Mirpurkhas Labor Colony Erupts in Protest Over Neglect and Missing Basic Services

MIRPURKHAS: Residents of the Labor Colony in Mirpurkhas have staged a strong protest over the lack of basic facilities and poor management in their area. A large number of residents gathered and told the media that they are forced to live under inhumane conditions, deprived of electricity, health facilities, and dedicated amenities for women laborers. The colony's water pond is completely filled with garbage, and despite being constructed 15-20 years ago, no repair work has been carried out, turning the area into a heap of filth.

The media team visited the colony's school and were shocked by its dilapidated



condition. Classrooms lack doors, washrooms are in ruins, and the boundary walls are broken on all sides. Bottles of alcohol and drug paraphernalia were scattered around. Female students are forced to attend other schools due to the unsafe environment, and despite a large number of teachers assigned, only two local teachers are

present, with the rest sent from outside Mirpurkhas. Rahu Panhwar, President of the People's Labor Bureau Mirpurkhas Division, said that over 200 families live in the colony without any basic facilities, and the contractor responsible for construction has escaped the country after committing massive corruption.

Allama Sajid Ali Naqvi Warns That Science Must Lift Humanity, Not Lead It to Ruin

TANDO ADAM: Quaid-e-Millat Jafaria Pakistan, Allama Syed Sajid Ali Naqvi, said that science is like a scalpel: if it is in the hands of a doctor, it brings goodness, but if it is in the hands of a criminal, it spreads destruction. Today, he added, the state of the world is similar. Unfortunately, the knowledge that should have been used for the welfare of humanity has instead been sacrificed to vicious acts that destroy humanity. In the present world, imperialist and Zionist forces are openly declared enemies, from whom no good can ever be expected.

These remarks were made by Allama Sajid Ali Naqvi in his message on World Day of Science for Peace and Development. He stated that there is no doubt that scientific knowledge has played a crucial role in



advancing human understanding of the universe and solving human problems, making it indispensable for progress. However, the same scientific knowledge has also been ruthlessly used by imperialist powers to destroy humanity, with Hiroshima and Nagasaki serving as the worst historical examples, and today, Gaza has become a testing ground for such destructive forces.

Massive Corruption Web Exposed in SDA Housing Scheme

JAMSHORO: A significant land scandal has come to light in the Gulshan Shahbaz area of Kotri, exposing alleged widespread corruption within the Sindh Development Authority (SDA). The controversy centers on the fraudulent allotment of single plots to multiple parties, a practice that has reportedly continued unchecked despite its illegality.

The dispute involves an 80-foot residential plot officially allotted to Yousuf Otho, a leader of the Sindh Tahera Party (STP). Otho has publicly accused a sitting political figure of orchestrating the illegal takeover of his property. According to him, the plot was allegedly seized by Chando Mewati, a local Councillor affiliated with the Pakistan People's Party (PPP), in collusion with a key SDA official, Secretary Raja Odho, who allegedly prepared a "bogus and fabricated file"



for the same land. This manipulation effectively enabled the illegal occupation of the plot. "When I arrived with my duly processed and allotted file to take possession of my plot, I found it was already occupied," Otho stated. The STP leader has issued a stern warning of legal action, highlighting the high value of the land involved. "The net will be tightened around those who are selling plots worth millions of rupees through forgery. If the occupation of my plot is not ended immediately, the administration of the SDA and Councillor Chando Mewati will be held

fully responsible for any loss or consequences," he declared. Local sources indicate that this is not an isolated incident. Double allotments and land-grabbing in Gulshan Shahbaz have become recurring issues, implicating SDA officials whose cooperation is essential for such fraudulent schemes to succeed. Critics argue that the collusion between government authorities and politically connected individuals systematically undermines the rights of legitimate allottees, eroding public trust in government housing projects.

Hingorja B.Ed Pass Candidates Protest Delays in Long-Awaited Job Orders

HINGORJA: Candidates over 40 years old who have passed the B.Ed GST and PST tests staged a protest and sit-in in front of the Press Club under the leadership of Shahbaz Malik, Rizwan Mirani, Gulzar Otho, Azhar Otho, and Qadir Sheikh Alfai Kalhoro.

