered by a gas leak, causing a catastrophic fire at the factory. The blast's intensity was so severe that it caused the roofs of nearby houses to collapse, leaving a trail of destruction in its wake. Rescue 1122 teams have mobilized a total of 22 vehicles, working tirelessly to search for survivors and recover bodies from the wreckage. Emergency crews are still combing through the debris, with

hopes dwindling that more individuals may be trapped beneath the rubble. The community remains in shock as the scale of the disaster unfolds. The tragedy in Faisalabad is reminiscent of another industrial disaster that occurred earlier this year. In June, a boiler explosion at a private steel factory in Karachi's Steel Town area resulted in the deaths of two workers, with another suffering severe burns. The boiler blast in Karachi was happening again. As the death toll continues to rise, the nation is left grappling with the devastating consequences of industrial negligence.—RT/Agency

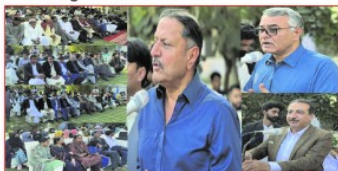

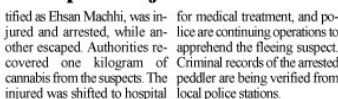

power outage, severe water shortages have been reported in North Nazimabad, Gulberg Town, Gulistan-e-Jauhar and Scheme 33, while water supply has also been badly disrupted in various blocks of Gulshan-e-Iqbal, as well as New Karachi, Saddar and Clifton.—RT/Agency

India's Ego Meets Reality at 30,000 Feet

India's towering sense of invincibility — an Everest of ego built on bluster, ethnocentrism, and carefully curated self-mythology — came crashing down in Dubai, quite literally, with the horrific fall of its indigenous Tejas fighter jet at the Dubai Airshow. As human beings, we must unequivocally condole the tragic loss of the pilot who died in the crash. But even amid grief, uncomfortable questions must be asked of New Delhi's dangerously delusional mindset.

The Tejas crash was not an isolated "technical mishap"; it was a painful public unmasking of a defence industry long propped up by narrative rather than performance. The images of smoke billowing from the wreckage — soon after days of embarrass-

ment over alleged "oil leaks" dismissed as "routine



draining" — exposed yet again the fragility behind India's facade of military might.

And this comes just months after India suffered a humiliating setback in the unprovoked May conflict it thrust upon Pakistan — where seven of its jets were downed. The world acknowledged the losses; India, true to form, pretended they never happened. If denial is its default setting, should we now expect New Delhi to blame Pakistan for the Dubai Airshow

crash too? Or perhaps claim that it never occurred at all, just as it continues to deny the May debacle?

Under Narendra Modi's hyper-nationalist governance, such absurdity is not only possible — it is predictable.

The latest Tejas disaster should serve as a sobering reset for New Delhi. No nation becomes credible by suppressing failures. And no leadership earns global respect by weaving fantasies of grandeur while its hardware crashes before international audiences.

India must wake up from its self-induced stupor. The world is no longer buying the bravado. And after Dubai, neither should India.

Rib Blow Forces Kagiso Rabada Out of Second Test as Injury Woes Deepen

Kagiso Rabada has been ruled out of the second India vs South Africa Test match, in Guwahati on Saturday, after not recovering sufficiently from the rib bone stress injury that had kept him out of the opening Test of the series in Kolkata.



"The injury has been closely monitored by the Proteas medical team, and due to ongoing discomfort in the affected area, Rabada has been withdrawn from the remainder of the tour," Cricket South Africa said in a statement on Friday morning, a day off from the start of the game. "He will continue the initial phase of his four-week rehabilitation program in with the Proteas medical team before returning to South Africa at the conclusion of the second Test."

This will put him out of the white-ball series in India that will follow the Tests.

As reported by ESPNcricinfo, Rabada had not bowled since sustaining the injury in training last Tuesday in with the Proteas medical team on Wednesday in Guwahati.—Agency

Earthquake Halts Bangladesh vs Ireland Test, Shaking Play for Three Minutes



Play had to be halted for three minutes after a 5.5 magnitude earthquake caused severe tremors in parts of Bangladesh and India in the morning session of the third day of the ongoing second Test between Bangladesh and Ireland in Dhaka.