The protesters stated that despite passing the test conducted by B.Ed, a highly reputable institution, the Sindh government has yet to issue their job orders. They claimed that while the Provincial Education Minister has pro-



vided jobs to candidates from certain areas scoring 33 marks, they have been ignored. The protesters staged on December 27 in front of the museum of Shaheed Mohtarma Be- nazir Bhutto.

Sindh's Hindu Community Stands Firm Against Indian Defence Minister's Provocative Remark

HYDERABAD: Following a provocative statement by Indian Defence Minister Rajnath Singh regarding the "occupation" of Sindh, the Hindu community across Sindh staged a vigorous protest outside the Hyderabad Press Club. The demonstration was led by community leaders Dr. Amarkishore Thakur, Teerth Das Lohana, Ramesh Kumar, and Bhisam Kumar Lohana, with hundreds of men and women participating. Protesters chanted slogans such as "Pakistan Zindabad" (Long Live Pakistan) and carried banners reading: "We are Pakistanis, Pakistan is ours," "Sindh will now take its (its) land from Hind (India)," and "We will com-



plete Sindh; we will take more parts of Sindh from Hind." Addressing the gathering, speakers condemned Rajnath Singh's statement as a tactic to divert attention from India's internal crises, including rising poverty and political setbacks. They emphasized that Pakistan provides better living standards, equal rights, and protection for minorities, whereas India's minorities face insecurity, and even Hin-

du demand freedom due to social and political discrimination. Women leaders strongly denounced the statement, asserting that the entire minority community in Pakistan stands united with the nation and its armed forces for the defense of the homeland. Hindu community leaders further stated that Sindh was never part of India, and no foreign power would be allowed to threaten its integrity.

SP Waseem Akhtar was previously posted as CTO Murree. After his arrival, the regional office conducted a comprehensive briefing, with



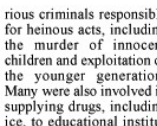
in-charges of all branches introducing their teams. He also issued instructions to all officers to perform their duties with honesty and integrity.

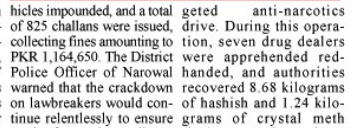

Narowal Police Roll Out Sweeping Action on Traffic Offences and Narcotics Under Safe Punjab Vision

NAROWAL: Under the directives of Punjab Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz and the vision of Safe Punjab, the Narowal Police, following instructions from IG Punjab Dr. Usman Anwar, carried out a major crackdown on traffic violations over the past 24 hours. The operation specifically targeted black-tinted vehicles, illegal rickshaws, overloaded trolleys, vehicles with "Applied For" number plates, motorcyclists without helmets, vehicles with non-standard number plates, illegal parking, one-way violations, and buses carrying passengers on rooftops.

During the operation, 24 FIRs were registered, 103 vehicles impounded, and a total of 825 challans were issued, collecting fines amounting to PKR 1,164,650. The District Police Officer of Narowal warned that the crackdown on lawbreakers would continue relentlessly to ensure road safety and compliance with traffic laws. In a separate operation under the Drug-Free Punjab mission, Narowal Police also conducted a targeted anti-narcotics drive. During this operation, seven drug dealers were apprehended red-handed, and authorities recovered 8.68 kilograms of hashish and 1.24 kilograms of crystal meth (ice). FIRs have been registered against the arrested suspects, and further legal proceedings are underway to ensure strict accountability.

During the ceremony, Irshad Ahmed Sajila acknowl-



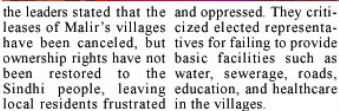

The Gravest Folly: Governor's Rule in KP Would Be a Historic Betrayal of Pakistan's Unity

Talk of imposing governor's rule in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa is not merely bad politics — it is the mother of all political blunders, a catastrophic replay of the most reckless mistakes that once cracked the very foundations of our federation. At a time when Pakistan desperately needs cohesion, wisdom, and maturity, even entertaining such a move risks reopening wounds that history has already warned us never to revisit. From the trauma of 1971 to later bouts of centre-province confrontation, Pakistan has repeatedly paid a devastating price for federal overreach. Whenever Islamabad has tried to micromanage or sideline an elected provincial government, the result has never been improved governance — only alienation, resentment, and a dangerous rise in centrifugal

forces. To forget this is to trample on the graves of les-



sions learned in blood.

Today, Minister of State for Law Barrister Aqeel Malik claims that KP's "security and governance failures" justify a constitutional intervention under Articles 232 or 234. Yet every seasoned observer knows that once the Centre crosses this line, trust collapses and political fault lines harden. The argument that governor's rule is a "constitutional measure" ignores an equally constitutional truth: Pakistan is a federation, not an em-

pire, and its stability hinges on respecting provincial autonomy — not steamrolling it.

KP may have political challenges; every province does. Governments will come and go. But Pakistan — our Pakistan — must endure, must strengthen, must heal. It cannot afford another chapter of fragmentation accelerated by hasty, heavy-handed decisions masked as administrative necessity. The state must resist the temptation of forceful centralisation and instead invest in dialogue, cooperation, and democratic mechanisms. Because if history has taught us anything, it is this: once alienation takes root, no constitutional article can undo the damage. The path of wisdom is clear — step back from the brink. Only unity will preserve Pakistan; coercion will tear it apart.

The club honoured his legendary status by naming the East Stand at the London Stadium as the Billy Bonds Stand. He was awarded an MBE in 1988 for his services to football, the same year he bid farewell to the sport as a player. —Agency

cording to fans, was so edited that it didn't look like the mom of two herself.

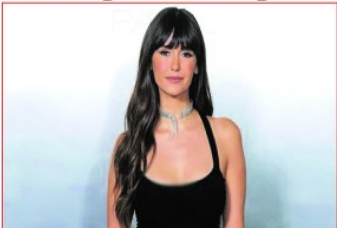
Social media users quickly began to criticise Khloe for not following what she preached, with one writing, "Thought you said you weren't Photoshopping your pics?"

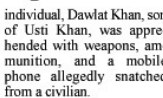


risks, failing infrastructure, and mounting climate-linked illnesses. Researchers also

Bilawal Sounds Alarm That Rolling Back 18th Amendment and NFC Award Is Playing With Fire

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) Chairman Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari has warned that those who want to undo the 18th Amendment or the National Finance Commission (NFC) Award are "playing with fire."

Addressing a public rally held in Larkana on the 58th foundation day of the PPP, Bilawal said: "If there is any power in any amendment after the 17th Amendment, it is in the 18th Amendment."

His remarks came days before the National Finance Commission (NFC) meeting scheduled for December 4.

Referring to the 27th Constitutional Amendment, he said that the PPP recently passed a constitutional tweak in collaboration with the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N).



He said the PML-N had sent a delegation proposing a constitutional amendment related to Article 243 of the Constitution and the executive magistracy system. He added that the federal government intended to remove the constitutional protections that the PPP had secured for the provinces.

He maintained that, due to the PPP, the constitutional protection was not violated. "We fulfilled the clause of the Charter of Democracy by forming a Constitutional Court and giving equal representation to the provinces," he added.

"When the PPP itself brings a constitutional amendment, it makes revolutionary legislation," Bilawal

added.

He maintained that they got an opportunity to abolish the amendment made during the "dictatorial era."

The PPP leader hoped that the Constitutional Court would look into the major issues of the country.

"The Constitutional Court will provide immediate relief to the common people," Bilawal hoped.

"Some people are trying to make the Constitutional Court controversial," Bilawal said, adding that the court would prove these people wrong through its role.

He said that legislation is the job of Parliament, adding that they would not allow any other institution to interfere in the sphere of the House.

"PPP will not support any decision that weakens the

federation," he added.

Talking about the country's overall political situation, Bilawal said: "There is a political crisis in the country at the moment, and it has to be addressed."

Speaking on the occasion, the PPP chairman lauded the armed forces for their victory during the recent war against India.

Pakistan downed seven IAF fighter jets, including three Rafale, and dozens of drones. After at least 87 hours, the war between the two nuclear-armed nations ended on May 10 with a ceasefire agreement brokered by the United States. Bilawal said: "By shooting down seven Indian aircraft, our Air Force has made Pakistan's name famous all over the world." —RT/Agency

Kundi Trumpets PPP's Job Delivery Record, Stands Firm Behind Security Forces

PESHAWAR: Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Governor Faisal Karim Kundi has said that whenever the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) came to power, it created employment opportunities for the public.