There was immediate panic in the stands as the jolts were felt, and the players and umpires gathered near the pitch. Both dressing rooms emptied at around 10.38am (10.08am in India). The small crowd looked for open areas to escape to. Some went out of the stadium while others tried to get close to the ground. The media centre, a five-storey building at the north end of the stadium, also emptied quickly as people tried to go out to safe spaces.

While there is some confusion about the magnitude of the earthquake, local media in Bangladesh has reported that it was recorded at 5.5 on the Richter scale, with the epicentre in Madhabdi, a municipality around 40 kilometres east of Dhaka. There have been reports of at least two damaged buildings in the capital city but no confirmed reports of casualties.—Agency

It should come as no surprise that the leaders of the time find themselves under the pump despite all the success in ODIs and T20s. In fact, it speaks to the health of Test cricket in India that a home defeat, even if it comes against the world champions, draws such sharp reaction.

After two fruitless tours of India in the last decade, South Africa would have been glad the depth of their

PERTH: Australia trailed England by 49 runs on 123-9 at the end of an extraordinary opening day of the Ashes series on Friday at Perth Stadium, where bowlers had very much the upper hand and a remarkable 19 wickets fell.

Mitchell Starc, spearheading the home attack in the absence of the injured Pat Cummins and Josh Hazlewood, took a career-best 7-58 as Australia dismissed the tourists for 172 before tea.

The large visiting contingent in the crowd of 51,531 were soon in full voice, however, as England skipper Ben Stokes led a pace counter-offensive to rip through the Australian batting order and claim his own five-wicket haul with figures of 5-23.

Gill Out of Guwahati Test, Pant Steps Up to Lead India in Crucial Clash



Shubman Gill, who suffered a neck injury during the first India vs South Africa Test in Kolkata, has been ruled out of the second Test in Guwahati, which starts on Saturday. Rishabh Pant, who led in Kolkata after Gill left the game, will be India's captain.

Gill had travelled to Guwahati on November 19 after spending time under observation in a Kolkata hospital, but has now been ruled out of participation in the game. Gill "will head to Mumbai for further assessment of his injury," the BCCI said in a statement on Friday morning.

As reported by ESPNcricinfo on Thursday, it was understood that Gill is at risk of further neck spasms if he plays so soon after recovering. He has been advised more rest. The development could also impact his selection in the ODI squad for the three matches against South Africa starting on November 30. The squad for that series is expected to be picked on November 23.

With Gill out and no replacements named, India have to choose one of B Sai Sudharsan, Devdutt Padikkal and Nitish Kumar Reddy as his replacement.

Gill was admitted to hospital after the second day of the Kolkata Test after he retired hurt having faced only three balls in India's first innings. On the morning of the third day, the BCCI said he would take no further part in the Test. India went on to lose the match by 30 runs after being dismissed for 93 in a chase of 124 on a pitch with uneven bounce. Gill had missed a Test against New Zealand in October 2024 due to a neck spasm too.

On Thursday, India batting coach Sitanshu Kotak had said in a press conference that the team would not risk playing Gill if there was any chance of the spasm recurring.—Agency

West Indies Recall Kemar Roach and Kavem Hodge for High-Stakes NZ Test Series



Kemar Roach has been recalled to the West Indies Test squad for their tour of New Zealand in December this year. Roach was part of a 15-member squad for the three matches, but Shamar Joseph and Alzarri Joseph are still missing, due to injuries.

Roach last played a Test in January, in Multan during their tour of Pakistan, and his 85-Test record will balance out a relatively inexperienced pace attack, which also includes 29-year-old Ojay Shields, who has received his maiden call-up.

Allrounder Kavem Hodge, who also made his last Test appearance during the Multan match, has been recalled to the side. However, Khary Pierre finds himself and his left-arm orthodox spin bowling out of favour - he has been dropped from the squad.

Cricket West Indies' Director of Cricket, Miles Bascombe, said, "New Zealand has traditionally been one of the toughest places for any touring side... The recent high-performance camp here in Antigua was designed to replicate, as closely as possible, the conditions we expect to face, particularly the pace-friendly surfaces."

Shields and Roach, among other players named in the squad, have completed a two-week high-performance camp in the region. They will also be joining the rest of the squad - already in New Zealand for the ongoing ODI series - on November 20, to part of a two-day warm-up match against a New Zealand XI in Christchurch.

The series will be part of the ongoing World Test Championship cycle. West Indies sit at the bottom of the table among the teams who have played at least one Test in the cycle - they have lost all five of the matches they have appeared in so far. New Zealand, on the other hand, are yet to play a match in the cycle, and this series against West Indies will get their WTC campaign belatedly off the mark.

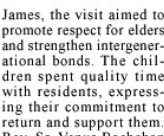

War with India Still Looms, Defence Minister Warns

ISLAMABAD: Defence Minister Khawaja Asif has warned that the risk of another war with India persists, emphasising that proxy conflicts remain an ongoing threat decades after they began. "The proxy war has never truly ended; it has intensified in recent years," said Defence Minister Asif during a talk show on a private television channel. He explained that the proxy war started in the 1980s and has become a tool of modern warfare. Lahore and Rawalpindi have recently experienced explosions linked to these tensions, he said. Asif added that the immediate threat of war was



high following the May conflict, stating: "After the May engagement, the possibility of another war existed, and that risk has not disappeared." Highlighting Pakistan's defensive successes, he said the United States

reaffirming that despite these measures, the danger of conflict with India remains a serious concern for Pakistan's security establishment. The four-day war between the two nuclear-armed nations was triggered by India's unlawful missile strikes inside Pakistan, which resulted in the martyrdom of several civilians and security personnel. Pakistan, in addition to downing multiple Indian fighter jets, then launched a retaliatory strike, targeting over 20 Indian military sites across multiple regions. The hostilities ended on May 10 after the two countries agreed to a US-brokered ceasefire

agreement. Months after the conflict, a report submitted to the United States Congress acknowledged Pakistan's military success over India. The report, submitted by the US-China Economic and Security Review Commission, noted that Pakistan deployed advanced Chinese weaponry during the conflict to enhance its military edge over India. The report mentioned the successful use of China's modern weapons systems in active combat for the first time, including the HQ-9 air-defence system, PL-15 air-to-air missiles, and J-10C fighter jets.

KP: Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Sohail Afridi has moved to the Peshawar High Court (PHC), challenging the Election Commission of Pakistan's (ECP) summon over alleged violation of the electoral "Code of Conduct." In his petition, Afridi argued that the ECP had no valid reason or justification for summoning him, as he claimed to have neither participated in nor conducted any election campaign.



The controversy centers around Afridi's attendance at a political gathering near Havelian, linked to the upcoming by-election for National Assembly seat NA-18. The seat is contested by Shehraz Khan, the wife of former opposition leader Omar Ayub, with Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) backing her candidacy. The ECP issued the summons, alleging Afridi violated the election code by engaging in campaign activities. However, the chief minister vehemently denied the accusations, arguing that his presence at the event was purely ceremonial and did not constitute active campaigning. He further contended that the ECP's action infringed upon his constitutional rights, specifically citing violations of Articles 9, 10A, 17, and 25 of Pakistan's Constitution.

KP CM Challenges ECP Summon in Peshawar High Court

Deadly Bannu Attack: 7 Peace Committee Members Killed in Gunfight

BANNU: In a brutal assault on peacekeepers, at least seven members of a local peace committee were killed in a gun attack by terrorists in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Bannu district on Friday night, police confirmed. The attack occurred around 9 pm in the Hoveed area when armed militants launched an assault on the peace committee's office.



According to authorities, the militants opened fire, sparking a deadly exchange of gunfire. Seven peace committee members were killed in the attack, and one other was injured. The injured were rushed to the District Headquarters Hospital (DHQ) for medical treatment, but the fatalities have left the community reeling. This latest terrorist strike comes just a day after security forces in the region achieved a major victory, eliminating 30 members of the Indian-backed militant group "Fina al-Khawarij" in multiple operations across Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. The military's media wing reported significant successes, with at least 12 terrorists neutralized in Kurram district, and further killings in Tank, Mohmand, and Lakki Marwat, as part

COP30 Climate Summit Faces Showdown Over Fossil Fuel Future

BRAZIL: The COP30 climate summit in Brazil is heading for a dramatic showdown as host nation Brazil dropped key efforts to include a global plan for phasing out fossil fuels in its draft deal. Early Friday, a draft text for this year's UN climate summit revealed the omission of any reference to oil, gas, and coal, removing language from previous drafts that called for a transition away from fossil fuels.