Addressing PPP's foundation day ceremony in Peshawar, Kundi said that the country nuclear technology and that the party has always played a significant role in national politics.

He praised the armed forces for giving a strong response to Indian aggression, saying Pakistan inflicted a "humiliating defeat" on India. He added that Bilawal Bhutto effectively presented Pakistan's case at the international level.

Tarar Tears Into Imran Khan's Sisters for Turning to Indian TV Platforms

ISLAMABAD: Information Minister Attaulah Tarar has slammed Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founding chairman Imran Khan's sisters for "harming" the country's reputation by appearing on Indian media platforms.

Addressing a press conference in Lahore on Sunday, the information minister alleged that these appearances were being used to spread "propaganda" against Pakistan.

"Why did they [Imran's sisters] not raise the Kashmir issue or Marka-e-Haq when speaking to Indian channels... they appeared on Indian channels to defame the country... propaganda is being spread today on Indian and Afghan media," he said.

"I wish Noreen Niazi had talked about the seven planes that were shot down. Instead, she goes there and cries for a person facing a £190 million corruption case," Tarar added.

The information minister further said that Imran's sisters "should be ashamed"



for giving interviews on Indian platforms that, according to him, work against Pakistan's interests.

He also targeted senior PTI leadership, claiming that those close family members of the party's founder had actively participated in what he described as anti-Pakistan narratives abroad.

The minister further accused the PTI of attempting to weaken national institutions through misinformation and political agitation.

Speaking about governance in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP), the information minister said the provincial government had failed to curb non-custom-paid vehicles, illegal mining and drug

trafficking. He accused the KP government of protecting "drug cartels" and claimed that billions in potential tax revenue were being lost. "The pockets of those in power in KP are being filled," he said, adding that the tobacco sector could generate significant revenue if taxed properly. Tarar also linked the issue to criminal networks and political influence. "One reason is the political-terror-crime nexus," he added. He said the security forces responded strongly to recent cross-border attacks, stating: "When there is infiltration from Afghanistan, our army gave a full response." —RT/Agency

Kim Jong Un Demands Fiercer Nuclear Air Power as North Korea Marks Air Force Milestone



SEOUL: North Korean leader Kim Jong Un highlighted the Air Force's role in exercising nuclear war deterrence as he celebrated the Air Force's 80th anniversary along with his young daughter, state media reported on Sunday. Photos released by North Korea's Rodong Simmun newspaper showed Kim observing what appeared to be unmanned aircraft and mobile missile launchers among others.

North Korea has launched mass production of small, short-range First Person View (FPV) drones, as well as larger medium-range battlefield attack drones, a Ukrainian intelligence official told Reuters earlier. Dressed in long leather

coats, Kim and his daughter watched an air show to mark the anniversary and toured a display of aircraft such as an airborne early-warning aircraft that North Korea unveiled earlier this year, state media photographs showed.

The country's expectations for the Air Force which, "will play a role in the exercise of the nuclear war deterrent" are truly "great," state media KCNA cited Kim as saying. "The Air Force should resolutely repulse and control all sorts of espionage acts and possible military provocations of the enemies," Kim said, according to KCNA. Kim added the Air Force would be given new strategic assets, without elaborating. —RT/Agency

Peshawar FC HQ Attackers Exposed as Afghan Nationals, All Three Identified

PESHAWAR: The investigation into the suicide attacks at the Peshawar Federal Constabulary (FC) Headquarters is under way, with authorities confirming that all three killed terrorists were Afghan nationals. The National Database and Registration Authority (Nadra) has verified the Afghan nationality of all three suicide attackers involved in the 24 November incident, according to the investigators. However, further personal details of the attackers have not yet been provided to investigators. Officials said that more than 100 suspects have been questioned so far as part of the inquiry. The development comes nearly a week after three FC personnel were martyred, and as many terrorists were killed when security



forces foiled an attack on the FC Headquarters in Peshawar. Meanwhile, the investigators have also obtained CCTV footage showing the attackers' movement from Rehman Baba graveyard to the FC Headquarters. They revealed that the suicide bombers did not carry any mobile phones on the day of the attack, making the investigation more challenging. According to the investigating officials, they are actively working to identify and locate any accomplices or facilitators linked to the attackers. The blasts, which targeted the Federal Constabulary Headquarters on 24 November, resulted in significant casualties and prompted a wide-scale security review in the area. —RT/Agency

Indonesia and Thailand Scramble for Survivors as Flood Disaster Toll Climbs Toward 500

INDONESIA: Indonesian and Thai authorities raced on Sunday to clear debris and find hundreds of people still missing after devastating floods and landslides that killed at least 480 people across Southeast Asia.

Heavy monsoon rain overwhelmed swaths of Indonesia, Thailand and Malaysia this week, leaving thousands of people stranded without shelter or critical supplies. At least two cities on Indonesia's worst-affected Sumatra island were still unreachable on Sunday, and authorities said they had deployed two warships from Jakarta to deliver aid. "There are two cities that require full attention due to being isolated, namely Central Tapanuli and Sibolga," National Disaster agency head Suharyanto said in a statement. The ships were expected in Sibolga on Mon-



day, he said. The death toll in Indonesia rose to 316, while 289 were still missing, according to the latest figures from the disaster authority. In Sungai Nyalo village, about 100 kilometres (62 miles) from West Sumatra's capital Padang, floodwaters had mostly receded on Sunday, leaving homes, vehicles and crops coated in thick grey mud. Authorities had not yet begun clearing roads, residents told AFP, and no outside assistance had arrived.

"Most villagers chose to stay; they didn't want to leave their houses behind," said Idris, 55, who, like many Indonesians, goes by one name. Across the island towards the north coast, an endangered Sumatran elephant lay buried in thick mud and debris near damaged buildings in Meureudu town in Thailand, where at least 162 people were killed in one of the worst floods in a decade, authorities continued to deliver aid and clear the damage. —RT/Agency

Iran Intercepts Eswatini-Flagged Ship in High-Seas Fuel Smuggling Bust



DUBAI: Iran seized on Sunday an Eswatini-flagged vessel carrying 350,000 litres of smuggled fuel, the semi-official Tasnim news agency reported.

"We seized a vessel carrying smuggled fuel in the form of gasoline and flying Swaziland's (Eswatini) flag. It was brought to Bushehr's coast following a judicial order and its content will be unloaded," a Revolutionary

Guards navy commander said, adding the vessel's 13 crew were from India and one neighbouring country.

Iran, which has some of the world's lowest fuel prices due to heavy subsidies and the plunge in the value of its national currency, has been fighting rampant fuel smuggling by land to neighbouring countries and by sea to Gulf Arab states. —RT/Agency

Family Gathering Turns Deadly as Four Killed and 14 Shot in Stockton, California

CALIFORNIA: Four people died after 14 people were shot at a family gathering in Stockton in northern California, police said. The shooting took place at a child's birthday party, Stockton's Vice Mayor Jason Lee said in a Facebook post.

"I am in contact with staff and public safety officials to understand exactly what happened, and I will be pushing for answers," he said.

Police said they received reports shortly before 6:00 pm local time (0200 GMT) of a shooting that occurred near the 1900 block of Lucile Avenue in Stockton.



"We can confirm at this time that approximately 14 individuals were struck by gunfire, and four victims have been confirmed deceased," San Joaquin County Sheriff's Office said in a post on X. —RT/Agency

Australian Pilot Dies After Suspected Mid-Air Collision Sparks Aviation Probe

AUSTRALIA: Two light planes reportedly collided mid-air during a formation flight over Sydney's outskirts on Sunday, sending one of them crashing to the ground and killing its solo pilot, authorities said. Responders found the pilot's body in bushland near the airport in Wedderburn, a southwestern suburb of Sydney, New South Wales state police said.

"Police were told two light planes had collided mid-air, before one of the planes crashed nearby in bushland," they said in a statement. "Responding emergency services located



the body of the pilot, believed to be the sole occupant of the aircraft," police added. The other plane landed safely at the airfield, and the pilot was uninjured. "The Australian Transport Safety Bureau said it was investigating a collision between two Van's RV-7 aircraft — two-seater, single-engine — homebuilt kit planes." As reported to the ATSB, the two aircraft had been involved in a formation flight of four aircraft that was returning to land at Wedderburn Airport when the collision occurred, it said in a statement. —RT/Agency