The decision has sparked outrage, with over 30 countries sending a letter to the COP30 presidency, demanding a commitment to developing a roadmap for fossil fuel phase-out be included in the final deal. These nations warned that they could not accept a deal that ignored the urgent need to address the global reliance on fossil fuels. The issue has been one of the most contentious at the two-week conference, which is being held in Brazil's Amazon city of Belém. Environmental groups and smaller nations have pushed hard for stronger commitments to tackle climate change by transitioning away from fossil fuel dependence. The summit, which is scheduled to conclude at 6 p.m. local time (2100 GMT), is now facing a race against time to reach a compromise.

Justice Aminuddin Calls FCC Creation a Landmark in Constitutional Journey

ISLAMABAD: In his maiden message as the Federal Constitutional Court's (FCC) top judge, Chief Justice Aminuddin Khan called the creation of the newly established court under 27th Amendment a landmark in Pakistan's constitutional journey, "reinforcing the nation's commitment to the rule of law." The FCC CJ's statement was published on the court's newly launched website. CJ Aminuddin, who was appointed following the establishment of the FCC under the recent 27th Constitutional Amendment, described the institution's mandate as "of great significance to interpret the Constitution with clarity, independence and fidelity; to safeguard the fundamental rights guaranteed to the people, and to ensure that the constitutional order remains a source of stability, justice and balance for all institutions of the state."



He added that the court's work carries profound implications for the lives, liberties and aspirations of Pakistan's citizens. "Each matter brought before this court will be approached with an unwavering commitment to fairness and restraint, guided solely by the Constitution and the principles of justice that lie at its heart," he said. The chief justice also highlighted that the new website aims to enhance transparency and accessibility. It will provide the public, the Bar, and state institutions with accurate information on the FCC's jurisdiction, procedures, and decisions. "In an age where the effective delivery of justice is inseparable from the free flow of information, we hope that this platform will serve as a meaningful bridge between the court and the people it exists to serve," he noted. Justice Aminuddin expressed hope that the FCC will become "a guardian of constitutionalism and an enduring symbol of justice for generations to come." He concluded his message by invoking guidance to fulfill duties "with wisdom, humility and unwavering commitment to the Constitution." —RT/Agency

Bangladesh Earthquake Tragedy: 9 Dead, Hundreds Injured



DHAKA: A powerful earthquake struck outside Bangladesh's crowded capital Dhaka on Friday, killing at least nine people and injuring more than 300, authorities said.

The 5.5-magnitude quake struck at 10:38 am (0438 GMT) near the city of Narsingdi, about 33 kilometres (16 miles) from Dhaka, according to the US Geological Survey.

The tremor sparked fear and chaos, with many in the Muslim-majority nation of 170 million people at home on their day off.

In Dhaka, people were seen in the streets while others looked shocked. The interim government's press office said at least nine

people were killed and more than 300 people were injured.

At least 14 buildings were damaged, and fire broke out at a power station but was later brought under control.

Interim leader Muhammad Yunus expressed in a statement his "deep shock and sorrow over the news of casualties in various districts." He added that the government was taking "all necessary measures."

Nine people were taken to hospitals in Dhaka with serious injuries, according to the government's health department. A witness told AFP that masonry from an eight-story building in Dhaka had fallen onto a busy road below.

Trump Administration Faces Shakeup: Cabinet Reshuffle Eyed After One Year



WASHINGTON: The White House is preparing for possible turnover in the cabinet after US President Donald Trump reaches the one-year mark of his term, CNN reported on Friday, citing multiple people familiar with the discussions. The report said possible changes were in store at the Department of Homeland Security and the Energy Department. Officials told CNN that no decisions have been made and no changes were expected until

early next year, it said. White House spokeswoman Karoline Leavitt said the CNN report was false. "The truth is: President Trump could not be happier with his Cabinet," Leavitt wrote in a post on X.

Trump returned to office in January for his second term. His first administration saw several high-profile departures, including secretaries of state and defense, often following policy clashes or personal disagreements with the Republican president. —RT/Agency

Zelensky Signals Openness to US Plan to End Ukraine War



UKRAINE: Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky's top security official denied on Friday that he had agreed to a Trump administration peace plan, and European leaders hastily sought a response to a draft that endorses most of Russia's key wartime demands. Washington has presented Kyiv with a 28-point plan that would require Kyiv to give up additional territory, scale back the size of its military and forever abandon hope of joining the Nato alliance. Ukraine's European allies said they had not been consulted over the plan and scheduled an urgent phone call to discuss the situation. Britain and Germany said their leaders

would take part. Zelensky's office did not say whether he would join in US officials said the plan was drafted after consultations with Rustem Umerov, secretary of Ukraine's National Security and Defence Council, a close Zelensky ally who served as defence minister until July. "This plan was drawn up immediately following discussions with one of the most senior members of President Zelensky's administration, Rustem Umerov, who agreed to the majority of the plan, after making several modifications, and presented it to President Zelensky," a senior US official said. —RT/Agency

Pakistan Army to Oversee By-Elections Amid CM Controversy

KP: In a major security move, the Ministry of Interior has approved the deployment of the Pakistan Army and Civil Armed Forces to assist with security duties during the upcoming by-elections, following a request from the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP). The forces will be stationed from November 22 to 24, specifically to maintain law and order during the high-stakes by-election on November 23.



The ECP's move reflects its commitment to ensuring the safety and integrity of the election amid growing concerns about the potential for unrest.

The announcement of the security deployment comes in the wake of a controversy involving Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Sohail Afridi, whose recent remarks during a public gathering in Havelian have raised serious concerns at the ECP. Afridi's comments, which the commission considers threatening and hostile, were aimed at influencing government employees involved in election duties. Sources within the ECP revealed that Afridi's

statements, made in the context of the ongoing by-election campaign, were perceived as an attempt to pressure administrative staff—a violation of the election code of conduct.

The ECP has taken these remarks seriously and convened an emergency meeting to assess the situation. The Commission is reviewing recordings of Afridi's speech to determine if any legal or disciplinary action is warranted. Authorities are particularly concerned because the comments came from a sitting chief minister, raising the stakes for potential interference with the electoral process. —RT/Agency

FO Slams Taliban Regime: Delay in Trade and Border Reopening 'Their Responsibility'

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has asserted that the Afghan Taliban regime was responsible for the delay in reopening the border and the suspension of bilateral trade, urging the group to stop "supporting terrorist outfits".



"The onus of the delay in opening the border crossing rests with the Afghan Taliban. Similarly, the projects like TAPI and CASA-1000," he said. Pakistan closed the Torkham and Chaman borders with Afghanistan on October 12 after the Taliban forces, backed by their affiliated militants, attacked multiple border posts of Pakistan's armed forces.

Since then, the crossings have remained shut, with the Torkham border briefly opened on November 1 to facilitate the repatriation of illegal Afghan refugees. In

today's briefing, the FO spokesperson urged the Afghan Taliban regime to prevent its soil from being used for terrorist attacks inside Pakistan. Andrabi noted Pakistan's repeated attempts to engage Kabul; however, he said that Islamabad "incurred loss of life" despite its sincere efforts.

He said that Pakistan had earlier segregated trade and security in the bilateral relations. "But then there is a threshold of patience. I think

that threshold of patience has been crossed." The spokesperson asserted that Islamabad would not allow any trade that "is a licence for the killing of Pakistanis from Afghan soil." Responding to a question regarding an Afghan leader's remarks about preparing 4,000 bombers for Pakistan, he said that the statement reinforced Pakistan's position that Afghanistan was being used to launch terrorist attacks inside Pakistan. —RT/Agency

White House Stuns: US Skips G20 Talks in South Africa

US: The United States is not taking part in this weekend's G20 summit in Johannesburg, the White House said Thursday, denying comments from South Africa's president who had said Washington wanted to participate.



"The United States is not participating in official talks at the G20 in South Africa," White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt told reporters.

"I saw the South African president running his mouth a little bit against the United States and the president of the United States earlier today, and that language is not appreciated by the president or his team," she said. United States has had a "change of mind" about boycotting the G20 summit in Johannesburg this weekend and wanted to take part in

some form, South African President Cyril Ramaphosa said Thursday. Washington had said it would not take part in the November 22-23 summit because it objected to the priorities for the meeting set by South Africa, which holds the G20's rotating presidency this year.
